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ZANZIBAR CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) FOR AUGUST 2021

ANNUAL HEADLINE INFLATION RATE RECORDED 2.1 PERCENT

Zanzibar Annual Headline Inflation rate for the year ending August 2021 slightly decreased to 2.1 percent compare to 2.2 percent for the year ended July 2021. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate decreased to negative 0.4 percent in August 2021 from 1.2 percent recorded in July 2021. The overall Index decreased to 116.7 in August 2021 compared to 114.3 recorded in August 2020 (**Table 1**).

ANNUAL FOOD AND NON-FOOD INFLATION RATES

Annual Inflation Rate for food decrease to negative 0.4 percent for the year ending August 2021 compared to 1.3 percent recorded for the year ended July 2021. The overall index for food decreased to 115.5 in August 2021 compared to 116.0 recorded in August 2020, while overall index for non-food increased to 117.6 in August 2021 compared to 113.0 in August 2020. Annual inflation rate for non-food increased to 4.0 percent in August 2021 compared to 2.9 percent in July 2021 (**Table 2**). Products contribute to decrease for Annual inflation rate were Basmati Rice (0.9%), Mbeya Rice (9.5%), Maize flour (1.5%), Green Cooking Bananas (1.9%), Fish items (8.7%), Cement (11.2%). MONTHLY HEADLINE INFLATION RATE DECREASE TO NEGATIVE 0.6 PERCENT IN AUGUST 2021

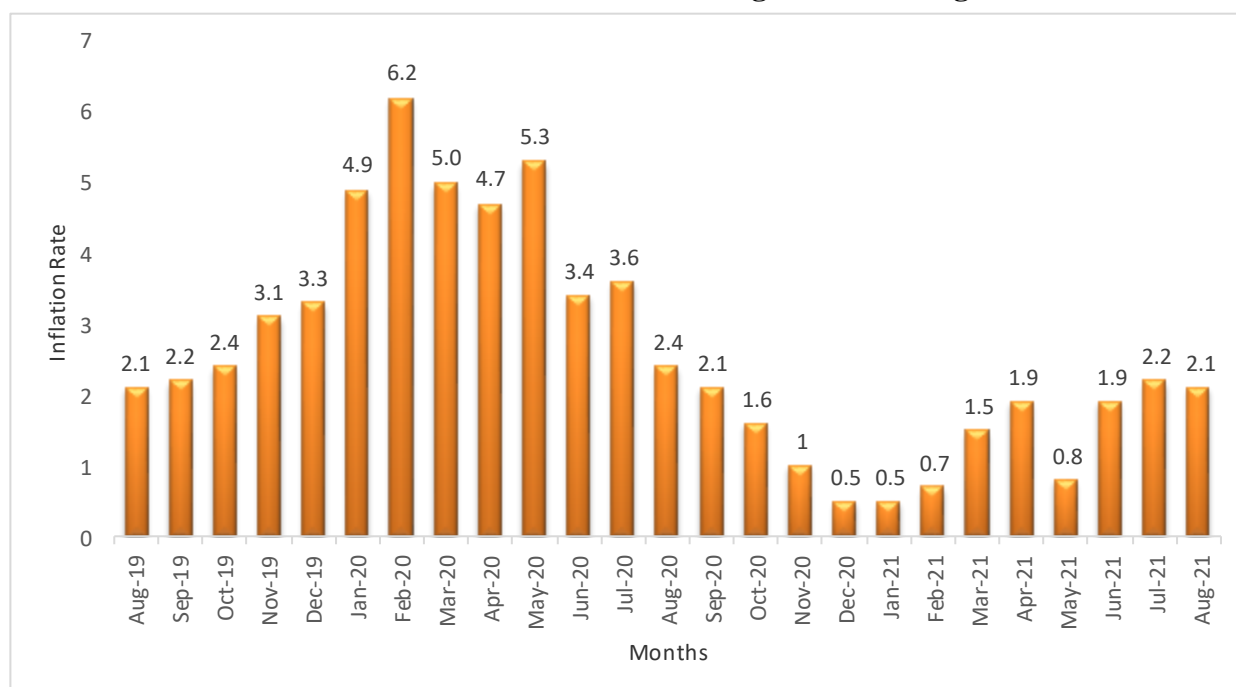
During August 2021 the monthly headline inflation rate decreased to negative 0.6 percent, compared to 0.1 percent recorded for the month ended July 2021. The monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate for the month ending August 2021 is negative 1.4 percent compared to negative 0.5 percent for the month ended July 2021 (**Table 1**). The products that contribute to decrease monthly inflation rate are Thailand Rice (0.7%), Mbeya Rice (2.3%), Jasmin Rice (0.2%), Basmati Rice (0.7%), Wheat Flour (0.8%), Fish Items (14.0%) Green Cooking Bananas (2.7%), Yellow Cooking Bananas (1.5%). Explanatory Note

The CPI measures the average percentage changes over time (between two time periods) in the prices of a “basket” of consumer goods and services acquired by households (the market basket) in Zanzibar. The Zanzibar CPI covers prices of 343 items collected in 641 outlets in Unguja and Pemba urban Centers. The goods and services included in the ZCPI basket are classified according to the UN COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According by Purpose) with 12 divisions.

The ZCPI weights are based on both monetary and non-momentary expenditures relating to consumption for households in Zanzibar for the 2014/15 Household Budget Survey (HBS). The weight is based on expenditures of both urban and rural households. Both base price and index has reference period of January 2017.

The computation of indices at elementary level based on geometric mean of the price relative while at higher level the Laspeyres formula was to compute the aggregate indices.
