Fundamental Principle

Principle 1: Relevance, Impartiality, and Equal Access

Official statistics provide an indispensable element in the infor- mation system of a democratic society, serving the Government, the economy and the public with data about the economic, demo- graphic, social and environmental situation. To this end, official sta- tistics that meet the test of practical utility are to be compiled and made available on an impartial basis by official statistical agencies to honour citizens' entitlement to public information.

Principle 2: Professional Standards, Scientific Principles, and Professional Ethics

To retain trust in official statistics, the statistical agencies need to decide according to strictly professional considerations, including scientific principles and professional ethics, on the methods and procedures for the collection, processing, storage and presenta- tion of statistical data.

Principle 3: Accountability and Transparency

To facilitate a correct interpretation of the data, the statistical agencies are to present information according to scientific stand- ards on the sources, methods and procedures of the statistics.

Principle 4: Prevention of Misuse

The statistical agencies are entitled to comment on erroneous interpretation and misuse of statistics.

Principle 5: Sources of Official Statistics

Data for statistical purposes may be drawn from all types of sources, be they statistical surveys or administrative records. Statistical agencies are to choose the source with regard to quality, timeliness, costs and the burden on respondents.

Principle 6: Confidentiality

Individual data collected by statistical agencies for statistical com- pilation, whether they refer to natural or legal persons, are to be strictly confidential and used exclusively for statistical purposes.

Principle 7: Legislation

The laws, regulations and measures under which the statistical systems operate are to be made public.

Principle 8: National Coordination

Coordination among statistical agencies within countries is essen-tial to achieve consistency and efficiency in the statistical system.

Principle 9: Use of International Standards

The use by statistical agencies in each country of international concepts, classifications and methods promotes the consistency and efficiency of statistical systems at all official levels.

Principle 10: International Cooperation

Bilateral and multilateral cooperation in statistics contributes to the improvement of systems of official statistics in all countries.

Guiding Principles

The Office is committed to upholding values of Professionalism, Integrity, Confidentiality, Customer focus, Innovation and Team work (PICCIT) as the guiding principles in production of statistics.

Organization of OCGS

The management of the is vested to Zanzibar Statistical Board, Chief Government Statistician is the Chief Executive Officer of OCGS and Member of Zanzibar Statistical Board.

Office of the Chief Government Statistician further comprises of five Directorates namely;

- a. Economic Statistics
- b. Population and Social Statistics
- c. Statistical Standard Coordination and Research
- d. Administration and Planning
- e. Pemba Sub Office

To collect, analyze and disseminate statistical information. The Bureau is also the custodian of official statistical information, and coordinator of the National Statistical System.

The information is critical in tracking progress, implementation, decision-making as well as service delivery.

The information presented in the Statistical Abstract 2023 covers statistics on the Environmental, Demographic, Socio-economic, Production and Macroeconomic sectors. Information on these sectors is structured based on either a Calendar Year (CY) starting from January to December 2023 or Financial Year (FY) starting from July to June 2022/23.

In a special way, I wish to thank the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar for continued support to statistical production. 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

A. ADMINISTRATION AND GOVERNANCE

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar (RGoZ) was formed on 12th January, 1964 under the first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, Zanzibar and Tanganyika united on 26th April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then, Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System (except for the Court of Appeal).

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its Eighth Phase under His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi since November 2020. Previous phases' Presidents were; Hon. Dr. Ali Mohamed Shein (2010 - 2020); Hon. Dr. Amani Abeid Amani Karume (2000 - 2010); Hon. Dr. Salmin Amour Juma (1990 - 2000); The Late, Hon. Idrisa Abdulwakil (1985 – 1990); The Late, Hon. Ali Hassan Mwinyi (1984 – 1985); The Late, Hon. Aboud Jumbe Mwinyi (1972 – 1984); and The Late, Hon. Abeid Amani Karume (1964 – 1972).

RGoZ has been operated through the single party system from 1964 to 1995 and multi-party system from 1995 to date. Zanzibar Constitution has been emended in 2010 to allow the National Government Unity where seventh and current phases have been practising.

A.1 Administration

As of December 2023, Zanzibar had 21 Members in the Revolutionary Council (which is also the Council of Ministers—A Cabinet), among them 18 are ministers. The House of Representatives had 79 members of whom 50 were elected from Constituencies, seven (7) are nominated by the President, and 18 are special seats for women, one Attorney General, Speaker and One Secretary.

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B.1 Land

Zanzibar is one of the Indian Ocean Island. It is situated on the Eastern Africa coast about 36.5 kilometers adjacent to Tanzania Mainland. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometers; of which 1,664 square kilometers are for Unguja Island and 988 square kilometers are for Pemba. There are also a habitat and un-habitat islets.

The northern tip of Unguja island is located at 5.72 degrees South, 39.30 degrees East, with the southernmost point at 6.48 degrees South, 39.51 Degrees East. It is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel, which at its narrowest point is 36.5 km (22.7 mile) across. The island is about 85 km (53 mile) long and 39 km (24 mile) wide, with an area of 1,666 km² (643 sq mile) which is mainly low lying, with its highest point being 120 m (394 ft). It is also characterised by beautiful sandy beaches with fringing coral reefs with enrich in marine biodiversity.

The northern tip of Pemba island is located at 4.87 degrees south, 39.68 degrees east, and the southernmost point is located at 5.47 degrees south, 39.72 degrees east. The island is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel some 56 km (35 mile) wide. The island is about 67 km (42 mile) long and 23 km (14 mile) wide, with an area of 988 km² (381 sq mile). Pemba is also mainly low lying, with its highest point being 95 m (312 ft).

B.2 Climate

Zanzibar experience warm and humid climatic condition (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely Masika, the main rainy season, March to May; Kipupwe, the cold season, June to August; Vuli, short rainy season September to November; and Kaskazi, the hot season December to March. The average highest rain in 2023 was recorded in November (775.9 mm for 24 days) Unguja and (742.7 mm for 23 Days) as shown in table B.2.1 below.

Zanzibar has a tropical monsoon climate (Am). The heat of summer (corresponding to the Northern Hemisphere winter) is often cooled by strong sea breezes associated with the northeast monsoon (known as Kaskazi in Kiswahili), particularly on the north and east coasts. Being near to the equator, the islands are warm year round. The rainfall regime is split into two main seasons, a primary maximum in March, April, and May in association with the southwest monsoon (known locally as Kusi in Kiswahili), and a secondary maximum in November and December. The months in between receive less rain, with a minimum in July.

C. POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS

C POPULATION STATISTICS

Population is the totality of all units of interest in a study or investigation at a given time and a given area. Population studies analyze the relationships between economic, social, cultural and biological processes influencing populations.

C.1 Population Characteristics

Zanzibar had a total population of 1,889,773 with an average growth rate of 3.7 percent per annum from 2012 to 2022; urban and rural average growth rates are 4.3 and 3.2 percents respectively. The trend shows that the average annual intercensal population growth rate increased for two consecutive censuses from 1967-1978 to 1988-2002, then declined in 2002-2012 TPHC and bounced back in 2012-2022 TPHC (Table C.1.1 & Table C.2.1)

The spatial composition shows that almost three quarter (71.2 percent) of the population lives in Unguja Island whereby majority of them live in Mjini Magharibi Region. The 2022 PHC revealed that the population of Tanzania Zanzibar has increased five times from 354,815 persons in the 1967 Census to 1,889,773 persons in the 2022 Census (Figure 1).

The sex ratio of the population was 94, meaning that for every 100 females there are only 94 males. The sex ratio remained unchanged between 2012 TPHC and 2022 TPHC. Figure C.4.1; Population pyramid provides a snapshot of the population age and sex structure. The Zanzibar population pyramid is characterized by a young age structure, with a large proportion of the total population found in the young and/or youthful ages (Table C.2.1).

Zanzibar population density is 768 people per square kilometer in 2022 TPHC. Mjini Magharibi Region has the highest population density (3,902.9 people per square kilometer) compared with other regions while Kusini Region recorded the least (229.1 people per square kilometer). Population density has been increasing since 1967 TPHC.

Zanzibar has an average household size of 5 persons in 2022. Kusini Pemba has the highest average household size (5.7 persons) compared with other regions while Kusini Unguja Region has the lowest (4.2 persons). The trend shows that the average household's size has been decreasing from 2002 TPHC to 2022TPHC.





D. SOCIAL STATISTICS

Social statistics comprise data from various social sectors including education, health, crime, and social welfare (people with disability, orphans' care, and old people care).

D.1 Education

The education section provides data on education facility, teacher's pupils ratio, students enrolment,

examination results, and university applications and loans. Some data are distributed by sex, level of education and districts

In 2023, total number of pre-primary schools was 599 (56 public and private 543 schools), Primary schools was 576 (326 public and 250 private schools) and Secondary school was 245 (216 public and 29 private schools). The number of public pre primary increased by 33.3 percent from 42 schools in 2022 to 56 schools in 2023. The number of public primary schools increased by 5.2 percent from 310 schools in 2022 to 326 schools in 2023 (Table D.1.1).

A total of 102,908 pupils were enrolled in pre-primary schools in 2023; of whom 63,732 pupils (61.9 percent) were in public schools and 39,176 pupils (38.1 percent) were in private schools (Table D.1.5). The number of pupils enrolled in primary schools increased by 6.6 percent from 357,069 pupils in 2022 to 380,638 pupils in 2023. The number of students enrolled in Secondary schools decreased by 5.8 percent from 98,231 pupils in 2022 to 92,510 students in 2023 (Table D.1.11).

The total of 8,161 students applied for loans from the Zanzibar Higher Education Loan Board (ZHELB in the academic year 2023/2024), whereby 5,900 students received loans (72.3 percent). Among the students who received loans, a total of 2,265 students were new applicants (1,114 males and 1,151 female). The number of new applicants who received loans from ZHELB in this academic year increased by 24.8 percent from 1,815 applicants in 2022/2023 to 2,265 applicants in 2023/2024, Table D.1.22.

D.2 Health

The Ministry of Health provides health service through primary, secondary and tertiary level of health facilities. In terms of primary level health service provided through (PHCUs and PHCU+) with primary health care centers. Regarding the secondary levels this include District and Regional hospital and at Tertiary level the health service is available at referral and special hospital.

Zanzibar has a total of 339 health facilities in 2023. This shows an increase of 9.0 percent compared with preceding year. The five- year trend show that the number of health facilities fluctuated for two years (2020 and 2021), then have been increasing for another consecutive two years. Primary Health Care Units (PHCUs) has the highest proportion (73.2 percent) among the public health facilities. The number of PHCUs increased by 3.9 percent from 129 facilities in 2022 to 134 facilities in 2023. The number of private dispensaries increased by 10.2 percent from 137 in 2022 to 151 dispensaries in 2023 (Table D.2.1).

A total of 57,162 live births were recorded in all health facilities in 2023 whereby Mjini District has the highest proportion (40.0 percent) of live births compared with other districts while Kaskazini B district has the lowest (1.1 percent). The five-years trend show that the number of live births recorded at health facilities has been fluctuating from 2019 to 2023.

The number of out-patient visits were 1,941,919 in 2023. The proportion of out-patient visits has slightly decreased by less than one percent compared with previous year. The number of visiting out-patients reported by the government health facility was 1,356,938 and 404,584 visiting reported in a private health facility. In addition, parastatal and faith-based facilities reported to have 156,232 and 24,165 visiting outpatients respectively. The five-years trend shows that out-patient visits have been fluctuating for three years from 2019 to 2022 (Table D.2.6).

D.3 Gender

Violence against women, men and children is a grave violation of human rights. Its impact ranges from immediate to long-term multiple physical, sexual and mental consequences for women, men and children, including death.

A total of 1,954 gender based violence incidences were reported in 2023. The total number of gender violence victims reported were 1,959 of whom 236 were women (12.0 percent), 84 men (4.3 percent) and 1,639 children (83.7 percent). Among the children victims, 1,163 (77.1 percent) were girls and 376 (22.9 percent) were boys. The total number of gender-based violence incidences increased from 1,360 reported in 2022 to 1,954 in 2023 which indicates increased by 43.7 percent (Table D.3.1, D3.2 and Table D3.3).

The highest number of gender-based violence incidences reported in 2023 was in Mjini district with 457 (23.4 percent) and the lowest recorded in Micheweni district with 42 incidences (2.1 percent). Rape incidences is highest incidences reported with 923 (47.2 percent) compared to other incidences. Magharibi "A" district has a large number of rape incidences counted for 190 (20.6 percent) followed by Magharibi "B" district was 188 (20.4 percent) and the least number of rape incidence was found in Kusini district with 25 incidences (2.7 percent) (Table D.3.4).

Children aged 15-17 have the highest number of incidences with 822 victims (50.2 percent) followed by aged 11-14 with 433 equivalents to 26.4 percent compared with other age groups while age group 0-5 recorded to lowest with 104 incidences (6.3 percent) (Table D.3.7).

Majority of incidences of gender-based violence, 660 (33.7 percent) occurred at perpetrator house, followed by victim houses, 266 incidences (13.6 percent) while very few incidences have occurred at school or Madrasa (0.2 percent). More than one third (35.7 percent) of the raping incidences occurred at Perpetrators Houses while majority of the Assault incidences occurred at victim houses (31.4 percent) (Table D.3.9).

However, 374 out of 1,954 incidences (19.1 percent) are Convicted, 629 incidences (32.2 percent) are under investigation, 81 incidences (4.1 percent) are sent to DPP for prosecution, 838 incidences (42.9 percent) sent to the Court, 29 incidences (1.5 percent) are removed to the Court and three incidences (0.2 percent) are closed to the Police (Table D.3.10).

Adult aged 18-29 reported to have the highest number of incidences with 282 victims (88.1 percent) followed by aged 30-39 (8.8 percent) compared with other age groups (Table D.3.11).

D.4 Social Welfare

This section presents the information about registered Disability and Social Welfare. The data revealed that there are 8,100 persons with disabilities in 2023 of whom 4,262 are male and 3,838 female. The age group 15-34 has the highest number of persons with disability (3,007 persons). Kaskazini A District have the highest number of persons with disability (20.4 percent) compared with other districts, while Wete District registered the lowest with 2.8 percent. More than one third (37.0 percent) of person with disability are in physical disability, while 1,490 (18.4 percent) have multiple disabilities. Person with skin disabilities recorded the least with 1.3 percent. (Table D.4.1 and Table D.4.2).

The number of Orphans in orphanage centre recorded in 2023 is 384 which a decrease of 12.1 percent from 437 in 2022 to 384 recorded in 2023. The number of Elders in Elderly care Centre increased by 13.6 percent from 59 in 2022 to 67 in 2023 (Table D.4.3).

D.5 Crime

Crime statistics attempt to provide statistical measures criminal and traffic incidents in society. Moreover, data are divided into serious and minor cases. Several approaches are used to capture crime statistics, including household, hospital and insurance records. Data are compiled from the Police, Zanzibar Educational for Offenders and Judiciary.

D.5.1 Road Accidents

The total number of road accidents recorded in 2023 were 193 which shows an increase of 12.2 percent compared with preceding year. The five-years trend show that the number of accidents slightly increased in 2020, it has been decreasing for two consecutive years from 2021 to 2022 which then increased in 2023. Magharibi A District has the highest proportion (16.6 percent) of road accidents compared with other districts while Mjini District has the lowest (3.6 percent). Majority of the road accidents occurred on July (Table D.5.1 and D.5.2).

The number of victims reported from road accidents were 385 which shows an increase of 19.2 percent compared with 323 victims reported in 2022. Out of the reported total victims,153 victims were dead and 232 victims were injured. Among of dead victims of road accidents, majority were Cyclists (76 persons) followed by Pedestrians (50 persons) which constituted 82.4 percent of all persons who died in the accidents (Table D.5.3).

The road traffic offences reported in 2023 were 38,598 which show an increase of 72.5 percent compared with 22,375 offences reported in 2022. Males reported to commit more offences (38,518 offences) than 80 offences reported by females. Non-Compliance with guidelines and traffic regulations (12,419 Offences) was reported as the main offensive committed driver (Table D.5.4).

D.5.2 Crime Cases

The total number of crime cases reported in 2023 were 38,791 which shows an increase of 72.0 percent compared with 22,547 reported in 2022 of which the minor cases were 38,598 (99.5 percent) and serious cases were 193 (0.5 percent). The five-year trend show that the number of crime cases has been increasing with the exception of the year 2021 which show a decrease. Kati District has the highest proportion (20.1 percent) of the total crime cases compared with other districts (Table D.5.5)

D.5.3 Prison Statistics

The total number of reported remands in 2023 were 1,264, of which male have higher number 1,241 (98.2 percent) than 23 of female (1.8 percent). Almost

half of the reported remands are in age group 18-30 years. The number of remands decreased in 2020, then increased for two consecutive years which finally decreased in 2023 (Table D.5.7).

The total number of inmates in 2023 were 520 of which majority are male 510 and 10 are female. Most of the inmates (197) served short sentence 3 months and below, followed by 4 to 11 months (148) and the least inmates served 11 years and above.

Majority of inmates completed their legal bonds in 2023 observed in age group 26-35 (159 persons). The number of Inmates Completed their Legal Bonds by Age Groups and Sex from 2019 to 2023 indicates that there is an increased number of male inmates compare with women in five-years trend. Table D.5.9

D.5.4 Offences against Person

The total number of offences against persons were 2,049 in 2023 which increased by 44.2 percent compared with 1,421 offences recorded in 2022. This was highly attributed to 824 rape cases (40.2 percent) followed by Assault and Sodomize (18.4 and 12.0 percents respectively). The five-year trend shows that number of offences has been fluctuating (Table D.5.12).

D.5.5 Juvenile Court Cases

The total number of Criminal Cases filled at the Juvenile court were 121, of which 80 (66.1 percent) had been decided and 41 Cases were pending before the Court. The number of filed cases increased by 14.2 percent from 106 in 2022 to 121 in 2023. The number of decided cases increased by 66.1 percent in 2023 compared with 46.2 percent in previous year. (Table D.5.13.)

D.6 Sober Houses and Drugs Addicts

A total number of four sober houses is reported in 2023 whereby all of them are for males. The number of sober houses decreased by 20.0 percent compared with 2022. The five-year trend shows that the number of sober houses has been decreasing from 2019 to 2023. A total of 275 drug addicts recorded in 2023 which shows an increase of 65.7 percent compared with 66 recorded in 2022. Majority of drug addict (99 addicts) are at the age group 26-35 (36.0 percent) while the lowest proportion of drug addicts reported at age group 46 and above years which is accounted for 15.6 percent. The five-years trend shows that the number of drug addicts has been decreasing for three consecutive years and then increased in 2023 (Table D.6.1 and Table D.6.2).

D.7 Sports and Recreations

The section covers the number of sports clubs registered, number of footballs players outside Zanzibar, number of referees and number of medals and belts.

The total number of sports clubs registered in 2023 is 1,808 which shows a decrease of 17.16 compared with 2,194 registered in 2022. The trend show that the number of registered sports clubs has been increasing for two consecutive years and then decreasing for the last two years. About two thirds (76.5 percent) of the registered sports clubs are football clubs (Table D.7.1).

The total number of football teams in premier league in 2023 is 16 of which most of them (62.5 percent) are from Mjini District. Juvenile Division has a total of 54

teams whereby majority of them (37.0 percent) are in Mjini District. Moreover, Mjini District has the highest number of football teams in all divisions (Table D.7.2)

The total of football referees in 2023 is 68 of which 7 have FIFA badges (10.3 percent) and 61 are without FIFA badges (89.7 percent). The proportion of referees in 2023 increased by more than one hundred percent compared with preceding year. The proportion of referees with FIFA badges is higher for female (71.4 percent) than males (28.6 percent). The trend shows that the number of referees increased in 2020, then decreased for two consecutive years and increased in 2023 (Table D.7.4).

E. MACROECONOMIC STATISTICS

E.1 National Accounts

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is defined as the monetary value of all finished goods and services produced within an economic territory in a specific period of time (usually one year). It is the most important indicator in the System of National Accounts (SNA) used to gauge the health of a country's economy. The Production, Expenditure and Income methods are the approaches to its measurements; results of which are presented in current (years) or constant (base year or real) prices. The Office of the Chief Government Statistician has adopted the Production approach to the compilation of Zanzibar's GDP estimates.

For the year 2023, GDP at current prices stood at TZS 6,041.3 billion, interpreting the per capita income of TZS 3,111,000. At constant 2015 prices, the GDP increased to TZS 3,758.6 billion compared with TZS 3,528.1 billion observed in the previous year. This indicates that Zanzibar's economy for the year 2023 grew by 7.4 percent (Table F.1.1).

The observed growth in the economy was a result of recovering of the economy caused by increased of Financial and insurance activities (54.6 percent) and increased number of tourists from 548,503 in 2022 to 638,498 in 2023 which resulted to increase Accommodation and Food Services (from 11.7 percent in 2022 to 8.2 percent in 2023); and the Service sector also showed a significant growth of 9.9 percent (Table F.1.5).

Figure E.1. 1: GDP at Constant Price Growth Rates, 2014-2023





E.2 Government Finance Statistics

Introduction

The section shows the summary data on revenue and expenses as well as aggregate data on transactions in assets and liabilities of the Budgetary Central Government. Government Finance Statistics (GFS) are compiled in accordance with the framework of 2014 GFS Manual using modified cash basis of recording. GFS are the part of National Accounts which cover a wide range of fiscal statistics describing an economy in various ways, therefore, it emphasis the uniformity and consistence with the System of National Accounts, 2008. GFS data are the basis for fiscal monitoring, hence the presentation of this data is evidencing a significant step forward in government's effort to improve the comprehensiveness and transparency of the government fiscal data.

Revenue

Government revenue amounted to TZS 1,300.1 billion at the end of 2022/23, of which TZS 1,003.8 billion was tax collections and the balance was non-tax revenue. During the year 2022/23, government revenue showing an increase of 45.9 percent from TZS 891.2 billion collected in 2021/22 whereby the main contributors were taxes on goods and services, customs and other import duties and administrative fees (Table E.2.1) in total they contribute about 70.2 percent of the total revenue collection.

Expenditures

Total government expenditure during the year 2022/23 was TZS 1,398.4 billion, of which TZS 1,037.2 billion was for expenses and TZS 361.3 billion for acquisitions of new non-financial assets (Table E.2.2 & Table E.2.3). Of the total expenditure, about TZS 602.8 billion (43.1%) spent for general public services followed by economic affairs TZS 276.5 billion (19.8%) as shown in Table E.2.5. Moreover, Table E.2.6 shows compensation of employee spent about 40.9 percent of the total expenditure at the end of 2022/23.

Financing

During the period ending June, 2023, the net incurrence of liabilities is high compared to net acquisition financial assets that related to widening deficits, acquisition of assets and hence financing needs (Table E.2.3). The net incurrence of liabilities dominate by high amount of loans whereby about 91.8 percent (TZS 141.7 billion) of external loan and 7.8 percent of domestic loan.

E.3 Trade

Trade statistics provide a brief explanation of flows/directions of trade, balances and volumes, specializations (comparative advantage) and their economic influence. External trade statistics are compiled from documents provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority. It should also be noted that goods crossing international borders without appropriate Customs documentation are not included in external trade.

Exports statistics include domestic export and re-export. Domestic export refers to export of goods of national origin while re-export refers to goods exported either in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

Trade balance is the difference in the value of exports and imports. Zanzibar has never experienced a positive balance of trade; this means that Zanzibar usually imports more goods than it exports which result higher imported value than export.

Inter-State trade statistics provides an idea about the demand of commodities produced or consumed in Zanzibar along with the flows thereof to the other side of the country that is Tanzania Mainland.

In 2022, Zanzibar recorded a total volume of trade worth TZS 1,439,364.7 million that marks an increase of 28.0 percent compared with TZS 1,124,317.1 million recorded in 2021. The trade balance in 2022 has shown a deficit of TZS 1,078,612.8 million compared with the deficit of TZS 812,973.1 million recorded in 2021. The export-import ratio decreased from 16.1 percent in 2021 to 14.3 per cent in 2022. The recorded export value in 2022 was TZS 180,375.9 million which increased by 2.2 percent compared with TZS 155,672.0 million recorded in 2021. The value of the imports in 2022 was TZS 1,258,988.7 million that indicates an increase of 25.5 percent compared with 968,645.1 recorded in 2021 (Table H.1.1).

Food and live animals contributed to TZS 146,759.3 million equivalent to 81.4 percent of the total export value in 2022 (Table H.1.4). The exported value of Cloves recorded in 2022 was TZS 118,287.3 million which is equivalent to 65.6 percent of the total export. For the year 2022, Singapore appeared to be the major buyer of the exported goods from Zanzibar (TZS 56,520.9 million, 31.3 percent of total export) as shown is Table H.1.6.

U.A.E recorded the highest value of import in 2022 worth TZS 584,399.6 million (46.4 percent of total import), followed by China which recorded TZS 134,284.8 million (Table H.1.10). Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials recorded

the highest value for imports (TZS 521,929.9 million, 41.5 percent of total import) in 2022 (Table H.1.7). The import of fuel products has contributed TZS 510,515.5 million equivalent to 40.5 percent of the total import. In 2022 import value of petrol was TZS 263,391.5 million increased by 26.6 percent compared with TZS 193,438.7 million in 2021 (Table H.1.9).



E.4 Price

Zanzibar Consumer Price Index ZCPI is a measure of the average change in prices paid by consumers for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is not a cost-of-living index but a proxy indicator to it. Information on retail prices is collected monthly on all items in the market basket. The basket has been obtained from the 2019/20 Zanzibar Household Budget Survey (ZHBS) and it uses the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) group specification.

The change in price levels paid by consumers for the year 2023 stands at 6.9 percent, then referred to as inflation. Similar indices for food and non-food are 11.1 and 4.0 percent respectively. In 2022 the average inflation rate was 5.1, with food inflation rate of 6.0 and non-food inflation of 4.5 percent. The trend of the overall inflation rate in Zanzibar has been increasing for three consecutive years from 2014 to 2016 and then decreasing for the next consecutive three years from 2017 to 2019. It also fluctuated for two years between 2019 and 2021 which then increasing again from 2021 to maintain the maximum annual inflation of 6.9 percent in 2023 for a decade. The overall inflation rate remained to the single digit for the last decade (from 2013 – 2023) (Table E.4.5 & Figure 4.1).

The ZCPI (an all-items index) for the year 2023 was recorded as 106.22 compared to the average of 99.38 for the year 2022. The index for food for the year 2023 stood at 111.23 showing relatively rapid price increase from 100.09 in 2022 while non-food index from 98.87 in 2022 to 102.81 in 2023. Hence, the increase of food index is higher than non-food index. (Table E.4.1).

The annual average price for Thailand Rice per kilogram for the year 2023 stands to 2,134 TZS compared to 1,725 TZS for the year 2022 which shows an increase of 23.7 percent, while the average price of Wheat Flour per kilogram for the year 2023 and 2022 was 2,057 TZS and 1,817 TZS respectively. The average price per kilogram for White sugar for the year 2023 increased to 2,698 TZS compared to 2,150 TZS for the year 2022 which shows an increase of 25.5 percent. Moreover the average prices for fuels (Kerosene, Petrol and Diesel) for the year 2023 were 2,984 TZS, 2,995 TZS and 2,896 TZS respectively compared to the average for the year 2022 which were 2,480 TZS; 2,750 TZS and 2,765 TZS respectively. The average prices of Kerosene, petrol and diesel increased by 20.3 percent, 8.9 percent and 4.7 percent respectively (Table E.4.4).

Figure.4.1: Annually Inflation Rate, 2013–2023



E.5 Employment and Earnings

Total employment for all sectors in 2022/23 is 82,225 employees (i.e. Government, Government Parastatals and Private sectors) which shows an increase of 19.8 percent from 68,632 employees in 2021/22. The number of male employees is higher (53.1 percent) than female employees (46.9 percent). Majority of employees are in Parastatal or Government sector (54.4 percent) compared with private sector (45.6 percent). Although, the proportion of employees in Parastatal or Government sector is higher, the growth rate in Private sector is extremely higher (52.7 percent) than in Parastatal or Government sector (1.5 percent) (Table E.5.1).

Education industry has the highest percentage (26.8 percent) of total employees compared with other industries, followed by Accommodation and food service activities (19.2 percent). Among sectors, Public administration and defence; compulsory social security industry has the highest proportion (34.7 percent) of employees in Parastatal or Government sector. On the other hand,

Accommodation and food service activities has the highest proportion (42.1 percent) of employees in Private sector.

The total wage bill in 2022/23 was 788,995 million TZS, of which 704,545 millions TZS of total wage bill was used for payment of salaries and TZS 4,451 million for free ration. The industry with the highest wage bill in 2022/23 was Public administration and defence; compulsory social security (198,577 millions TZS). The wage bill for the Government sector in 2022/23 used for salary payments was 364,972 million TZS while 851 million TZS were payments for free ration. Public administration and defence; compulsory social security spent 143,049 million TZS as wage bill for salary (Table E.5.1 and Table E.5.3).

E.6 Investments

This section describes the number of the new investments registered, employment opportunies, Capital approved and investment ownership.

Total of 114 new projects worth 4,646,050 million TZS were registered in 2023. This shows an increase of 22.6 percent from 93 projects worth 4,550,069 in 2022. Majority of the projects (38.6 percent) were from the Hotels and Restaurant sector, similar pattern recorded for the five- year period. (Table E.6.1 and Table E.6.3).

Moreover, a total of 6,146 employees were approved for all registered projects in 2023, most of them (72.3 percent) were from Accommodation and food services activities Sector, followed by Real estate activities sector (16.6 percent). Transportation and storage sector approved less than one percent (0.2 percent) of the employees which recorded the least (Table E.6.2).

Three out of four new registered investments (75.4 percent) in 2023 were owned by Domestic investors. More than one third (38.6 percent) of the registered investments were owned by European investors while 33.3 percent were owned by African investors (Table E.6.4 and Table E.6.5).

F. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

F.1 Agriculture

Agricultural production encompasses both food, cash crops and varieties of fruits and vegetables as well as spices. Majority of the farmers are smallholders dominated by subsistence farming and a few in access are for the market. The products in agriculture also include animal husbandry (cattle, goats and chicken), fishing and forestry, while cloves and seaweed are the main cash crops for foreign earning. Statistics on areas used to cultivate various food crops, fruits and vegetable production, volumes and values of animals inspected and slaughtered and forestry products are collected from respective departments responsible with agriculture.

Crop Production

Agriculture is one of the important economic sectors of Zanzibar's economy in terms of food production, employment generation, production of raw material for industries and generation of foreign exchange. The sector in 2023 contributed about 24.9 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Smallholder farmers and large-scale farms, with wide varieties of cash and food crops including fruits, vegetables and spices. The most common livestock types raised in Zanzibar are cattle, goats and ducks and chicken.

Food Crops, Fruit and Vegetable Production

For the year 2023, total area planted with major food crops, fruits and vegetables was 122,514.2 Acres whereby 101,134.7 acres (82.5 percent) were planted with major food crops and the remaining 21,379.9 acres (17.5 percent) were planted with fruits and vegetables. This imply that the total planted area with major food crops is almost five times higher than total planted area with fruit and vegetables. Kaskazini 'A' district has the highest planted area of 27,921.4 acres while Magharibi 'B' recorded 1,306.8 acres which is the least (Table F.1.1).

The total of 527,800.0 tons were produced in 2023. Wete District recorded the highest production of 121,951.8 tons while Magharibi 'A' recorded the least of 11,255.8 tons. The production of major food crops is 441,014.2 tons (83.6 percent) while the production of fruits and vegetables is 86,785.7 tons with 16.4 percent (Table F.1.2).

The total area planted with major food crops in 2023 is 101,134.7 acres which show an increase of 16.8 percent compared with 86,624.7 acres recorded in 2022. The trend shows that the total areas planted with major crops increased in 2020, then decreased in 2021 before gradually increasing for two years to reach the maximum areas in 2023. Cassava covered the highest planted area (37,548.9 acres) among the areas planted with major food crops while finger millet covered the least area of 386.3 acres (Tables F.1.2).

Among the major crops produced in 2023, cassava had the largest production of 220,411.5 tons followed by banana (74,513.8 tons) while Finger millet/Bulrush had the least production of 77.3 tons. Wete recorded the highest production of the cassava (33.8 percent) and banana (32.5 percent) compared with other districts while Magharibi 'B' recorded the least production of cassava (0.3 percent) and banana (1.1 percent) (Table F.1.4).

Among the vegetables and fruits produced in 2023, watermelon recorded the highest production of 23,403.0 tons, followed by pawpaw, pineapple and tomatoes (14,506.5 tons, 14,352.3 tons and 14,489.4 tons respectively). Kaskazini 'A' has the highest production of watermelon (7,608 tons, 32.5 percent), followed by Kaskazini 'B' (4,230 tons, 18.1 percent) as shown in Table F.1.6.

The value of Major food crops production in 2023 is 440,583.5 million TZS which show an increase of nearly half (47.1 percent) compared with 299,440.7 million TZS recorded in previous year. The trend shows that the value of production of major food crops decreased for two consecutive years (2020 and 2021) and then increased in another two consecutive years (2022 and 2023).

Cash Crops Production

The quantity of cloves purchased in 2023 was 2,654.6 tons this quantity purchased shows a decrease of 43.9 percent compared with the purchase made in previous year 2022. The five-year trend, show that the quantity of purchased cloves increased for two years to attain the maximum purchase of 7,840.8 tons in 2021 and then decreased for two consecutive years. The value of cloves purchased worth 37,980.7 million TZS which shows the decrease of 39.9 percent compared with preceding year. The trend shows that value of purchased cloves increased for two years to attain the maximum value of 102,020.9 million TZS in 2021 and then decreased for two consecutive years.

The total production of seaweed in 2023 is 16,652.7 tons which shows an increase of 50.7 percent compared with 11,048.8 tons recorded in 2022. The trend show that the quantity of seaweed production has been increasing consecutive for the period of five years. The value of produced seaweed is 16,514.8 million TZS which shows an increase of 92.8 percent compared with 8,563.9 million TZS in 2022. The trend show that the value of seaweed produced has been increasing consecutive for the period of five years (Table F.1.10).

The quantity of fish catches in 2023 is 80,085 tons which shows an increase of 29.6 percent compared with 61,794 tons recorded in 2022. The value of fish catches in 2023 is 569,080 million TZS which shows an increase of 45.4 percent compared with 39,1370 tons in 2022. The quantity and values of fish catches have been increasing within a period of five years.

Anchovies fish recorded the highest quantity (21,827.1 tons) of fish catches in 2023 while mullet recorded the least (2.2 tons). Anchovies also recorded the highest values of fish catches in 2023 compared with other type of fishes. Most of the fish catches were from Mjini District (11,393 tons worths 92,532 million TZS), while Kusini District recorded the lowest (5,564 tons worths 37,639 million TZS) (Table F.1.15 and Table F.1.16).

Forest Resource

Data on forest resources are collected from licensed timber cutting from Government Forest Plantations and public land. In addition, the Islands are surrounded by mangrove and other beach trees used in house and fishing boat manufacture.

Quantity of Forest Products

The volume of firewood harvested in 2023 is 25,909.7 m³ which show a decrease of 1.2 percent compared with 1,741.1 m³ harvested in the year 2022. The trend show that the volume of firewood has been decreasing for the period of five years. The volume of charcoal produced in 2023 is 2,128.2 m³ which shows an increase of 9.5 percent compared with 1,943.6 m³ recorded in 2022. The trend show that the volume of charcoal produced has been increasing within a period of five years (Table F.1.17).

Production of Forest, Fruits and Species Seedlings

The total of 1,117,005 seedlings were produced in 2023, which show a decrease of 20.6 percent compared with 1,406,153 seedlings recorded in 2022. The trend shows that the number of seedlings decreased in 2020, then increased in 2021 before gradually decreasing for two years.

The number of forest seedling in 2023 is 765,578 which shows a decrease of 17.9 percent compared with 931,960 recorded in 2023 while the number of clove seedling is 147,877 which also shows a decrease of 40.7 percent compared with 249,456 recorded in 2022. The number of fruit and spices seedling in 2023 is 203,550 which shows a decrease of 9.4 percent compared with 224,737 recorded in 2022 (Table F.1.49).

F.2 Manufacturing

Zanzibar industrial activities are centred mainly on small and medium scale processing of domestic goods; food processing, beverages and processing of agricultural products. Industrial sector includes all establishments engaged in activities that fall under mining (for Zanzibar this is mainly quarrying), manufacturing, generation and distribution of electricity, gas and water. This is as recommended in International Recommendations on Industrial Statistics (ISIC REV. 4).

Selected Commodities

This includes only the commodities that were selected to present industrial production in Zanzibar, the commodities selected were those which showed the highest output during the census of industrial production (CIP, 2012).

The production of sugar in 2023 is 27,000 tons which increased by 467.2 percent compared with 4,760 tons produced in 2022. The trend show that the production of sugar has been fluctuating for the period of five years and maintain the maximum point in 2023. The production of wheat flour in 2023 is 50,565 tons which increased by 10.6 percent compared with 45,704 tons produced in 2022. Number of breads produced is 247,750,000 in 2023 which increased by 2.9 percent from 240,814,000 breads recorded in 2022. Production of garments (Dash Dash) is 5,122 pieces in 2023 which shows a decrease of 13.4 percent from 5,913 pcs in 2022, the decrease might be due to the decrease of consumer demands (Table F.2.1).

The value of production in public industries (clove stem oil, printing services and electricity distribution) is 142,076 Million TZS in 2023 which shows a decrease of 1.6 percent from 144,316 million TZS in 2022. This decrease was caused by unproduction of oil-stem factory due to the change of management from government to private sector. Value of goods produced in Private industries is 213,990 million TZS in 2023 which shows an increase of 41.5 percent from 151,267 million TZS in 2022. The increase in the value of private industries was mainly due to the increase in the production of Sugar, wheat flour and breads (Table F.2.3).

The total Producer Price Index (PPI), which excludes the Value Added Tax (VAT) and transport cost of the finished products, increased from 157.3 in 2022 to 161.7 in 2023, this is due to an increase in the price of Manufacturing of food products; Manufacture of furniture; and Manufacture of leather and related products (Table F.2.4).

F.3 Construction

The construction statistics, including number of new architects registered, consulting architect firms registered as well as number of new engineers registered.

The total number of new architects registered in 2023 is eleven architects of whom all are local architects. There are five consulting architect firms registered in the same year which shows an increase of four firms compared to previous year (Table F.3.1).

The total number of engineers registered by Engineers Registration Board is 74 in 2023 which is an increase of 64.2 percent compared with previous year. Among registered engineers, local engineers are higher (65 persons) than foreign engineers (9 persons). The boards also registered eight Engineering companies in 2023 which is higher than previous year with only two companies (Table F.3.2).

F.4 Mining and Quarrying

This section presents data on Mining of different products, these includes stones, sand, gravel, rubbles, limestone and stone bricks.

Total quantity of sand mined in 2023 is 1,670,609 tons which shows an increase of 56.3 percent compared to the quantity mined in previous year. The five-year trend shows the quantity of mined sand decreased in 2020 and then increased in three consecutive years to reach the maximum quantity in 2023.

Total quantity of gravels mined in 2023 is 136,958 tons which is an increase of 84.8 percent compared with 74,106 tons in preceding year. The five-year trend shows the quantity of extracted gravels fluctuated for three consecutive years and then increased to reach the maximum quantity in 2023.

Total quantity of stones mined in 2023 is 273,010 tons which is an increase of 93.2 percent compared with 141,342 tons in preceding year. The five-year trend shows the quantity of extracted stones increased for consecutive two years and then decreased in 2022 before increasing to reach the maximum quantity in 2023.

Total quantity of bricks stones manufactured in 2023 is 10,977 tons which shows a slight increase of less than one percent (0.4 percent) compared with 10,936 tons in preceding year. The five-year trend shows the quantity of extracted bricks stones decreased in 2020 and then increased for the last three years (Table F.4.1.).

F.5 Utility

This section presents statistics on water supply (revenue collection, number of boreholes drilled, new permit of water connection, conflict for water users and water development projects), electricity (new customers connection to national power grid, quantity and value of electricity) and fuel and gas (consumption of petroleum, diesel, kerosene and gas products).

F.5.1 Water Supply

The amount of water Produced in 2023 is 191,959,675 cubic meters whereas the estimated demand is 275,980,481 cubic meters, this indicates a total deficit of 30 percent in demand. The highest water supply was recorded in Mjini Magharibi Region where 94,027,280 cubic meters was supplied followed by Kusini Pemba Region with 30,844,800 cubic meters. The region with the lowest water supply was Kusini Unguja whereby there were only 17,310,348 cubic meters supplied (Table F.5.1.1 and F.5.1.2).

The total revenue collected for water supply in 2023 was TZS 2,127 million with the highest revenue collected from Mjini Magharibi Region amounting TZS 1,126.6 million TZS, followed by Kusini Pemba with total revenue of 315.3 million TZS. The Region with the lowest revenue collected was Kaskazini Unguja with the total amount of 190.8 million TZS (Table F.5.1.2).

The total of 309 boreholes were in operation in 2023 which shows an increase of 2.7 percent compared with 301 boreholes in previous year. The five-year trend shows that the number of boreholes in operation increased in 2020 to attain the maximum of 316 boreholes and decreased in 2021 to reach the minimum of 293 boreholes which then increased for two consecutive years (2022 and 2023). Kusini Pemba Region has the highest number of boreholes (83 boreholes) that are in operation followed by Mjini Magharibi Region (82 boreholes) while Kusini Unquja Region recorded the least (44 boreholes).

F.5.2 Electricity

The recorded number of new customers connected to National Power Grid in 2023 is 35,838 customers, which show an increase of 27.9 percent compared with 28,020 customers connected in 2022. The number of customers connected to National Power Grid has been fluctuated for the period of five years from 2019 to 2023 (Table F.5.2.1).

The quantity of electricity distributed to different customers in 2023 is 560,898,000 KWH which shows an increase of 11.4 percent from 503,463,000 KWH in 2022. The five-year trend show that quantity of electricity distributed decreased in 2020 and then increased for three consecutive years to attain the maximum quantity of 560,898,000 KWH (Table F.5.2.2).

The value of electricity distributed in 2023 worth 139,703 million TZS which shows a decrease of 1.5 percent from 141,835 million TZS in 2022. The value from electricity distributed increased for three consecutive years (from 2020 to 2022) then decreased in 2023 (Table F.5.2.3).

F.5.3 Fuel and Gas

Total of 106,431,175 litres of petrol were consumed in 2023 which show an increase of 9.4 percent compared with 97,274,509 litres consumed in 2022. The five-year trend shows that, the volume of petrol consumed decreased in 2020 and then increased for three consecutive years to attain the maximum consumption of 106,431,175 litres in 2023. The highest petrol consumption (9,880,208 litres) is recorded in December while April has the least consumption of 7,750,200 litres (Table F.5.3.1).

The volume of diesel consumed in 2023 is 67,764,771 litres which show an increase of 11.2 percent compared with 60,937,061 litres consumed in 2022. The five-year trend shows that, the volume of petrol consumed decreased in 2020 and then increased for three consecutive years to attain the maximum consumption of 67,764,771 litres in 2023. The highest diesel consumption (6,507,460 litres) is recorded in March while April has the least consumption of 4,594,533 litres (Table F.5.3.2).

Total of 2,477,339 litres of kerosene were consumed in 2023 which show a decrease of 36.8 percent compared with 3,918,701 litres consumed in 2022. The five-year trend shows that, the volume of consumed kerosene decreased in 2020, then increased in 2021 before gradually decreasing for two consecutive years. The highest kerosene consumption (270,301 litres) is recorded in August while February has the least consumption of 154,528 litres (Table F.5.3.3).

The total of 9,673,17 kilogram of gas were consumed in 2023 which show an increase of 34.3 percent compared with 7,200,1 kilograms recorded in previous year. The trend reveals that the gas consumption increased in 2020 and then decreased in 2021 before gradually increase in the last two years (2022 and 2023). The highest consumption of gas (1,003,943 kilograms) was recorded in October while February recorded 601,672 kilograms which is the least (Table F.5.6.8).

G. TOURISM STATISTICS

G.1 Tourism

This section consists of information about tourist arrivals into Zanzibar through major entry points, visitors by nationality, sex composition of visitors and their purpose of visit for international tourists.

The total number of visitors for the year 2023 were 638,498 that show an increase of 16.4 percent compared to 548,503 visitors recorded in 2022. French dominated the tourism market by accounting for 10.7 percent of all visitors in the year 2023, followed by Italian (10.6 percent) and German (9.0 percent) while New Zealand (0.1 percent) recoded the least. The month of December, 2023 recorded the highest number of visitors (70,186), followed by January (68,813) while the month of May recorded 26,620 which is the least (Table G.2.1, Table G.2.7 and Figure G.2.2).

A total of 570,394 visitors (89.3 percent) visited Zanzibar through Airport, of whom 537,799 came by international flights and 32,595 by domestic flights from various regions of Tanzania Mainland. The remaining visitors 68,104 (10.7 percent) entered through Seaport of whom 4,383 came by cruise ship and 63,721 came by ferry from Tanzania Mainland (Table.G.2.2).

Composition by sex suggests more females visited Zanzibar than males. There were 319,979 (50.1 percent) males and 318,519 (49.9 percent) females who entered Zanzibar in 2023. (Table G.2.3).

The ages of the visitors were categorized into three broad groups: those younger than 15 years who are regarded as children, 15 to 64 years who are regarded as working age population, and 65 years and older are regarded as retirees. The overall results show that 46,168 (7.2 percent) visitors were aged less than 15 years; 550,470 (86.2 percent) were aged 15 to 64 years and 41,860 (6.6 percent) were aged 65 years and older. Majority of visitors (97.8 percent) came to Zanzibar for leisure/holidays (Table G.2.4 and Table G.2.5)

The number of visitors from emerging markets for the year 2023 increased by 2.6 percent compared with preceding year (2022). Generally, the data show that the majority of the emerging countries prevailed in the increase of visitors in 2023 except Ukrainian which show decrease of 68.7 percent compared with the year 2022 (Table G.2.6).

Majority of visitors (19.62 percent) stayed in the country for seven days in 2023, followed by those who stayed for eight days (17.2 percent). The overall average intended length of stay was about eight nights.

The number of Hotels/Guest Houses is 722 in 2023 which show an increase of 1.8 percent compared with 709 hotels/guest houses in 2022. The trend show that the number of hotel/guest houses has been increasing for the

period of five years (2019 to 2023). The total number of 276 Hotels and Guest Houses are in Kusini district, followed by Kaskazini A (206 Hotels/Guest Houses) while Wete district recorded the least (2 Hotel/Guest House). The results further show that 150 new Hotels/Guest Houses were registered in 2023, with a total of 2,404 rooms. (Table G.3.1, Table G.3.2 and Table G.3.3)

The total of 21 Tourist attractions were visited in 2023. Three among them were private attractions and 18 were Government attractions. Majority of visitors visited Government attractions (121,614) than Private attractions (42,470). The total number of visitors visiting tourist attractions for the year 2023 were 164,084 which show a decrease of 31.1 percent compared with 238,038 visitors recorded in 2022.

Kati district has the highest number of visitors (68,500) visited tourist attractions, followed by Mjini (44,197) while Mcheweni (2,396) had the least (Table G.4.1, Table G.4.2 and Table G.4.3).

Figure G.2.1: Percentage Growth Rate of International Visitors, 2019-2022




Figure H.2.2: Number of International Visitors Arrival by Month, 2023



H. Transport and Communications

This section presents statistics on transport and communication activities. Transport statistics comprise data on road network, movements/trips (enter/exit), traffic handling of passengers and cargo – both at airports and seaports as well as information on number of motor vehicles registration and licenses issued to both public and private automobiles. Communication data comprise the number of registered radio and television.

H.1 Transport

The transport sector plays a big socio-economic role in the movements of people and distribution of goods and services. The transport system in Zanzibar is divided into:

- a. Interregional transport between Islands, Mainland and the coastal area of Eastern Africa.
- b. Local internal transport within islands.
- c. Transport to the rest of the world

In 2023, the total number of marine vessels' trips (enter/exit) reached 10,779 which shows a decrease of 26.8 percent compared with year 2022. The five-year trend shows that the number of marine vessels at seaport has been increasing for three consecutive years to reach the maximum point (14,728 trips) in 2022, and then decreased in 2023.

The passenger handled at seaport reached 2,883,206 in 2023 which is an increase of two percent compared with the year 2022. The trend shows that number of passengers handled at seaport decreased in 2020 to reach the minimum point (2,210,000 passengers) for a period of five years, then it has been increasing for three consecutive years.

The twenty-foot equivalent unit (TEU) is a general unit of cargo capacity, often used to assess the capacity of port in term of handling the cargo. The key performance indicator used in assessing the port capacity is the number of TEUS handled annually in the port. The data show that, 72,117 TEUs handled at seaport in 2023. This shows a high decrease of 45.8 percent of containers handled compared with 2022. The five-year trend shows that number of TEUS handled at seaport decreased in 2020 to attain the minimum point and then increased for two consecutive years to reach maximum point (133,017 TEUS) in the year 2022, then decreased in 2023 (Table H.1.1).

The international and domestic air craft movements in 2023 are 12,708 and 49,551 respectively. Both international and domestic aircraft movements increased by 20.4 percent and 11.0 percent respectively compared with 2022. (7,726) in 2023 (Table H.1.2).

The total number of passengers handled at Zanzibar airports (AAKIA and Karume Airport-Pemba) reached 2,040,161 of whom 1,031,119 passengers departed and 1,009,042 arrived Zanzibar. The number of passengers handled at airports increased by 20.3 percent in 2023 compared with 1,689,317 recorded in 2022. The five-year trend shows that the number of passengers handled at airports decreased in 2020 and attained the minimum points of 744,142 passengers in 2022, after that it has been increasing for three consecutive years and attained the maximum point (2,040,161 passengers) in 2023. Both arrived (disembark) and departed (embarked) passengers portray the similar trend as total. Total of 203,052 transit passengers were also recorded in 2023 (Table H.1.3).

Total of 3,812.7 tons of cargo were handled in Zanzibar Airports in 2023 of which 3,577.2 tons of freights were off-loaded as imported goods while 235 tonss of freights were loaded as exported goods, this shows an increase of 36.0 percent compared with 2022. The five-year trend shows that number of cargos handled has been fluctuating each year, although it attained the maximum number in 2023. The similar situation is recorded for the freights off-loaded. The freights loaded (exported) is much lower compared with freights offloaded (Table H.1.2)

Zanzibar had a stock of 74,999 land transport vehicles on 31st of December 2023, which shows a decrease of 48.2 percent of land transport vehicle stock compared with the year 2022. The five-year trend shows that the stock of land transport vehicles has been increasing for three consecutive years from 2019 and attained the maximum stock of 144.864 in 2022 which then highly decreased to 74,999 vehicles in 2023 (Table H.1.5).

Total of 10,717 driving learner license were registered, which shows a decrease of about five percent (5.3 percent) compared with 2022. The years 2021 recorded the highest number of the registered driving learner licenses (13,988 licenses) within a period of five years. More than half (55.0percent) of the registered driving learner license in 2023 was a license for private vehicle up to 7 passenger seats (Class B1), followed by a license for motorcycle and three wheelers (Class A) while those who ask a license for Private vehicle more than 7 Passenger seats (Class B) recorded less than one percent (0.05 percent) which is the least(Table H.1.6) ..

H.2 Communication

The communication sector plays a crucial role in various aspects of modern society, spanning from personal interactions to global connectivity. In the Government views, communication has the impact on the governance, public trust, and the effective implementation of policies.

The provided communication statistics cover the registered radio, television, telephone towers and postal stations.

The number of radios stations registered at the end of 2023 is 24, of which two radio are public owned, four are community owned and 18 are private owned. The same number of radio stations were available in 2022, while the number of television registered is 15, of which two are public owned and 13 are private owned in 2023. The same number of televisions stations were available in 2022 (Table H.2.1 and Table H.2.2).

There are 474 towers owned by various telephone companies in 2023. The number of towers owned by telephone companies increased by almost six percent (5.8 percent) compared to the preceding year. More than half (51.9 percent) of the towers are owned by Zantel Company, followed by Helios Company (30.2 percent). The trend shows that number of towers owned by telephone companies in Zanzibar has been increasing for the period of five year and attained the maximum number in 2023. The number of towers owned by telephone companies is nearly double within a period of five years (Table H.2.3).

The increase of towers owned by telephone companies was due to the installation of new towers in each year. The data show that, there are 26 new towers in 2023 which show a decrease of 69.0 percent compared with new towers in 2022. Majority of new towers (61.5 percent) in 2023 are owned by Zantel Company, followed by Halotel Company that owns 34.6 percent. The five-year trend show that the number of new towers has slightly increased for two consecutive years from 2019, but high increase is recorded in 2022 to attained maximum number of 84 new towers and then decreased in 2023 (Table H.2.2).
