



Vision

"To become a Centre of excellence for statistical production and for promoting a culture of Evidence-based policy and decision-making".

Mission

"To coordinate production of official statistics, provide high quality statistical data and information and promote their use in planning, decision making, administration, governance, monitoring and evaluation".

Fundamental Principles of Official Statistics

Principle 1: Relevance, Impartiality, and Equal Access

Official statistics provide an indispensable element in the information system of a democratic society, serving the Government, the economy and the public with data about the economic, demographic, social and environmental situation. To this end, official statistics that meet the test of practical utility are to be compiled and made available on an impartial basis by official statistical agencies to honour citizens' entitlement to public information.

Principle 2: Professional Standards, Scientific Principles, and Professional Ethics

To retain trust in official statistics, the statistical agencies need to decide according to strictly professional considerations, including scientific principles and professional ethics, on the methods and procedures for the collection, processing, storage and presentation of statistical data.

Principle 3: Accountability and Transparency

To facilitate a correct interpretation of data, the statistical agencies are to present information according to scientific standards on the sources, methods and procedures of the statistics.

Principle 4: Prevention of Misuse

The statistical agencies are entitled to comment on erroneous interpretation and misuse of statistics.

Principle 5: Sources of Official Statistics

Data for statistical purposes may be drawn from all types of sources, be they statistical surveys or administrative records. Statistical agencies are to choose the source with regard to quality, timeliness, costs and the burden on respondents.

Principle 6: Confidentiality

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Individual data collected by statistical agencies for statistical compilation, whether they refer to natural or legal persons, are to be strictly confidential and used exclusively for statistical purposes.

Principle 7: Legislation

The laws, regulations and measures under which the statistical systems operate are to be made public.

Principle 8: National Coordination

Coordination among statistical agencies within countries is essential to achieve consistency and efficiency in the statistical system.

Principle 9: Use of International Standards

The use by statistical agencies in each country of international concepts, classifications and methods promotes the consistency and efficiency of statistical systems at all official levels.

Principle 10: International Cooperation

Bilateral and multilateral cooperation in statistics contributes to the improvement of systems of official statistics in all countries.

Guiding Principles

The Office is committed to upholding values of Professionalism, Integrity, Confidentiality, Customer focus, Innovation and Teamwork (PICCIT) as the guiding principles in production of statistics.

Organization of OCGS

The management is vested to Zanzibar Statistics Board, Chief Government Statistician is the Chief Executive Officer of OCGS and Member of Zanzibar Statistical Board.

Office of the Chief Government Statistician further comprises of five Directorates namely;

- a. Economic Statistics
- b. Social Statistics
- c. Statistical Standard Coordination and Research
- d. Administration and Planning
- e. Pemba Sub Office

Mandate

To collect, analyse and disseminate statistical information. The Bureau is also the custodian of official statistical information, and coordinator of the National Statistical System.

Calendar Year (CY) starting from January to December 2024 or Financial Year (FY) starting from July to June

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
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Map 1: Zanzibar Administrative Boundary

A. ADMINISTRATION AND GOVERNANCE

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar (RGoZ) was formed on 12th January, 1964 under the first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, Zanzibar and Tanganyika united on 26th April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then, Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System with exception of the Court of Appeal.

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its Eighth Phase under His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi since November 2020. Previous phases' Presidents were; Hon. Dr. Ali Mohamed Shein (2010 - 2020); Hon. Dr. Amani Abeid Amani Karume (2000 - 2010); Hon. Dr. Salmin Amour Juma (1990 - 2000); The Late, Hon. Idrisa Abdulwakil (1985 - 1990); The Late, Hon. Ali Hassan Mwinyi (1984 - 1985); The Late, Hon. Aboud Jumbe Mwinyi (1972 - 1984); and The Late, Hon. Abeid Amani Karume (1964 - 1972).

Since independence, the RGoZ was operated through the single party system from 1964 to 1995. In 1992 the United Republic of Tanzania adopted multiparty system which allowed formulation of political parties in the country. The election through multiparty system was officially effective from 1995 to date, hence the RGoZ has been governed through multiparty system ever since. In addition, in 2010, the Zanzibar Constitution was amended to allow formulation of the National Government Unity (GNU) whereby the second run up political party thrives to 30 percent of the total presidential votes join the Government. Currently, the RGoZ is governed under GNU system.

A.1 Administration

Zanzibar had 22 Members in the Revolutionary Council (which is also the Council of Ministers – A Cabinet), as of December 2024; among them 18 are ministers. The Revolutionary Council is chaired by his excellency Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi the President of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar.

A.2 Governance

B. LAND, CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

B.1 Land

Zanzibar is one of the Indian Ocean Island. It is situated on the Eastern Africa coast about 36.5 kilometres adjacent to Tanzania Mainland. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometres; of which 1,664 squares kilometres are for Unguja Island and 988 square kilometres are for Pemba. There are also a habitat and un-habitat islets.

The northern tip of Unguja Island is located at 5.72° South, 39.30° East, with the Southernmost point at 6.48° South, 39.51° East. It is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel, which at its narrowest point is 36.5 km (22.7 mile) across. The island is about 85 km (53 mile) long and 39 km (24 mile) wide, with an area of 1,666 km² (643 sq. mile) which is mainly low lying, with its highest point being 120 m (394 ft). It is also characterised by beautiful sandy beaches with fringing coral reefs with enrich in marine biodiversity.

The northern tip of Pemba Island is located at 4.87° south, 39.68° east, and the southernmost point is located at 5.47° south, 39.72° east. The island is separated from the Tanzania Mainland by a channel some 56 km (35 mile) wide. The island is about 67 km (42 mile) long and 23 km (14 mile) wide, with an area of 988 km² (381 sq. mile). Pemba is also mainly low lying, with its highest point being 95 m (312 ft).

B.2 Climate

Zanzibar experience warm and humid climatic condition (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely Masika, the main rainy season, March to May; Kipupwe, the cold season, June to August; Vuli, short rainy season September to November; and Kaskazi, the hot season December to March. The average highest rain in 2024 was recorded in April, 504.5 mm for 21 days in Unguja and 704.3 mm for 26 Days in Pemba as shown in table B.2.1 below.

Zanzibar has a tropical monsoon climate (Am). The heat of summer (corresponding to the Northern Hemisphere winter) is often cooled by strong sea breezes associated with the northeast monsoon, Kaskazi, particularly on the north and east coasts. Being near to the equator, the islands are warm year round. The rainfall regime is split into two main seasons, a primary maximum in March, April, and May in association with the southwest monsoon, Kusi, and a secondary maximum in November and December. The months in between receive less rain, with a minimum in July.

C. POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS

C.1 Population

The 2022 PHC revealed that the population of Tanzania Zanzibar has increased five times from 354,360 people in 1967 to 1,889,773 people in 2022, -more than a fivefold increase over 55 years. In 2002, the rural population declined from 60.4 percent to 53.7 percent in 2012 and 49.0 percent in 2022. This trend highlights a gradual rural-to-urban migration, likely driven by better economic opportunities, education, and healthcare in urban areas. The urban population share increased from 39.6 percent in 2002 to 46.3 percent in 2012, reaching 51.0 percent in 2022. By 2022, Zanzibar officially became an urban-majority region, with urban residents surpassing the rural population. The spatial composition shows that almost three quarter (71.2 %) of the population lives in Unguja Island where majority of them live in Mjini Magharibi Region (Figures C.1.1 and C.1.1; and Figure C.1.2).

The sex ratio of the population in 2022 TPHC was 94, meaning that for every 100 females there are only 94 males. The sex ratio remained unchanged between 2012 TPHC and 2022 TPHC. Population pyramid provides a snapshot of the population age and sex structure. The Zanzibar population pyramid is characterized by a young age structure, with a large proportion of the total population found in the young and/or youthful ages (Table C.1.2 and Figure C.1.3).

Table C 1.3 indicates that a large number of people were in the age groups 0.4, 5.9, and 10.14 years, particularly in Mjini Magharibi Region. A small number were in the age group 65 years and above, although a notable number were observed across regions. Mjini Magharibi has the largest population across most age groups, while Kaskazini and Kusini Pemba Regions also show significant numbers.

C.1.1 Population Growth

Zanzibar had a total population of 1,889,773 with an average growth rate of 3.7 percent per annum from 2012 to 2022; urban and rural average growth rates are 4.3 and 3.2 percent respectively. The most rapid growth occurred between 2002 and 2022, with an increase of over 900,000 people in just 20 years. The population doubling time has decreased, from 28 years (1967–1978) to 19 years (2012–2022). The trend shows that the average annual intercensal population growth rate increased for two consecutive censuses from 1967 - 1978 to 1988 - 2002, then declined in 2002 - 2012 TPHC and bounced back in 2012 - 2022 TPHC (Tables C.1.4 and Table C.1.5).

C.1.2 Population Density

In 2022 TPHC, Zanzibar population density was 768 people per square kilometer. Mjini Magharibi Region has the highest population density (3,902.9 people per square kilometer) compared with other regions, while Kusini Unguja Region recorded the least (229.1 people per square kilometer). Population density has been increasing since 1967 TPHC (Figure C.1.4).

C.1.3 Average Household Size

Zanzibar had an average household size of 4.9 persons in 2022. Kusini Pemba Region has the highest average household size (5.7 persons) compared with other regions, while Kusini Unguja Region has the lowest (4.2 persons). The trend shows that the average household's size has decreased from 2002 TPHC to 2022 TPHC (Table C. 1.6 and Figure C.1.5).

C.1.4 Mean Age at First Marriage

The mean age at first marriage has increased from 24.7 in 2012 to 25.6 in 2022, reflecting a trend of delayed marriage across both males and females. This indicates social and demographic changes, such as education, career development, and urbanization, influencing marriage patterns. The mean age at first marriage for males is 27.8 compared with 23.7 for females, showing a significant gender disparity (Figure C.1.6 and Table C.1.7).

C.1.5 Population Projection

Zanzibar's total population is projected to grow from 1,889,773 in 2022 to 2,530,834 in 2032, reflecting a steady increase of approximately 28 percent over the next decade. This indicates a consistent population growth rate across all regions (Table C.1.8).




Figure C.1.1: Population Trends in Tanzania Zanzibar; 1967-2022 Censuses







Figure C.1.4: Population Density, 1967-2022







C.2 Vital Statistics

The number of registered births shows significant fluctuations from 2022 (147,428) followed by a sharp decline in 2023 (43,943), then an increase in 2024 (49,889). Monthly birth registrations show that in 2024, the highest number was recorded in October (599 births) and the lowest birth registration was observed in September (230 births). The number of registered births shows significant fluctuations from 147,428 births in 2022 followed by a sharp decline to 43,943 births in 2023 then increased to 49,889 births in 2024 (Tables C.2.1, C.2.2 and C.2.4).

The number of marriages registered has increased gradually from 352 marriages in 2020 to 13,605 marriages in 2024. A similar trend is observed in divorces and deaths. The monthly death registrations showed October had higher registration compared to other months. Furthermore, the number of registered marriages has increased gradually from 2020, 352 to 13,605 marriages in 2024. A similar trend was observed in registered divorces and registered deaths (Tables C.2.1, C.2.3 and C.2.5)

D. SOCIAL STATISTICS

D.1 Education

In Zanzibar, the formal education system is structured into pre-primary, primary, secondary, and tertiary educational levels. Pre-primary education is provided for two years, beginning at age four followed by primary education, which spans for seven years (Standard I to VII). Secondary education lasts for six years, with the first four years (Form 1 to Form 4) dedicated to ordinary level education, and the final two years (Form 5 to Form 6) focuses on advanced level education.

D.1.1 Access Education Indicators

The data shows a steady increase in the number of schools from 2023 to 2024. Generally, in public schools, Preprimary education rose from 56 in 2023 to 67 in 2024, with a noticeable increase in the number of schools providing primary education, from 326 in 2023 to 328 in 2024. Secondary education schools increased slightly from 216 in 2020 to 217 in 2024 (Table D.1.1).

Pre-primary education enrollment has exhibited a general upward trend. Public schools show a decline in enrollment from 63,732 pupils in 2023 to 62,974 pupils in 2024, sector. Conversely, private schools show an increase in enrollment from 39,176 in 2023 to 40,607 in 2024. The overall pre-primary enrollment across both sectors increased from 102,908 in 2023 to 103,581 n 2024, indicating enhanced access to early childhood education (Table D.1.3).

The proportion of new students enrolling in Standard I has varied over the years. Public school enrolment slightly rose with a total of 48,410 pupilss in 2024 from 45,314 in 2023. Meanwhile, private school enrolment showed a steady rise from 11,027 in 2023 to 13,172 in 2024, indicating a growing preference for private education (Table D.1.4). Across all districts, Standard I enrolment in public schools varied, with some districts experiencing growth while others saw a decline. The highest pupils enrolled in standard I is in Magharibi A with 6,049 pupils enrolled in standard I 2024, while Kusini districts enrolled the lowest pupils in standard I of 1,286 pupils. (Table D.1.5).

The total number of students in both public and private primary schools stood at 391,388. The number of boys rose from 191,974 in 2023 to 197,294 in 2024, while the number of girls increased from 188,665 to 194,094 over the same period. This upward trend highlights improved access to primary education, with a consistent rise in enrolment across all standards (Table D.1.7).

Ordinary Secondary school enrolment has shown fluctuations over the years. In public schools, the total number of students decreased from 92,510 in 2023 to 104,987 in 2024. While male enrolment increased from 41,574 in 2023 to 47,863 in 2024, female enrolment slightly increased from 50,936 to 57,124 over the same period. In private secondary schools, total enrolment declined from 11,023 in 2023 to 11,647 in 2024. The number of male students increased from 5,212 to 5,473, female also increased from 5,811 to 6,174. (Table D.1.9).

Advanced secondary school enrolment has experienced overall increase over the period of 2020 to 2024. The total number of students has been increased from 6,512 students in 2023 to 8,564 students in 2024. Male enrolment increased from 3,215 to 4,193, while female enrolment rose from 3,297to 3,700 over the same period (Table D.1.11).

In 2024 overall, higher education enrolment across public and private institutions reached 22,434 students in 2024, reflecting increased participation in tertiary education. Female students accounted for a larger proportion in most programs, particularly in diploma and degree level (Table D.1.12).

Total enrolment in higher education decreased from 15,781 in 2023/2024 to 12,451 in 2024/2025 in public institutions. Male enrolment in public universities and colleges decreased 5,450 in 2023 to 4,648 in 2024, while female enrolment also decreased from 10,331 to 7,803 over the same period while the private sector experienced the growth, with the total enrolment rising from 6,551 in 2023 to 9,983 in 2024 (Table D.1.13)

D.1.2 Quality Education Indicators

Teacher qualifications in public and private schools have shown varying trends from 2020 to 2024. The total number of qualified teachers increased from 19,459 in 2023 to 21,830i n 2024 the proportion of un qualified Teacher was 5.9 percent lower than 7.3 of previous year. In public schools, the number of qualified teachers has steadily increased from 13,802 in 2023 to 15,223 in 2024., the proportion of unqualified teachers has remained low, with only 2.0 percent in 2024 compared to 2.2 percent in 2023. In private schools, the number of qualified teachers grew from 5,657in 2023 to 6,607 in 2024, though the percentage of unqualified teachers remained relatively high, reaching 13.8 percent in 2024 (Table D.1.21).

D.1.3 Performance Indicators

Examination results for Form II students in 2024 show a decrease in the total number of candidates, with male students consistently representing about 11,481 of candidates and female students 12,080. Male pass rates declined from 79.5 percent in 2023 to 78.3 percent in 2024, while female pass rates remained higher, reaching 90.7 percent in 2024. Male failure rates remained higher than female failure rates, with 21.7 percent of males failing in 2024 compared to 9.3 percent of females. The data highlight a persistent gender disparity, with female students generally performing better than male students (Table D.1.31).

Form IV examination results from 2020 to 2024 show consistent trends in male and female performance. The number of candidates decreased from 24,2732 in 2023 to 26,092 in 2024. Female students pass more than male students, with 12,609 females passing compared with 8,724 males in 2024. The failure rate for males was higher, with 2,309 males compared with 2,450 females in 2024. Division-wise, more females achieved higher divisions (I and IV),. Overall, the gender gap in performance remains evident, with female students generally performing better than male students (Table D.1.33).

The Form VI examination results show a number of candidates, with a slight increase in total candidates of 3,402 in 2023/2024 from 2,626 in 2023/2024. Female passing was 1,747 females in 2023/24 compared to 1,651 males. Both males and females had same number of failure, with 2 failing in 2023/24, Males archived higher division (I and IV) while female students achieved higher divisions (II and III), (Table D.1.35).

D.1.4: Equity Indicators

The number of university students applying for and receiving loans from the Zanzibar Higher Learning Loan Board increased in 2024/25 a total of 11,480 students applied, with 5,004 males and 6,476 females applied loan. Among them new applicants were 7,183 (3,216 males and 3,967 females). The total 13,555 number of students were awarded loans. 5,466 males and 8,089 females. The number of students receiving loan increased from 5,900 in 2023/24 to 13,55 in 2024/25 (Table D.1.41).

D.2 Health

The total number of health facilities in Zanzibar increased from 361 in 2023 to 384 in 2024 (excluding point-of-entry health service delivery), marking a 6.4 percent increase. This growth was mainly driven by the rise in district hospitals from 6 to 10 as well as the introduction of 6 single-service facilities and an increase in NGO-operated health facilities from 3 to 11. A re-categorization initiative by the Ministry of Health, aimed at streamlining service delivery and optimizing resource allocation, contributed to a reduction in PHCUs (now referred to as Dispensaries), from 134 in 2023 to 86 in 2024, a 35.8 percent decrease. As part of this reorganization, some former PHCUs were upgraded to PHCU+ (Health Centres), which increased from 34 to 48, while 36 facilities are temporarily left uncategorized (Table D.2.1).

To support service delivery, Zanzibar's public health workforce increased to 3,595 personnel in 2024 from 3,433 in 2023, with notable increases in medical doctors (498 from 478), nurses (1,486 from 1,424), and specialist doctors (83 from 81). However, Assistant Medical Officers (28 from 38) and environmental health personnel (224 from 227) declined. A notable trend is the steady rise in medical doctors, nearly doubling from 270 in 2020 to 498 in 2024. However, radiographic/medical imaging personnel remain limited, fluctuating from 41 in 2020 to only 27 in 2024 (Table D.2.4).

Number of live births recorded at health facilities in Zanzibar declined by 6.3 percent, from 57,162 in 2023 to 53,540 in 2024. The most significant drop occurred in Mjini District, where births fell by 35.0 percent (from 22,777 to 14,812). Other notable decreases were recorded in Wete by 10.5 percent (from 4,227 to 3,782) and Chake Chake by 3.2 percent (from 5,513 to 5,338). In contrast, Magharibi 'B' experienced a substantial 81.5 percent increase in facility births (from 3,939 to 7,149), while Magharibi 'A' recorded 44.6 percent rise (from 2,980 to 4,309). Kati District also reported a sharp increase of 67.8 percent from 1,857 to 3,118 (Table D.2.5).

The decline in births corresponded with slight reductions in the number of several childhood vaccines administered during the same year of 2024. For instance, BCG vaccinations, typically given at birth decreased by 4.3 percent from 101,491 in 2023 to 97,105 in 2024, while Oral Poliovirus Vaccine (OPV) doses declined by 10.1 percent. Similarly, DPT and PCV3 vaccinations showed minor decreases of approximately 1.9 percent and 2.0 percent, respectively. Despite the drop in births, measles-rubella vaccinations slightly increased by 0.6 percent, contributed to sustained efforts in outreach and follow-up immunization beyond the immediate postnatal period (Table D.2.6).

The number of outpatient visits in Zanzibar increased to 3,329,878 in 2024, reflecting a 73.4 percent increase from 1,921,043 in 2023. Public facilities accounted for 78.2 percent of total visits (2,604,210), experiencing 93.6 percent rise from 1,345,644 in the previous year. Private facility visits increased to 32.4 percent reaching 535,860 from 404,845, while parastatal facilities recorded an increase of 11.6 percent (167,801 from 150,389). Faith-based facilities recorded a rise of 9.1 percent (22,007 from 20,165) (Table D.2.7). Meanwhile, outpatient diagnoses remained consistent with Upper Respiratory Tract Infections (URTI) leading at 13.1 percent (304,571 cases), followed by No Pneumonia Cough/Cold (10.7 percent) and Other Skin Diseases (9.1 percent). Compared with 2023, URTI cases rose by 8.4 percent and No Pneumonia Cough/Cold cases by 14.9 percent (Table D.2.8).

Conversely, Inpatient admissions decreased by 6.7 percent, dropping from 117,456 in 2023 to 109,576 in 2024. Public hospitals continued to handle the majority of these cases, accounting for 90.6 percent of all cases, but still recorded a 5.5 percent decline (from 105,091 to 99,341). Private facilities experienced a sharper 49.2 percent drop (from 8,184 to 4,160), while parastatal institutions showed a notable 45.2 percent increase from 4,184 to 6,075 (Table D.2.7). Meanwhile,

lymphoma emerged as the leading cause of admission in 2024, accounting for 28.5 percent of all cases (18,326), a stark shift from 2023 when it was not among the top ten. In contrast, severe anaemia, the top condition in 2023, dropped by 16.7 percent (from 4,270 to 3,559). Other conditions showing significant increases included spontaneous abortion, which rose by 58.3 percent (from 1,654 to 2,619), severe pneumonia by 52.8 percent (from 2,264 to 3,460), and diarrhoeal diseases by 41.9 percent (from 2,334 to 3,311). Conversely, admissions due to hypertension, diabetes, and septicaemia declined compared to 2023 (Table D.2.10).

At the same time, the number of in-patient deaths in 2024 was 2,262 in 2024, showing a 0.9 percent increase from 2,242 in 2023. Cerebrovascular accident (CVA) remained the leading cause of death, but fatalities decreased by 38.2 percent (304 from 492). Birth asphyxia moved up to the second position, with deaths rising by 25.1 percent (159 from 127). Severe pneumonia deaths also increased slightly, while deaths due to severe anaemia decreased significantly by 56.6 percent (86 from 198). In generally, there is an increase in overall deaths despite lowering admissions for the year 2024 (Table D.2.11).

A total of 16,224 blood bags were collected and 17,407 distributed across Zanzibar in 2024, reflecting a slight increase in collection compared to 15,313 in 2023, though still below the distribution demand for the year. Despite an overall 7 percent rise in collection from the previous year, the supply-demand gap persisted, with distribution exceeding collection by 1,183 units. This imbalance was consistent with past years, particularly 2023, where 18,045 units were distributed against 15,313 collected, widening the shortfall (Table D.2.12).

A total of 16,718 houses were sprayed for malaria prevention across Zanzibar in 2024, achieving 93.7 percent of the targeted 17,797 households. This represents a slight decline from the 95.0 percent coverage in 2023 and a more notable drop from the 100.8 percent recorded in 2021. The highest coverage in 2024 was observed in Kusini Unguja (99.1%), followed closely by Kaskazini Pemba (97.3%), while Mjini Magharibi recorded the lowest coverage at 92.3 percent despite having the highest number of targeted households (Table D.2.13).

D.3 Gender

In 2024, reported gender-based violence incidence was 1,809 which decreased (7.4 percent) from 1,954 incidence in 2023. Rape decreased by 9.8 percent, sodomy by 36.2 percent, and interference against nature by 21.1 percent. Abduction increased by 27.5 percent, incidence of assault by 32.9 percent, while assault decreased by 12.2 percent as shown in (Table D.3.1). Table D.3.2 shows that in 2024, gender-based violence among elders' victims decreased from 320 to 284 incidence. Women accounted for 211 incidences, while men for 73 incidences. Rape incidence decreased from 99 to 75 incidence, sadomy from 10 to four (4) incidence among women increased from six (6) to 11 incidences.

Table D.3.3 shows that in 2024, the total number of children victims of gender-based violence decreased from 1,639 in 2023 to 1,525 in 2024. Girls accounted for 1239 incidence while boys 286 incidence. Rape incidence decreased from 826 to 758 incidence, sodomy from 237 to 153 incidence, and interference against nature from 79 to 58 incidence. Indecent assault increased from 163 to 224 incidence and abduction incidence increased from 104 to 125 incidence. Kaskazini A reported incidence decreased from 98 to 59 incidence followed by Kaskazini B from 113 to 75 incidence and Mjini from 457 to 384 incidence. Magharibi B increased slightly from 417 to 431 incidence, Chake Chake from 108 to 113 incidences and Micheweni from 42 to 46 incidence. (Table D.3.4).

The age group 15-17 years recorded the highest number of gender-based violence incidences, with 722 incidences (57.5% of total girl incidences) for girls and 73 incidences (27.0% of total boy incidences) for boys followed by age group 11-14 years with 298 incidences for girls and 91 incidences for boys. The age group 6-10 years with 166 incidences for girls and 86 for boys. The age group 0-5 years had the lowest, with 69 incidences for girls and 20 for boys (Table D.3.7).

In 2024, girls continued to represent the majority of reported cases of violence against children across all districts in Zanzibar, accounting for 81.2 percent of cases compared to 77.1 percent in 2023. Most districts recorded an increase in the proportion of girls affected, with the highest rise observed in Kaskazini A (up by 9.9 percentage points) and notable increases in Magharibi B, Wete, and Mjini. However, a few districts such as Kaskazini A, Micheweni, and especially Mkoani experienced a decline in the proportion of girls compared to 2023. Mjini remained the district with the smallest gender gap, with boys making up 24.1 percent of reported cases in 2024 (Table 3.8). Table D.3.9 shows that in 2024, there were 1,809 reported gender-based violence incidences, prepetrators house is the highest (657 occurences follow by victim houses and gestor friend houses with 65. Women accounted for 1,458 incidences (80.7 percent), while men had 351 incidences (19.3 percent). The most common place of occurrence for rape was the perpetrator's house with 302 incidences (36.2 percent) out of 833 incidences. For sodomy (157 incidences), it mainly occurred in other places with 60 incidences (38.2 percent). Assault (330 incidences) was most common at other places with 110 incidences (33.3 percent). Abduction incidences occurred mainly at the perpetrator's house (87 incidences).

In 2024, out of 1,809 reported gender-based violence incidents. Of these, 290 cases led to convictions (16.0 percent), while 352 incidences were presented in court (19.5 %). About 81 incidences were lost in court (4.5 percent), and 1 incidence was withdrawn. The majority, 882 incidences (48.8%), were under investigation by the police. 147 incidences (8.1 %) were closed by the police, and 56 incidences (3.1 % were sent to the Director of Public Prosecution. Majority of incidences for rape sodomize, interfirance against nature and abduption were under investigation (499, 82, 26, and 58 respectively) follow by present in court (125, 34, 17, 31 and 68 respectively) while majority of assault and incedent assault are under investigation (114 and 103 respectively) follow by conviction (98 and 77 respectively), as shown in (Table D.3.10). Adult

aged 18-29 reported to have the highest number of incidences with 269 victims (94.7 percent) followed by aged 30-39 (3.9 percent) compared with other age groups (Table D.3.11).

D.4 Social Welfare

In 2024, the Orphanage Centre has seen a marked increase in the number of children residents under care over the past five years, particularly in the boys and girl's child residents. Meanwhile, the Elderly Care Centre experienced a gradual decrease in the number of residents, with a notable decline in the male residents, the Orphanage Centre recorded a total of 563 children, which represents a notable increase compared to 384 in 2023. Among them, 302 were boys and 261 were girls. The number of boys at the Orphanage Centre increased by 106, while the number of girls rose by 73, showing an overall upward trend in the number of children under care. This reflects a significant growth from 2020, when only 258 children were recorded, with a notable rise seen in both the boy and girl residents. In addition to that, the Elderly Care Centre saw a slight decrease in total residents, dropping from 67 in 2023 to 60 residents in 2024. The male residents decreased from 40 in 2023 to 35 in 2024, while the female individuals also dropped, from 27 in 2023 to 25 residents in 2024. Compared to 2020, the number of elderly residents in 2024 has decreased significantly, particularly for males, as the figures from 2020 showed a much higher total of 134 residents (Table D.4.1).

In 2024, a total of 30,951 elders were registered under the Universal Pension Scheme, comprising 13,411 males and 17,540 females. The highest number of registered elders was in Mjini (5,480), while Kusini recorded the lowest (1,187). Over the years, the total number of elders registered fluctuated but showed a general upward trend. Notably, female elders consistently exceeded males across all districts and years (Table D.4.2).

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D.5 Crime

Crime statistics attempt to provide statistical information to measure the magnitude, nature and possible impact of criminal or civil crime traffic incidents in the society. Several approaches are used to capture crime statistics, including household, hospital and insurance records. For this section data are primary compile from the administrative record (Police, Zanzibar Educational for Offenders and Judiciary).

D.5.1 Road Accidents

In 2024, Zanzibar recorded 222 traffic accidents, an increase from 193 accidents in 2023. The highest number of accidents occurred in Kaskazini A (38 accidents), followed by Magharibi A (33 accidents) and Magharibi B (32 accidents). Mkoani had the fewest accidents (7 accidents). In terms of monthly data, June had the highest number of accidents with 23, while December had the fewest with 13. (Table D.5.1 and D.5.2).

The total number of victims in 2024 was 413, an increase from 385 in 2023. Of these, 189 victims died (170 males and 19 women), while 224 were injured (190 males and 34 women) (Table D.5.3)

Table D.5.4 shows that in 2024, there were 47,258 traffic offenses, an increase of 22.6 percent from 38,598 in 2023. The main offenses that increased were dangerous loads and passengers 10,070 offence (51.7 percent), carrying more than two people on a motorcycle 686 offenses and dangerous driving 593 offences (71.0 percent).

D.5.2 Crime Cases

In 2024, 53,934 traffic offences were reported making 39.2 percent increase from 38,791 in 2023. Out of the total offences, 53,722 offences (99.5 percent) were minor and 212 offences (0.5 percent) were serious. The increase in traffic offences has been consistent over the years, except in 2021. Magharibi 'B' District has the highest proportion, 20.9 percent compared to other districts in 2024 (Table D.5.5).

D.5.3 Prison Statistics

There were a total of 468 inmates (451 males and 17 females) in 2024, 520 inmates (10 females) in 2023, and 785 inmates (65 females) in 2022. No inmates received the death penalty in 2024 (Table D.5.6). Most of inmates (91) served 3 months or less, while 145 served 4 to 11 months in 2024.

A total of 1,272 remands (1,252 males and 20 females) were reported in 2024. The age group 18-30 had the highest number of remands, with 694 individuals with the highest males remands. The overall trend shows increase in remands in 2024 compared to 2023 (Table D.5.7).

D.5.4 Offences Against Person

Table D.5.12 shows that in 2024, tranquillity-related offences totalled to 202. A slight decrease from 208 in 2023. The reported crime against property significantly decreased from 9,345 in 2023 to 2,313 in 2024. The reported theft cases decreased from 7,075 in 2023 to 245 in 2024. Crimes against persons were 1,736 in 2024, with rape to girl (under 18 age) cases at 758, slightly decreased from 824 in 2023. Murder cases increased from 44 in 2023 to 66 in 2024

D.5.5 Juvenile Court Cases

The total number of Criminal Cases filled at the Juvenile court were 98, of which 60 (61.2 %) had been decided and 38 cases were pending before the Court. The number of filed cases decreased by 19.0 percent from 121 in 2023 to 98 in 2024. The number of decided cases decreased from 80 in 2023 cases to 60 cases in 2024. (Table D.5.14).

D.6 Sober Houses and Drugs Addicts

Four sober houses were reported in 2024, all of which are for males. The number of sober houses remained unchanged from 2023 to 2024. A total of 203 persons resident registered in the sober houses in 2024, marking a decrease of 26.2 percent compared to the 275 recorded in 2023. This reduction is particularly notable in the age groups 26-35 and 36-45, where the numbers dropped substantially. The largest proportion of individuals (75 individuals, or 36.9 percent) fall within the age group 15-25, while the smallest proportion (11.8 percent) is found in those aged 46 and above.

Looking at the five-year trend, the number of individuals has been declining for three consecutive years from 2020 to 2022. However, there was an increase in 2023, with a peak of 309 individuals, before dropping again in 2024 to 203 (Tables D.6.1 and D.6.2).

D.7 Sports and Recreations

The total number of football referees in 2024 was 116, with 2 holding FIFA badges (1%) and 114 without FIFA badges (90.0%). The number of referees in 2024 increased by more than 100% compared to the previous year.. The trend shows that the number of referees increased in 2020, then decreased for two consecutive years, and increased again in 2024 (Table D.7.1).

Table D.7.3 shows the distribution of the number of Sports registered in Zanzibar from 2020 to 2024. Football clubs has the highest number of sports registered, peaking at 1,629 clubs in 2024. Several sports, including Aikido, Basketball, and Karate Combat, maintain stable participation over the years. Some sports, such as Kabbadi and Nage, show significant drops in recent years. Additionally, certain sports like Lawn Tennis and Zanzibar Health for Sportsmen have minimal or no participation in some years.

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is defined as the monetary value of all finished goods and services produced within an economic territory in a specific period of time (usually one year). It is the most important indicator in the System of National Accounts (SNA) used to gauge the health of a country's economy. The Production, Expenditure and Income methods are the approaches to its measurements; results of which are presented in current (years) or constant (base year or real) prices. The Office of the Chief Government Statistician has adapted the Production approach to the compilation of Zanzibar's GDP estimates.

For the year 2024, GDP at current prices stood at TZS 6,572.6 billion, interpreting the per capita income of TZS 3,227,000. At constant 2015 prices the GDP increased to TZS 4,026.4 billion compared with TZS 3,758.6 billion observed in 2023. This indicates that Zanzibar's economy grew by 7.1 percent in 2024 (Table E1.1). The Services sector has the highest contribution accounts for 46.9 percent of total GDP in 2024. The main segment within Services is the accommodation and food services, contributing 16.9 percent of total GDP. Agriculture sector contributes 24.3 percent of the GDP with the highest contribution from livestock (10.5 percent). Industry contributes 20.2 percent of the GDP and the main segment is the construction (10.0 percent) of total GDP.

The observed growth in the economy in 2024 was a result of the recovery of the economy caused by an increase in mining and quarrying activities (17.0 percent), fishing (14.2 percent) and accommodation and food services (8.2 percent).




Figure E.1.1: Percentage Share of Economic Sectors in the Gross Domestic Product (GDP), 2020-2024

E.2 Government Finance Statistics

Government Finance Statistics (GFS) are compiled in accordance with the GFS Manual, 2014 by using a modified cash basis of recording. GFS cover expenditure by functions of Government (COFOG) that show how Government spending is allocated across various sectors, programs, and services. GFS is used in the compilation of GDP by expenditure approach and is the basis for fiscal monitoring that reflect the priorities of government fiscal policy and the services provided to the public.

During the financial year 2023/24, government revenue collected amounted to TZS 2,104.7 billion of which TZS 1,201.9 billion was tax collections, TZS 708.1 billion was grants, and the remaining was non-tax revenues. Table E.2.1 reveals that Government revenue increased by 49.5 percent compared with 2022/23 whereby the main contributors were capital grants and value-added taxes.

Total government expenditure during the year 2023/24 was TZS 2,103.9 billion, of which TZS 1,232.1 billion was for expenses and TZS 871.8 billion was for acquisitions of new non-financial assets (Table E.2.2 and E.2.3). The expenditure by function of the government (Table E.2.5) shows that the government spent about TZS 1,118.7 billion (53.2%) for economic affairs, including commercial, labor, and transportation issues. Moreover, Table E.2.7 shows acquisitions of new non-financial assets accounted for about 41.4 percent of the total expenditure at the end of 2023/24.

Tables E.2.5 and E.2.3 show that the government continues to invest in non-financial assets related to economic issues, including the improvement and construction of new infrastructure. A major part of these investments requires large amounts of financing, thus resulting in the government increasing the incurrence of domestic liabilities to be able to achieve the desired goals.

E.3 Trade

Zanzibar recorded a total volume of trade worth TZS 1,825,501 million in 2024 which marks an increase of 13.3 percent compared with TZS 1,611,135.0 million recorded in 2023. The trade balance in 2024 has shown a deficit of million TZS 1,473,013.7 compared with the deficit of TZS 1,392,600.6 million recorded in 2023. The export-import ratio increased from 7.3 percent in 2023 to 10.7 percent in 2024. The recorded export value in 2024 was TZS 105,286.9 million decreased by 3.6 percent compared with TZS 109,267.2 million recorded in 2023. The value of the imports was TZS 1,649,257.3 million in 2024 that indicates an increase of 9.8 percent compared with TZS 1,301,867.8 million recorded in 2023 (Table E.3.1).

Foods and live animals highly contributed 65.7 percent of the total export value in 2024 amounted at TZS 69,217.3 million. The exported value of cloves recorded was TZS 30,737.3 million in 2024 which is equivalent to 29.2 percent of the total export and that of seaweeds was TZS 10,738.7 million that accounted for 10.2 percent. India was the major buyer of the exported goods from Zanzibar accounted at 29.4 percent of total export. (Table E.3.3, Table E.3.4 and Table E.3.5).

U.A.E recorded the highest value of import in 2024 worth 829,712.5 million TZS (50.3 percent). Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials recorded the highest value for imports TZS 749,199.5 million, (45.4 percent) in 2024 (Table E.3.6 and Table E.3.9).

E.4 Price

The inflation rate for the year 2024 stands at 5.1 percent while the indices for food and non-food were 8.4 and 2.7 percent respectively. The trend of the overall inflation rate in Zanzibar does not portray a specific direction, it decreases or increases during different periods as shown in Figure E.4.1. The overall inflation rate remained in a single digit for the last decade (from 2015 – 2024) (Table E.4.5 and Figure 4.1).

The ZCPI for the year 2024 was recorded as 111.66 compared to the average of 106.22 for the year 2023. The index for food for the year 2024 stood at 120.61 which is higher compared with 111.23 recorded in 2023. The same pattern is observed for non-food index where the year 2024 recorded higher index of 105.56 compared with 102.81 for the year 2023.

The annual average price for Thailand rice per kilogram in 2024 stands at TZS 2,349, compared to TZS 2,134 in 2023, which represents an increase of 10.1 percent. Meanwhile, the average price of wheat flour per kilogram for 2024 and 2023 was TZS 1,999 and TZS 2,057, respectively. The average price per kilogram for white sugar in 2024 increased to TZS 2,989, compared to TZS 2,698 in 2023, showing an increase of 10.8 percent. Moreover, the average prices for fuels (kerosene, petrol, and diesel) in 2024 were recorded at TZS 3,200, TZS 3,030, and TZS 3,109, respectively, compared to the average prices of TZS 2,984, TZS 2,995, and TZS 2,896 in 2023. The average prices of kerosene, petrol, and diesel increased by 7.2 percent, 1.2 percent, and 7.4 percent, respectively (Table E.4.4).

Figure E.3.1: Annually Inflation Rate, 2015-2024




Figure E.4.2: Food and Non-Food Annually Inflation Rate, 2015-2024



E.5 Employment and Earnings

Total employment for all sectors in 2023/24 was 83,430 employees (i.e. Government, Government Parastatals and Private) which shows an increase of 2.0 percent from 82,225 employees in 2022/23. The number of male employees was higher (52.3 percent) than female employees (47.7 percent). Majority of employees were in Government Parastatal and Government sector (56.0 percent) compared with private sector (44.0 percent). The total wage bill in 2023/24 was TZS 892,902 million of which, TZS 739,881 million was used for the payment of salaries and TZS 20,087 million for free ration. Education industry had the highest wage bill in 2023/24 amounted to TZS 242,845 million (Table E.5.1 and Table E.5.2).

Education industry has the highest proportion of total employees 30.0 percent compared with other industries, followed by accommodation and food services activities 18.8 percent. Among the industries, education has the highest proportion 36.9 percent of employees in Government parastatal or Government sector. On the other hand, accommodation and food service activities has the highest proportion 42.8 percent of employees in private sector (Table E.5.3 to Table E.5.7).

E.6 Investments

New projects registered in 2024 were 131 worth TZS 1,887,760 million. This was an increase of 13.0 percent from 114 projects in 2023. Most of the projects (57.3 percent) were from the hotels and restaurant sector, similar pattern recorded for the period of five years (Table E.6.1 and Table E.6.5).

A total of 4,109 employees were approved for all registered projects in 2024, most of them (44.6 percent) were from the accommodation and food services activities sector while education sector approved less than one percent (0.2 percent) of the employees, which recorded the least (Table E.6.4).

Four out of five new registered investments (80.2 percent) in 2024 were owned by foreign investors. More than one-third (35.9 percent) of the registered investments were owned by American investors, while 33.2 percent were owned by Australian investors. Furthermore, African investors contributed about 27.5 percent of the total investors in 2024 (Table E.6.2 and Table E.6.6).



F. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

F.1 Agriculture

F.1.1 Major Food Crop Production

Crop production is one of the important in terms of food production, employment generation, production of raw material for industries and generation of foreign exchange. Crop information is collected from small holder farmers and large-scale farms, with wide varieties of cash and food crops including fruits, vegetables and spices. In 2024, out of 24.3 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP) in agricultural sector, crop contributed about 6.8 percent.

Total area planted with major food crops, fruits and vegetables was 104,667.8 acres whereby 81,402.9 acres (77.8 percent) were planted with major food crops and the remaining 23,264.9 acres (22.2 percent) were planted with fruits and vegetables. Kaskazini A district has the highest planted area of 27,062.8 acres while Kusini recorded 962.5 acres which is the least. Paddy (rain feed) covered the highest planted area (24,565.4 acres) among the areas planted with major food crops while bulrush finger millet covered the least area of 323.1 acres. Among the major crops produced in 2024, cassava had the largest production of 117,871.7 tons followed by banana (62,808.3 tons) while Finger millet/Bulrush had the least production of 64.6 tons. (Table F.1.1.3).

F.1.2 Fruits and Vegetables Production

The watermelon recorded the highest production of vegetables and fruits accounted at 23,798.9 tons in 2024, followed by tomatoes, pineapple and pawpaw (13,005.3 tons, 8,219.8 tons and 5,765.7 tons respectively) (Table F.1.2.1). Generally, production of vegetables and fruits in 2024 decreased compared with the production of 2023 by 9.0 percent.

F.1.3 Cash Crop Production

The quantity of cloves produced in 2024 was 1,167.4 tons, a decrease of 56.0 percent compared with the purchase made in the year 2023. The value of cloves purchased was worth TZS 17,250.7 million. In 2024, the highest quantity of clove purchased was in January of which 654.2 tons worth TZS 9,628.5 million and the least was purchased in May (Table F.1.3.1).

The total production of seaweed was 19,716.0 tons in 2024 which is an increase of 18.4 percent compared with 16,652.9 tons recorded in 2023. The value of seaweed produced was TZS 16,144.6 million a decrease of 2.2 percent compared with TZS 16,514.8 million in 2023. The trend shows that the value of seaweed produced has been increasing consecutive for the period of five years. Clove stem production has shown a declining trend over the past three consecutive years. In 2024, the quantity produced was 185.1 tons, valued at 277.6 million (Table F.1.3.6).

F.1.4 Inspected and Slaughtered and Poultry

In 2024, a total of 31,953 cattle were inspected and slaughtered, reflecting a 7.0 percent increase compared to 2023. Meanwhile, the number of inspected and slaughtered chickens decreased by 6.5 percent from 1,161,238 in 2023 to 1,085,856 in 2024. While there had been a steady increase in the number of chickens slaughtered between 2022 and 2023, this year marked a decline in poultry numbers (Table F.1.4.1).

F.1.5 Fish Catch

The quantity of fish catch was 78,943 tons in 2024, a decrease of 1.4 percent compared with 80,085 tons recorded in 2023. The value of fish catches in 2024 was TZS 618,183 million an increase of 8.6 percent compared with TZS 569,080 million in 2023. Anchovies fish recorded the highest catches (18,678 tons) while Groupers 1,391 tons in

2024. Most of the fish catches were from Mjini District (10,882 tons worth TZS 92,241 million), while Chake Chake District recorded the lowest (5,810 tons worth TZS 43,708 million) (Table F.1.5.1 and Table F.1.5.2).

F.1.6 Forest Resource

The volume of firewood harvested was $21,002 \text{ m}^3$ in 2024 a decrease of 18.9 percent compared with $25,910 \text{ m}^3$ harvested in the year 2023. The quantity of charcoal produced was 2,207 tons in 2024 an increase of 3.7 percent compared with 2,128 tons recorded in 2023. (Table F.1.6.1).

The total of 1,603,476 seedlings were produced in 2024, which show an increase of 43.6 percent compared with 1,117,005 seedlings recorded in 2023. The number of forest seedling was 580,625 in 2024, a decrease of 24.2 percent compared with 765,578 recorded in 2023. The number of clove seedling was 765,578 in 2024, an increase of 99.3 percent compared with 147,877 recorded in 2023; and the number of fruit and spices seedling was 728,158 (Table F.1.6.2).

F.2 Manufacturing⁶

The production of sugar decreased to 8,534 tons in 2024 from 27,000 tons produced in 2023. The production of wheat flour was 57,139 tons in 2024 which is an increase of 13.0 percent compared with 50,565 tons produced in 2023. Production of beverages was 23,935,000 litres in 2024, an increase of 4.0 percent from 23,014,000 litres produced in 2023 (Table F.2.1).

The overall value of production was TZS 351, 277 million in 2024, a decrease of 1.3 from 356,066 million in 2023. The value of production in public industries (printing services and electricity distribution) was TZS 198,125 million in 2024 while the value of goods produced in private industries was TZS 153,152million in 2024 (Table F.2.2 and Table F.2.3). The total Producer Price Index (PPI), which excludes the Value Added Tax (VAT) and transport cost of the finished products, was 161.8 in 2024 (Table F.2.4 and Table F.2.5).

F.4 Mining and Quarrying

The total quantity of sand mined in 2024 was 1,265,473 tons a decrease of 24.6 percent compared to the quantity mined in 2023. The total quantity of gravels mined in 2024 was 7,515 tons which was decrease of 94.6 percent compared with 139,808 tons in 2023. Total quantity of stones mined in 2024 was 159,384 tons which is an increase of 93.7 percent compared with 272,657 tons in 2023. Total quantity of bricks stones manufactured in 2024 was 944 tons a decrease 91.4 percent compared to 11,032 tons in 2023 (Table F.4.1).

F.5 Utility

F.5.1 Water Supply

The amount of water produced in 2024 was 223.7 million cubic meters whereas the estimated demand was 276.0 million cubic meters, indicating a total deficit of 18.9 percent. The highest water supply was recorded in Mjini Magharibi region whereby 101.8 million cubic meters was supplied and the region with the lowest water supply was Kaskazini Unguja with only 21.4 million cubic meters supplied (Table F.5.1.1 and F.5.1.2). The total revenue collected for water supply in 2024 was TZS 3,317 million with the highest revenue collected from Mjini Magharibi region amounting TZS 1,245.9 million, and the Region with the lowest revenue collected was Kusini Unguja region with the total amount of TZS 194.6 million (Table F.5.1.2).

The total of 389 boreholes were in operation in 2024 compared with 309 boreholes in 2023. Mjini Magharibi region has the highest number of boreholes (132 boreholes) that were in operation while Kaskazini Unguja region recorded the least with 51 boreholes.

The number of new customers connected to National Power Grid (ZECO) in 2024 was 32,547 customers, compared with 35,838 customers connected in 2023 (Table F.5.2.1). The total quantity of electricity distributed to different customers in 2024 is 671,732,000 KWh compared with 560,702.000 KWh in 2023 (Table F.5.2.2). The value of electricity distributed in 2024 worth TZS 195,517 million which shows an increase of 23.4 percent from 158,448 million TZS in 2023.

F.5.3 Fuel and Gas

The volume of petrol consumed in 2024 was 113,284,726 litres, an increase of 6.4 percent compared with 106,431,175 litres consumed in 2023. The highest amount of petrol consumption was in December in all five years, while April has the least consumption in 2024, 2023 and 2020. (Table F.5.3.1). The volume of diesel consumed in 2024 was 75,197,228 litres an increase of 11.0 percent compared with 67,764,771 litres consumed in 2023. The highest volume of diesel consumption in 2024 was 7,385,858 litres recorded in October (Table F.5.3.2).

The volume of kerosene consumed in 2024 was 1,958,918 litres, a decrease of 20.9 percent compared with 2,477,339 litres consumed in 2023. The monthly highest volume of kerosene consumption in 2024 was 375,976 litres recorded in February while November recorded the least consumption of 79,316 litres (Table F.5.3.3). The total volume of Jet AI consumed in 2024 was 50,623,079 litres, an increase of 8.5 percent compared with 46,672,000 litres consumed in 2023 (Table F.5.3.4).



G. TOURISM STATISTICS

G.1 Tourism

The total number of visitors in 2024 was 736,755, an increase of 15.4 percent compared to 638,498 visitors recorded in 2023. Italy dominated the tourism market by accounting 11.8 percent of all visitors in 2024, while New Zealand (0.2 percent) recorded the least. The month of December 2024 recorded the highest number of visitors (91,611), while April recorded the least number of visitors 28,995 (Table G.1.1, Table G.1.7 and Figure G.1.1).

A total of 646,830 visitors (87.8 percent) visited Zanzibar through the Airport, of whom 592,613 (91.6 percent) came by international flights and 54,217 (8.4 percent) by domestic flights from mainland Tanzania. The visitors who entered through Seaport was 89,925 (12.2 percent) of whom 84,056 (93.5 percent) came by ferry from mainland Tanzania and 5,869 (6.5 percent) came by cruise ship (Table.G.1.2). There were more females visited Zanzibar than males. The number of female visitors were 382,584 (51.9 percent) and male visitors 354,171 (48.1 percent) in 2024 (Table G.1.3).

The number of visitors aged less than 15 years was 51,907 (7.0 percent); aged 15 to 64 years was 633,365 (86.0 percent) and 51,483 (7.0 percent) aged 65 years and older. The majority of visitors (98.3 percent) came to Zanzibar for leisure/holidays (Table G.1.4 and Table G.1.5). The number of visitors from emerging markets (Russia, Israel, India, China, Polish and Ukraine) in 2024 increased by 12.8 percent compared with visitors reported in 2023. Number of visitors from the most of the emerging countries increased in 2024 except Russian and Israeli, which showed a decrease of 7.6 and 30.5 percent respectively, compared with the year 2023 (Table G.1.6). About one-fifth of the visitors (19.5 percent) in 2024 stayed in the country for seven days while the average intended length of stay was about eight nights.

Figure G.1.1: Number of Tourist Arrivals, 2015-2024



Figure G.1.2: Percentage Growth Rate of International Visitors, 2015-2024




Figure G.1.3: Monthly Number of International Visitors Arrival, 2024




Figure G.1.4: Number of International Visitors, 2020-2024



G.3 Sites and Attractions

There were 36 tourist attractions in 2024, whereby 26 were Government attractions and 10 were private owned. The 546,500 visitors visited various tourist attractions in 2024, representing an increase of more three times compared with 164,084 visitors recorded in 2023. Majority of them (396,731) visited government attractions while 149,769 visitors visited private attractions. Mjini district recorded the highest number of visitors (324,443) visited tourist attractions, followed by Kusini Unguja District (101,310) while Kaskazini B District (1,574) recorded the least (Tables G.3.1, G.3.2 and G.3.3).

H.1 Transport

The total number of marine vessels' trips (enter/exit) in 2024 was 18,125, an increase of 68.2 percent compared to 2023. Among total trips in 2024; the local marine vessels contributed 99.2 percent (17,986) of the trips and foreign going vessel contributed 0.8 percent (139) trips. The passenger handled at seaport reached 3,321,415 in 2024 which is an increase of 15.2 percent compared with 2,883,000 recorded in 2023. The number of TEUS handled at seaport in 2024 was 44,611 TEUs a decrease of 45.3 percent compared with 81,501 TEUs recorded in 2023 (Table H.1.1).

The total aircraft movements in 2024 were 67,905 whereby 13,074 reported for international movements and 54,831 reported for domestic movements. The total number of passengers handled at Zanzibar airports (AAKIA and Pemba Airport) reached 2,259,511 of whom 1,144,832 passengers departed and 1,114,679 arrived in Zanzibar. The number of passengers handled at airports increased by 10.8 percent in 2024 compared with 2,040,161 recorded in 2023. (Table H.1.2 and H.1.3). Total of 4,704.6 tons of cargo were handled at Zanzibar Airports in 2024 of which 4,292.9 tons of freights were off-loaded as imported goods while 411.7 tons of freights were loaded as exported goods. This shows an increase of 23.4 percent compared with cargo handled in 2023 (Table H.1.4).

Zanzibar had a stock of 107,694 land transport vehicles on 31st of December 2024, an increase of 43.6 percent of land transport vehicle stock compared with the year 2023 (Table H.1.5). The learner driving licenses registered in 2024 were 12,339, an increase of 15.1 percent compared with 10,717 recorded in 2023. About half (51.0 percent) of the registered driving learner license in 2024 was for private vehicle up to 7 passenger seats (Class B1) while for private vehicle more than 7 Passenger seats (Class B) recorded the least (Table H.1.6).

H.2 Communication

There were 491 towers owned by various telephone companies in 2024. The number of towers increased by 3.6 percent compared to that reported in 2023.
