ZANZIBAR CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI) FOR APRIL, 2020

ANNUAL HEADLINE INFLATION RATE DECREASED TO 4.7 PERCENT

Zanzibar Annual Headline Inflation rate for the year ended April 2020 decreased to 4.7 percent compared to 5.0 percent recorded during the year ended March 2020. Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate slightly increased to 8.1 percent in April 2020 from 8.0 percent recorded in March 2020. The overall Index increased to 114.2 in April 2020 compared to 109.1 recorded in April 2019 (**Table 1**).

ANNUAL FOOD AND NON-FOOD INFLATION RATES

Annual Inflation Rate for food remain 8.1 percent for the year ended April 2020. The overall index for food increased to 114.9 in April 2020 compared to 106.3 recorded in April 2019, while overall index for non-food increased to 113.6 in April 2020 compared to 111.2 in April 2019. Annual inflation rate for non-food decrease to 2.2 percent in April 2020 compared to 2.8 percent in March 2020 (**Table 2**). Products contribute to decrease for Annual inflation rate were Thailand Rice (4.3%), Green cooking Banana (11.0%), Cement (3.1%), Kerosene (10.3%), Petrol (3.0%) and Diesel (8.8%) (**Table 3**).

MONTHLY HEADLINE INFLATION RATE IS 0.5 PERCENT IN APRIL, 2020

During April 2020 the monthly headline inflation rate increased to 0.5 percent compared with negative 0.7 percent as recorded in March 2020. The monthly Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages inflation rate for the month ended April, 2020 increased to 1.7 percent compared to negative 2.1 percent for the month ended March 2020 (Table 1). The increased of monthly inflation rate was due to increase of prices of items such as Maize Flour (1.8%), Wheat Flour (0.4%), Fish (0.3%), Green Cooking Banana (2.2%), Yellow Cooking Bananas (7.1%) (**Table 3**).

Explanatory Note

The CPI measures the average percentage changes over time (between two time periods) in the prices of a "basket" of consumer goods and services acquired by households (the market basket) in Zanzibar. The Zanzibar CPI covers prices of 343 items collected in 641 outlets in Unguja and Pemba urban Centers. The goods and services included in the ZCPI basket are classified according to the UN COICOP (Classification of Individual Consumption According by Purpose) with 12 divisions.

The ZCPI weights are based on both monetary and non-momentary expenditures relating to consumption for households in Zanzibar for the 2014/15 Household Budget Survey (HBS). The weight is based on expenditures of both urban and rural households. Both base price and index has reference period of January 2017.

The computation of indices at elementary level based on geometric mean of the price relative while at higher level the Laspeyres formula was to compute the aggregate indices.
