ZANZIBAR CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) FOR JUNE 2022

ANNUAL HEADLINE INFLATION RATE RECORDED 4.18 PERCENT

Zanzibar Annual Headline Inflation rate for the year ended June 2022 increased to 4.18 percent compare to 3.68 percent for the year ended May 2022. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate slightly decreased to 3.07 percent in June 2022 from 3.16 percent recorded in May 2022. The overall Index increased to 122.15 in June 2022 compared to 117.25 recorded in June 2021 (**Table 1**).

ANNUAL FOOD AND NON-FOOD INFLATION RATES

Annual Inflation Rate for food is 3.05 percent for the year ended June 2022 compared to 3.20 percent recorded for the year ended May 2022. The overall index for food is increased to 121.28 in June 2022 from 117.69 recorded in June 2021, while overall index for non-food increased to 122.79 in June 2022 compared to 116.92 in June 2021. Annual inflation rate for non-food increased to 5.03 percent in May 2022 compared to 4.05 percent in May 2022 (**Table 2**). Goods and services that are contribute to increase for Annual inflation rate were Thailand rice (3.1%), Mbeya rice (16.1%), Basmati rice (10.4%), Maize Flour (17.9%), Wheat Flour (19.7%), Green Cooking Bananas (19.0%), Yellow Cooking Bananas (18.3%), White Sugar (4.0%), Fish item (1.9%), Kerosene (79.9%), Petrol (23.2%), and Diesel (29.2%) (**Table 3**).

MONTHLY HEADLINE INFLATION IN JUNE 2022

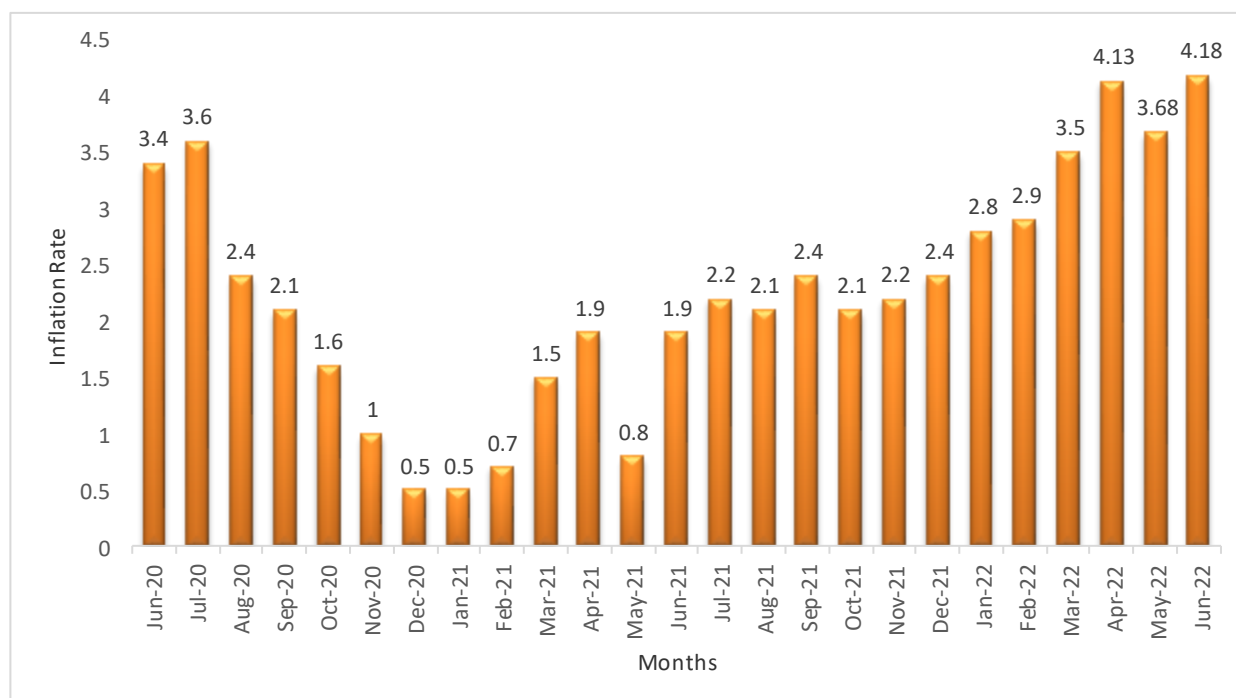
During June 2022 the monthly headline inflation rate decrease to 0.13 percent compared to 0.69 percent recorded for the month ended May 2022. The monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate for the month ended June 2022 is decreased to negative 1.80 percent compared to 1.18 percent for the month ended May 2022 (**Table 1**). Goods and services that are contribute monthly inflation rate to decrease are Green Cooking Bananas (38.9%), Yellow Cooking Banana (19.9%), White Sugar (1.6%) (**Table 3**).

Explanatory Note

The CPI measures the average percentage changes over time (between two time periods) in the prices of a “basket” of consumer goods and services acquired by households (the market basket) in Zanzibar. The Zanzibar CPI covers prices of 343 goods and services collected in 641 outlets in Unguja and Pemba urban Centers. The goods and services included in the ZCPI basket are classified according to the UN COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According by Purpose) with 12 divisions.

The ZCPI weights are based on both monetary and non-momentary expenditures relating to consumption for households in Zanzibar for the 2014/15 Household Budget Survey (HBS). The weight is based on expenditures of both urban and rural households. Both base price and index has reference period of January 2017.

The computation of indices at elementary level based on geometric mean of the price relative while at higher level the Laspeyres formula was to compute the aggregate indices.
