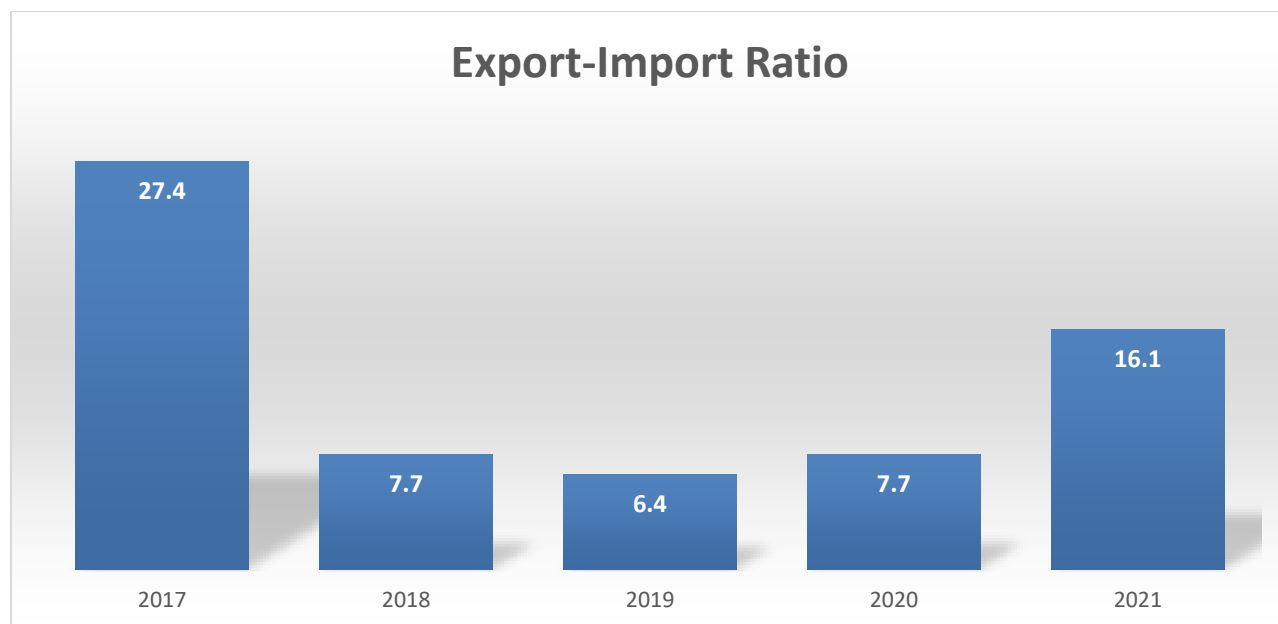

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Foreword

The 2021 External Merchandise Trade Statistics (EMTS) report is the 7th Annual Trade Statistics (ATS) Publications produced by Office of the Chief Government Statistician (OCGS). The publication shows the levels and trends of international trade between Zanzibar and the Rest of the World (RoW) for the period of 2017-2021.

These statistics are compiled in accordance with the General Trade System in which all goods that enter or leave the Zanzibar territory are recorded. The methods used to compile trade data closely follow the recommendations of common external tariff publication ‘2012 version’ for East African Community (EAC). These statistics are compiled from documents (Declaration Forms) provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority (TRA). As such only goods crossing international borders with appropriate customs documentation are included in this external trade information.

Considerable reliance is placed on exporters and importers or their agents on submitting correct codes and information. Data validation and other necessary adjustments are made before processing and the releasing of the publication. TRA - Customs Department, through its computerized database is responsible for all data management issues.

The report contains series of Imports, Domestic Exports, Re-exports as well as the Balance of Trade, Total Trade, trade between East African Community (EAC) and Southern Africa Development Community (SADC). It further provides trade statistics series of trading countries, commodities classified by the Standard International Trade Classification (SITC) as well as on Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System (HS).

OCGS expresses its appreciation for the established cooperation with TRA in providing the basic data used to compile this publication. It also recognizes and appreciates the efforts of staff from the TRA, ZURA and Ministry of Trade and Industries of Zanzibar (MTI) for their valuable inputs and commitments in completing this publication. Special thanks are bestowed to the Director of Economic Statistics and staff from Trade and Tax Statistical Unit for coordinating the whole exercise from compilation, analysis to the production of this publication.

It is hoped that, this publication will be of great use to the Government, the international community, NGOs, universities and research organizations, and the private sectors. OCGS welcomes all constructive comments, and suggestions for improving future report.

1. Introduction

The 2021 External Merchandise Trade Statistics (EMTS) report provides brief explanation of flows and directions of imports and exports for the period of 2017-2021. It provides statistics on imports and exports that form a valuable component of a country's statement on economic transactions in the National Economic Accounts (NEA) and Balance of Payments (BOP). Trade Statistics that are accurate, detailed and timely delivered have always been a priority as they are vital for the planning and future development of a country (or economy).

EMTS deals with international merchandise trade only and excludes statistics of trade in services. Information presented in this publication include Imports, Domestic Exports, Re-exports as well as the Balance of Trade, Volume of Trade, trade between Zanzibar and East African Community (EAC) and Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) countries. Comparisons are made to levels and changes between current and previous year.

Tables in appendix in this publication provide additional information of the external trade for the five years' trend, from 2017 to 2021 as well as monthly and quarterly information for the year 2021.

1.1 Methodology

The methods used to compile trade data follow closely the recommendations of Common External Tariff Publication for East African Community (EAC) version 2017. These statistics are compiled from documents (Declaration Forms) provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority (TRA). As such only goods crossing international borders with appropriate customs documentation are included in this external merchandise trade information.

Source of Data

Custom records are the most prevalent source of trade statistics, and this publication devotes significant attention to customs-based data collection. The main source is the bill of entry known as Tanzania Single Administrative Document (TANSAD) administered by the TRA for clearing of goods at all border stations of Zanzibar.

System Used

The ASYCUDA ++ (Automated System for Customs Data) system is operationalized in the Zanzibar Customs Service. This system provides the basic data from which External Trade Statistics are prepared. Currently this system provides coverage of all imports and exports from Zanzibar airport and seaports.

Time of Recording

Import and Export Statistics are compiled by Date of Assessment. This is the date on which the duty to be paid (if any) is assessed by the Customs Service, in effect of “clearing” the goods for import/export.

Limitations of Data

External Trade statistics are compiled from documents provided by exporters and importers to the TRA. Before the data released for statistical purposes, they are validated, and the detected errors are then corrected. It should be noted that goods crossing international borders without appropriate Customs documentation are not included in Trade Statistics.

Statistical Value of Imports and Exports

Statistical value is the value assigned to goods, in accordance with the World Trade Organisation’s Agreement on Customs Valuation (WTO-ACV), by the Tanzania Revenue Authority as follows:

- i. Imported goods are valued at Cost, Insurance and Freight (C.I.F), which includes the transaction value of the goods, the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country and the value of the services performed to deliver the goods from the border of the exporting country to the border of importing country.
- ii. Exported goods are valued as Free on Board (F.O.B) at port or place of exit. It includes transaction value of the goods and the value of services performed to deliver goods to the border of the exporting country.

Commodity Classification

Goods are classified by Customs using the Customs Tariff that is based on the international “Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System”, or “HS”. The Standard International

Trade Classification (SITC) Revision 4 of 2006 has been used for classification of commodities portrayed in this publication.

Customs Procedure Code (CPC)

A Customs Procedure Code (CPC) is used for both imports and exports to identify the nature of the movement of goods.

1.2 Concepts and Definitions

The following section provide additional information on concepts and definitions used to collect and analyse Trade Statistics. The concept and definition used follows UN “International Merchandise Trade Statistics”.

Export: In the International Trade, "exports" implies both export of domestic goods and re-exports of imported goods to abroad.

Domestic Goods: Domestic goods are the goods locally grown or produced (unprocessed) or goods locally produced (processed).

Re Export: Re export consist of foreign goods exported (in the same state as previously imported), from the free circulation area, premises for inward processing or industrial zones, directly to the rest of the world and from premises for customs warehousing or commercial free zones, to the rest of the world.

Import: An import includes all foreign goods entering the economic territory of a compiling country that are directly declared for home use.

Transferred Goods: Refer to transfer of imported goods from Zanzibar to Tanzania mainland duty paid Zanzibar.

Total Trade Value or Volume of Trade: Total trade value is an aggregate value of both imports and exports. It is also referred to as the volume of trade.

Balance of Trade: Balance of trade is a difference in value of imports from exports.

Import and Export Sections: The Harmonized System (HS) comprises of 21 Sections, which cover all commodities of international trade. A section is the integral part of goods that have similar manner. The arrangement of Sections in the HS is based on three principles:

- i. Articles made of same material are grouped together, for example, Section II (Vegetable products) and Section XV (Base metal and articles of base metal).
- ii. Goods of the same use or function are put together, for example, Section XVII (Vehicles, aircrafts, vessels and associated transport equipment) and Section XIX (Arms and ammunitions, parts and accessories thereof).
- iii. The stages of processing or degree of manufacturing of articles are put together, for example, Section V (ores, slag and ash) which are un-worked and Section XV (Base metal and articles of base metal) which are products of the articles in section V.

Country of Origin: The country of origin of goods is determined by EAC Rules of Origin. Generally, rules of origin consist of two basic criteria, namely: -

- i. The criterion of goods "wholly produced" (obtained) in a given country, where only one country enters into consideration in attributing origin;
- ii. The criterion of "substantial transformation", where two or more countries have taken part in the production of the goods.

Country of Destination: It is a country known at the time of dispatch to be the final country of destination where goods are to be delivered.

Capital Goods: Capital goods are physical assets used in the production process to manufacture products and services that consumers will later use. Capital goods include buildings, machinery, equipment, vehicles, and tools.

Consumer Goods: Consumer goods are products bought for consumption. Alternatively called final goods, consumer goods are the end result of production and manufacturing. Clothing, food, and jewelry are all examples of consumer goods.

Intermediate goods: is a partially finished product, used as a raw material in the manufacture of other products.

2. Trade Performance.

2.1 Introduction

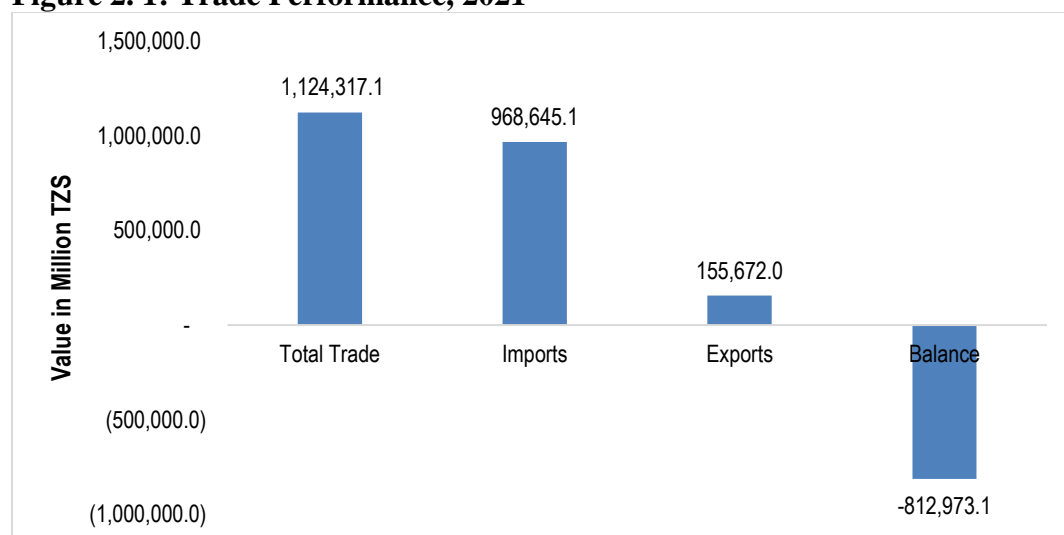
Zanzibar is a developing Island country, with limited production and access to international markets. It lacks natural resources and its dependence on primary sector makes its highly vulnerable to climate-related shocks. Trends fluctuations in its international trade are not common.

For a long time now, Zanzibar has become more dependent on imported goods, and thus has a trade deficit every year. This is due to the lack of factories that could produce and export goods, currently only cloves and seaweed are exported.

2.2 Trade Performance for the Year 2021

Total trade for the year 2021 reached to TZS 1,124,317.1 million indicates an increase of 23.1 percent over TZS 913,091.8 million recorded in the year 2020. Exports increased twice from TZS 65,661.0 million 2020 to TZS 155,672.0 million in 2021 while imports valued to TZS 968,645.1 million in 2021 increased by 14.3 percent compared with TZS 847,430.8 million recorded in the year 2020. Balance of Trade showed a deficit of TZS 812,973.1 million. The export-import ratio increased from 7.7 percent in 2020 to 16.1 percent in 2021 (Figure 2.1 and table 1).

Figure 2. 1: Trade Performance, 2021



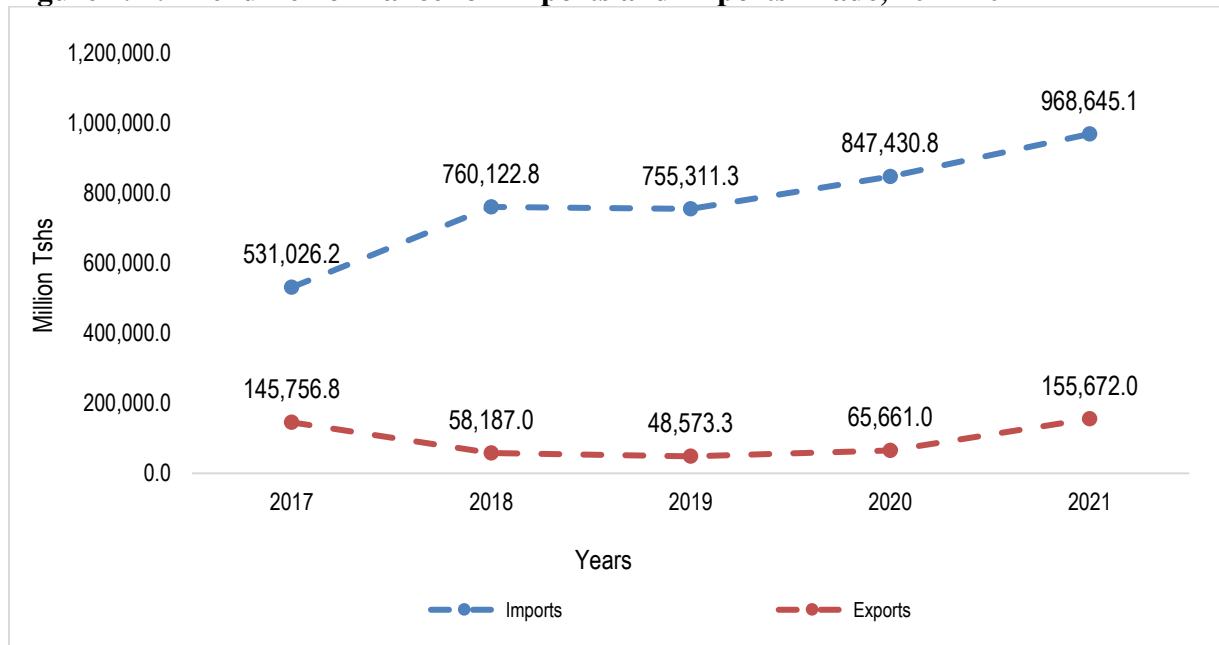
2.3 Trade Performance 2017-2021

Trade Performance from 2017 to 2021 shows the image of external merchandise trade. Imports value has been increasing from 2017 to 2018 (TZS 531,026.2 million to TZS 760,122.8 million),

in a preceding year there is slightly decreased to TZS 755,311.3 million, then it increasing to TZS 968,645.1 million in the year 2021.

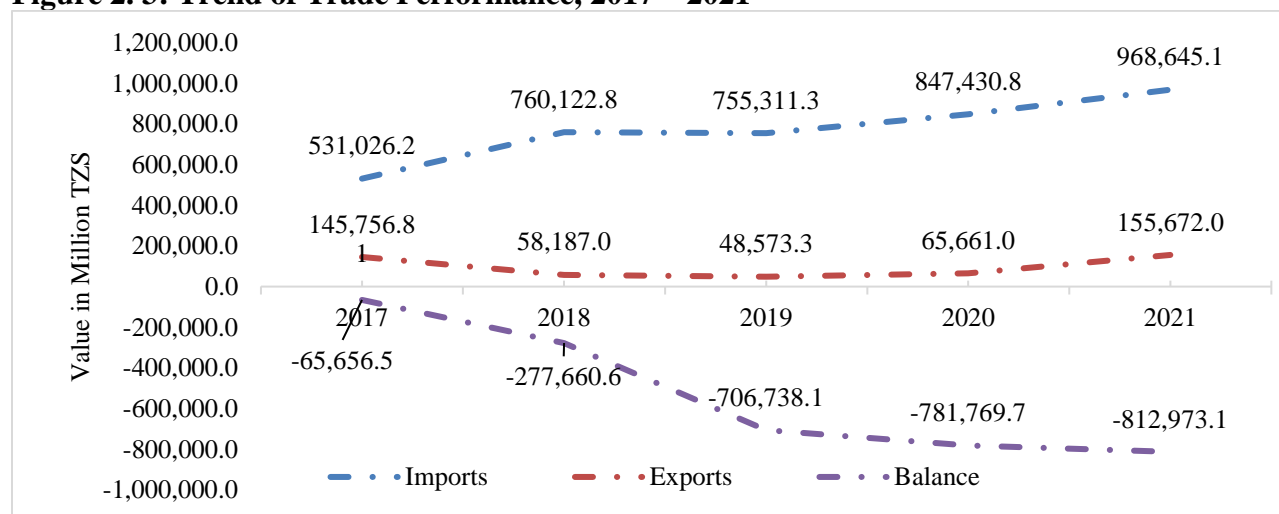
Export value decreased from TZS 145,756.8 million in the year 2017 and attained its minimal value of TZS 48,573.3 million in the year 2019, and then increase again in consecutive two year and reach maximum value in 2021. (Figure 2.2).

The trend shows that trade deficit increases from the year to year (2017 to 2021), import and export line are diverging each other due to the low export and high import values that tend to high trade deficit (Figure 2.3).

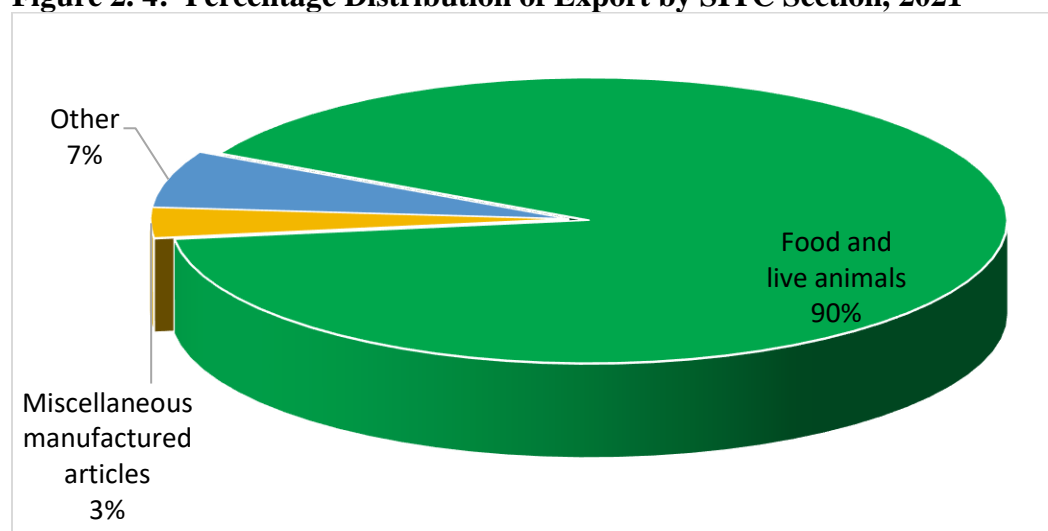
Figure 2. 3: Trend of Trade Performance, 2017 – 2021



2.4 Exports by SITC section

Figure 2.4 shows that in 2021, food and live animals section contributed 90 percent of the total exports followed by Miscellaneous manufactured articles with 3 percent and other sections contributed 7 percent of the total export (Table 2).

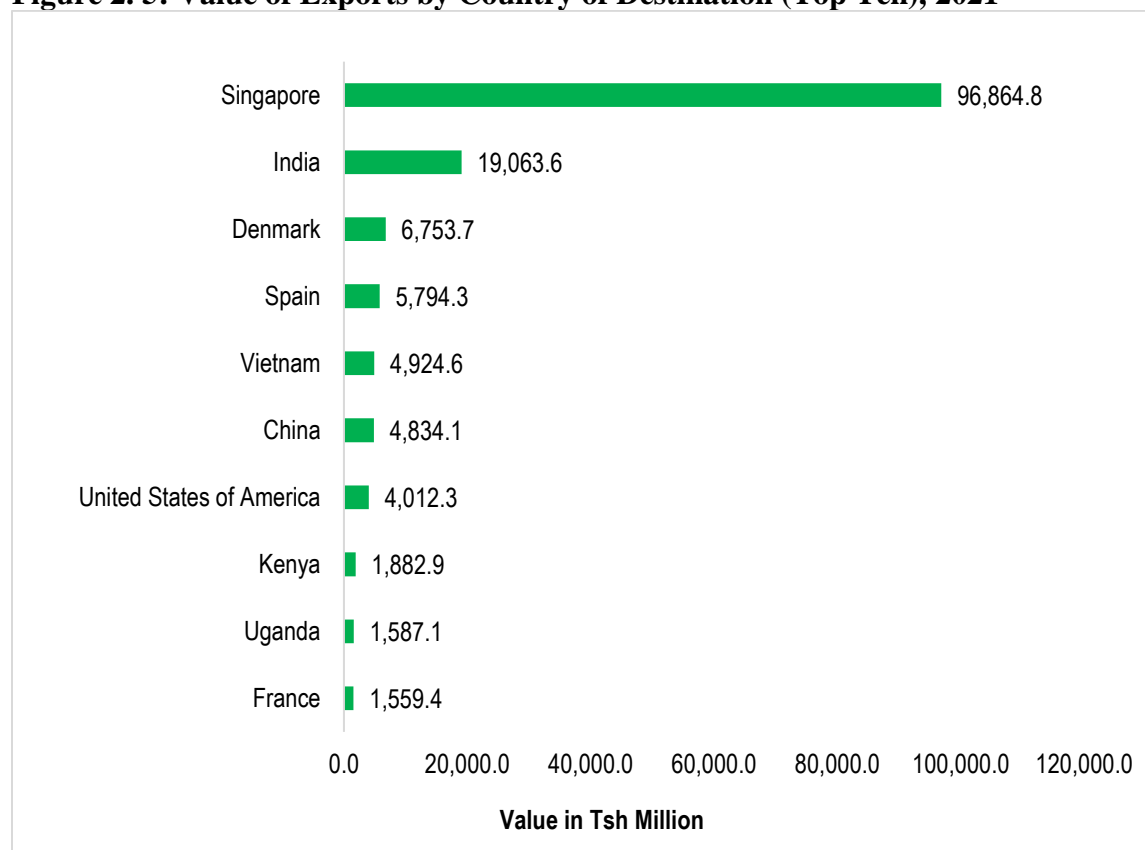
Figure 2. 4: Percentage Distribution of Export by SITC Section, 2021



2.5 Exports by country of destination

In the year 2021, almost 62.2 percent of the total exports (amounted to TZS 96,864.8 million) exported to Singapore. India accounted for 12.2 percent of the total export with the total amount of TZS 19,063.6 million and Denmark accounted for 4.3 percent (TZS 6,753.7 million) of the total export. Cloves are the main goods exported to India and Singapore while seaweeds are the main goods exported to Denmark (figure 2.5 and table 3).

Figure 2. 5: Value of Exports by Country of Destination (Top Ten), 2021

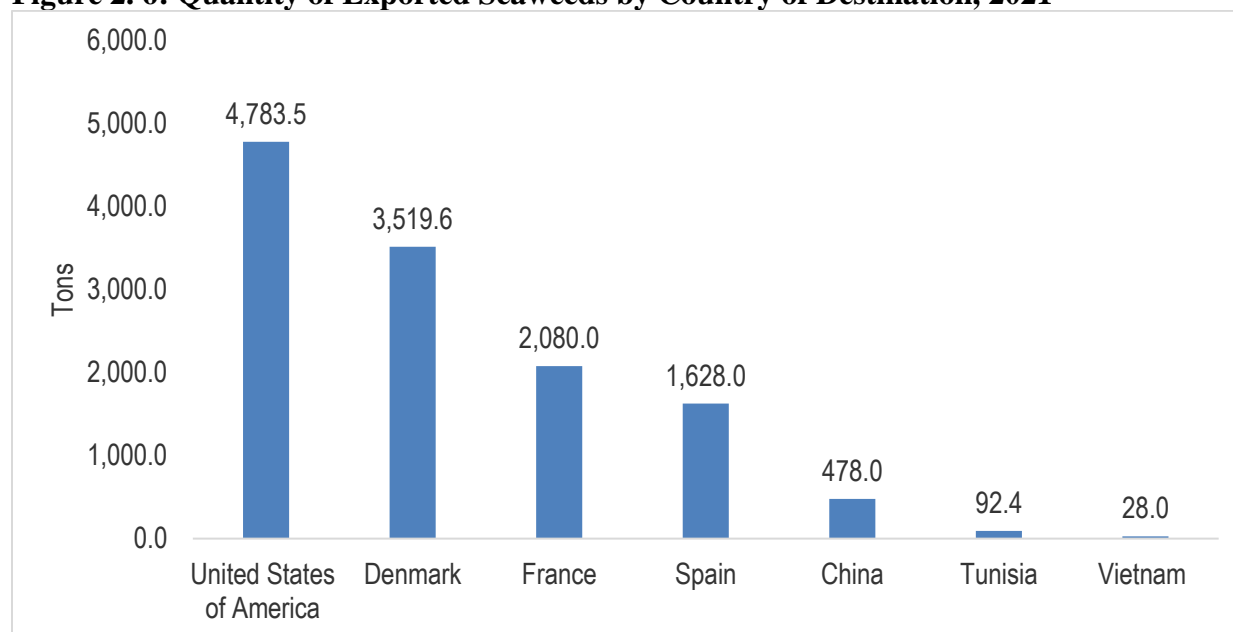


2.6 Export of main crops

Cloves and seaweeds are among the main cash crops cultivated in the country. These crops are exported to different markets worldwide.

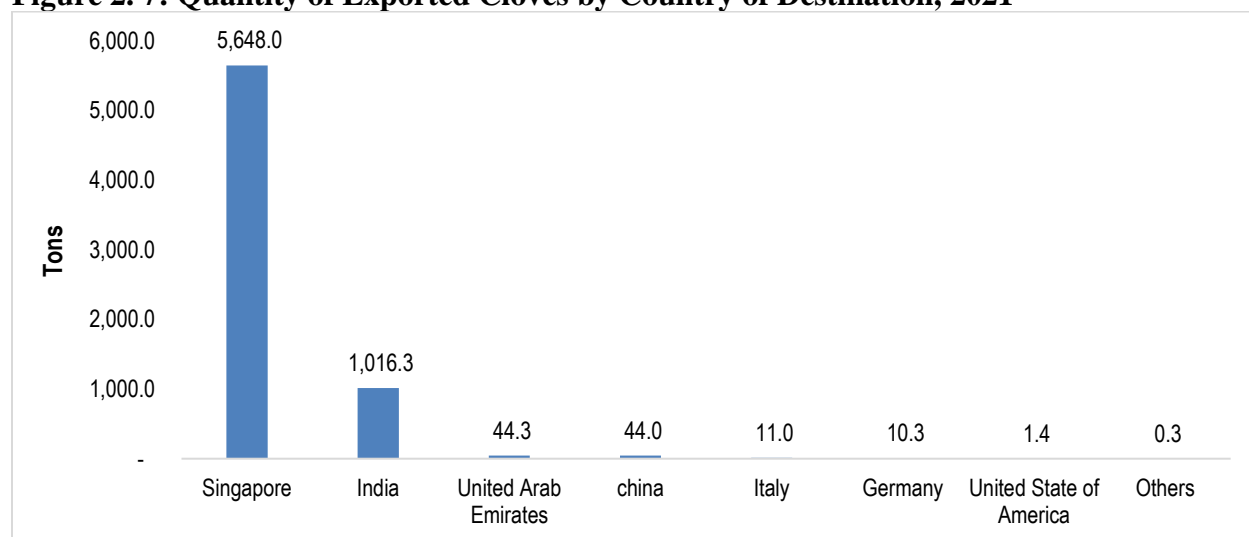
A total of tons 12,611.1 valued TZS 11,960.7 million of Seaweeds were exported in 2021, showing an increase of 9.7 percent of tonnage compared with that of 2020 (table 4). Export of Seaweeds that accounted for 7.7 percent of the total exports value was exported to seven countries whereby U.S.A was the leading country that purchased 4,783.5 tons, followed by Denmark (3,519.6 tons) as shown in figure 2.6.

About 6,775.5 tons of cloves valued at TZS 115,358.7 million were exported in 2021, showing an increase tonnage of 48.2 percent compared to the year 2020. Export of cloves that contributed 74.1 percent of the total export value, exported to Singapore (675.0 tons), India (1,016.3 tons) and other countries as shown in figure 2.7.

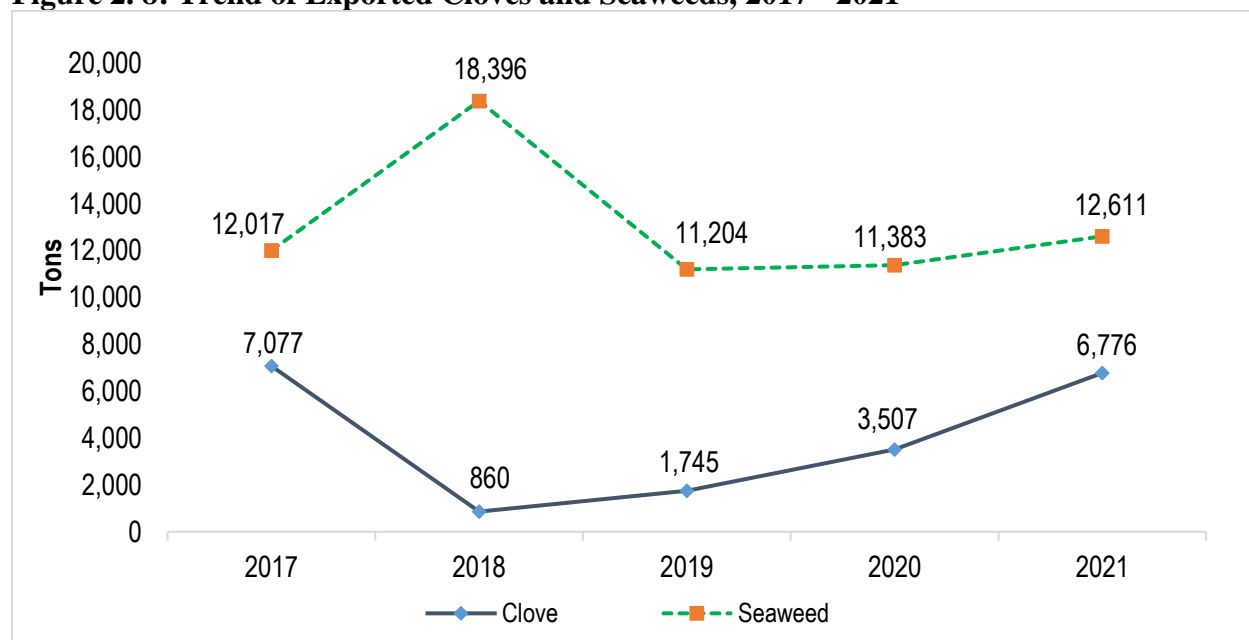
Figure 2. 7: Quantity of Exported Cloves by Country of Destination, 2021



The tons of exported cloves have decreased from 7,077 tons in 2017 to 860 tons in 2018 and then increase again in consecutive three year and reach maximum of 6,776 tons in 2021 (Figure 2.8).

The exported tons of seaweeds reached the maximum point in 2018 (18,396 tons) before sharply dropped for 2019 and a bit increase in 2020 and 2021.

2.7 Imports by SITC Section

The import of Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials for the year 2021 contributed TZS 337,001.5 million, which equivalents to 35 percent of the total import, followed by manufactured goods classified chiefly by material that contributed 17 percent of the total import (Figure 2.9 and table 6).

Figure 2. 9: Percentage Distribution of Import by SITC Section, 2021

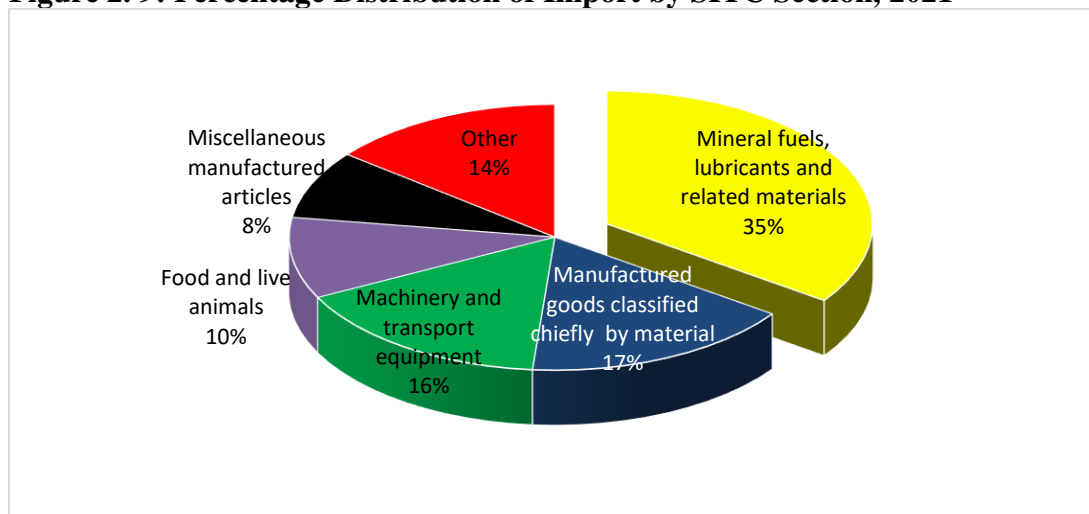
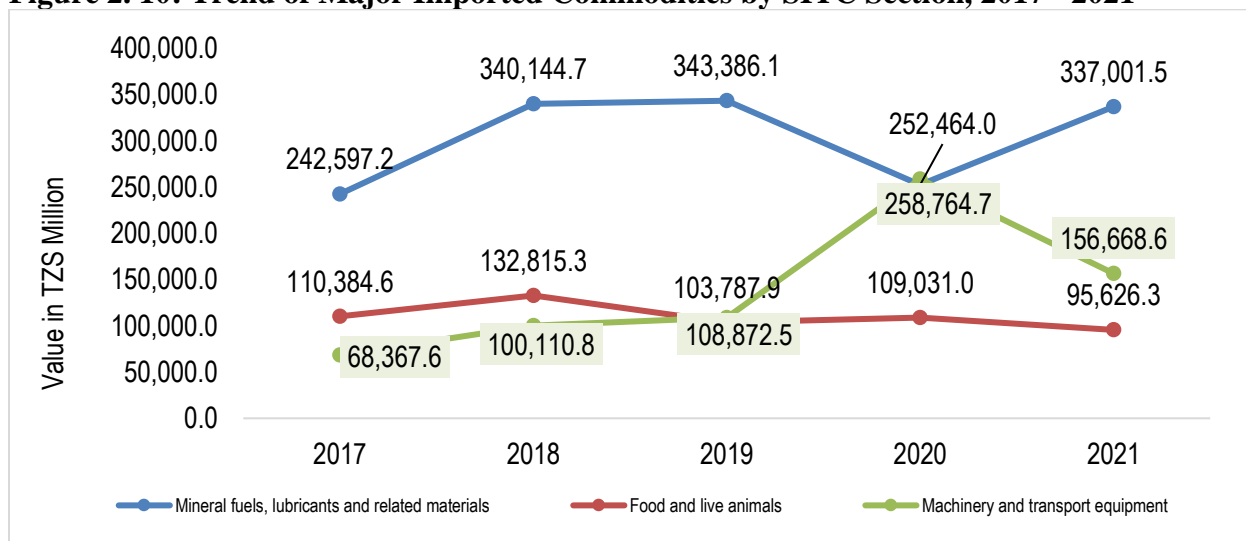


Figure 2.10 shows that imports of mineral oil, lubricants and related equipment are high for every year except in 2020 where goods from Machinery and transport equipment group has a high value. Imports in the Food and live animals' group is fluctuated from year to year.

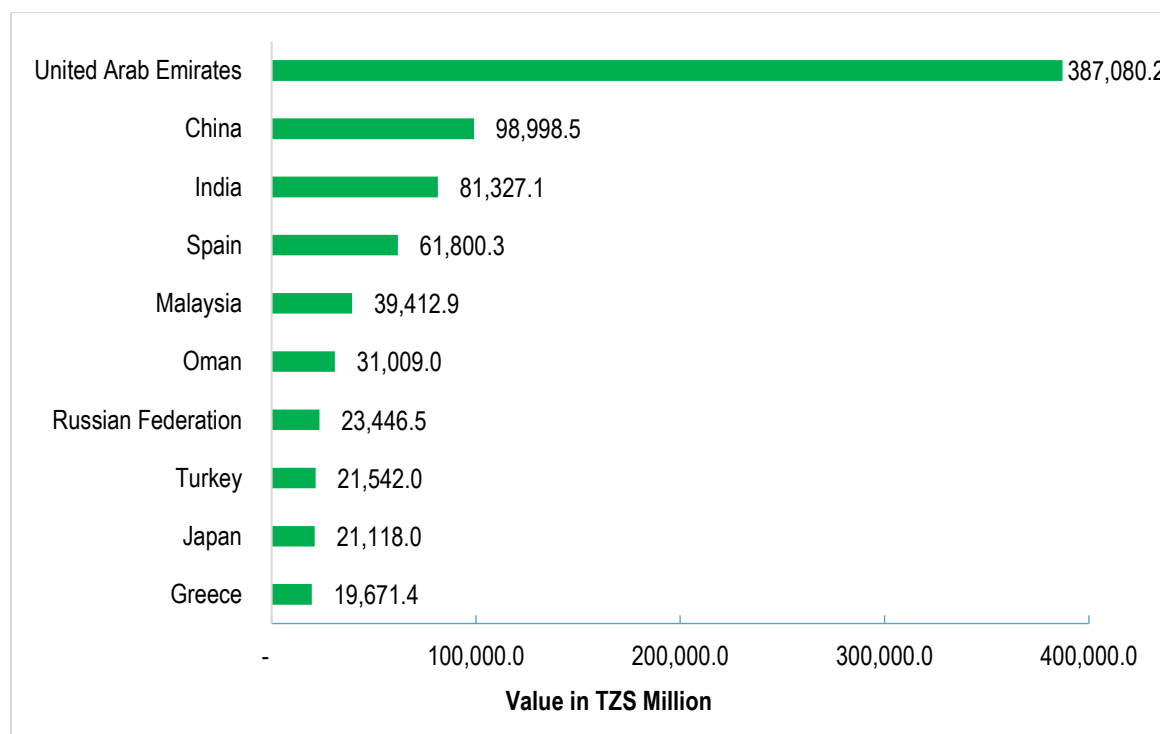
Figure 2. 10: Trend of Major Imported Commodities by SITC Section, 2017 - 2021



2.8 Imports by Country of Origin

Imported goods for the top ten countries in 2021 accounted for TZS 785,405.8 million equivalents to 81.1 percent of the total value of imports (Figure 2.11). The leading partner was UAE with the imported value of TZS 387,080.2 million (40.0 percent of the total imports), followed by China (10.2 percent) and India (8.4 percent). Imports of other countries are shown in the table 7.

2.9 Import by Broad Economic Categories (BEC)

BEC is used mainly for the summarization of data on international trade by large economic classes of commodities. It is also designed to serve as a means of converting external trade data compiled on SITC into end-use categories that are meaningful within the framework of the System of National Accounts (SNA).

There are three basic classes of goods in SNA namely capital goods, intermediate goods and consumption goods. Capital goods include transport equipment's; building and construction material as well as Machinery. Intermediate goods consist of Oil, Industrial goods and raw materials while consumption goods contain food and food stuffs; and all other consumer goods.

For the year 2021, 24 percent (worth TZS 231,428.2 million) of the total imported goods were Capital goods of which 26.4 percent contributed by transport equipment, 32.3 percent were building and construction material and 41.3 percent were machinery. Intermediary goods contributed 49 percent (TZS 477,298.7 million) of which 70.6 contributed by petroleum products and 29.4 percent were industrial raw materials. Consumer goods accounted for 27 percent (TZS 259,918.2 million) whereby 62.9 percent were food and food stuffs, while other consumer goods 37.7 percent (Figure 2.12 and table 8.).

Figure 2. 12: Percentage Distribution of Import by BEC, 2021

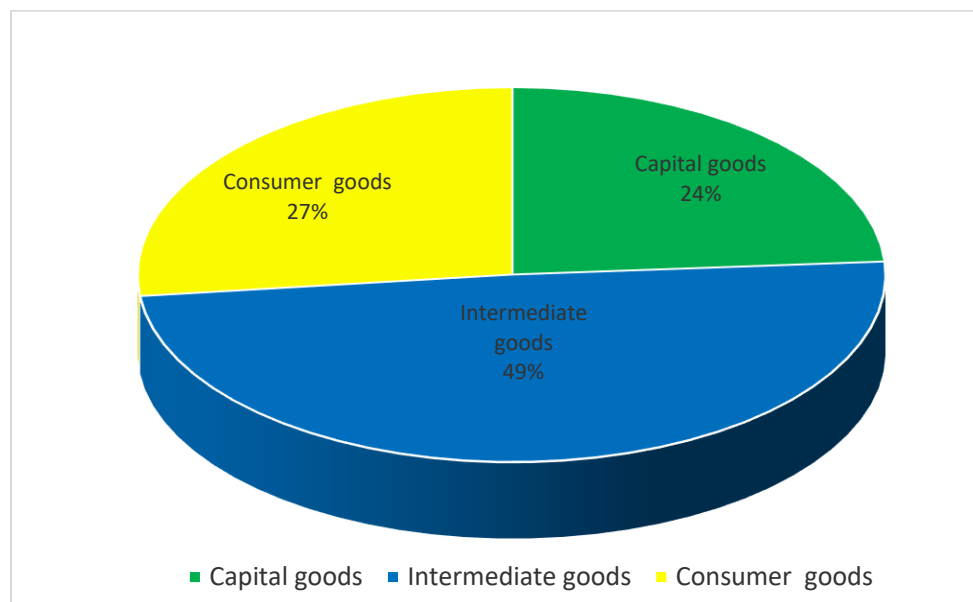
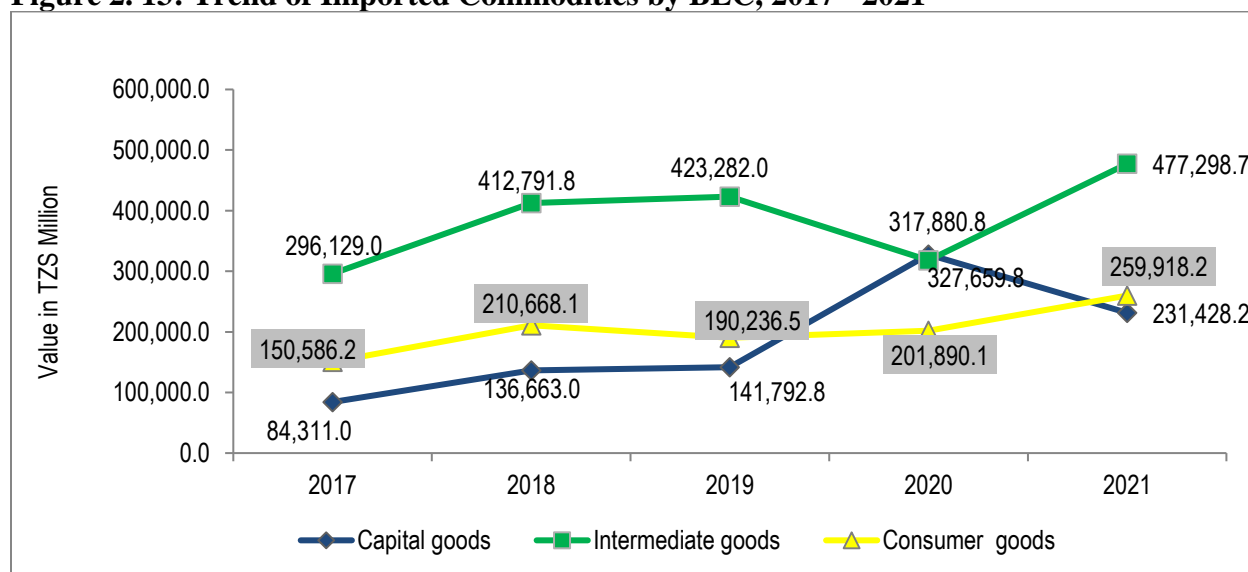


Figure 2.13 and table 8 shows import of capital goods increased from TZS 84,311.0 million in 2017 to TZS 327,659.8 million in 2020 and drop to 231,428.2 in 2021. The import of intermediate goods increased from TZS 317,880.8 in 2020 to TZS 477,298.7 in 2021. Trend shows import of consumer goods increased from 2017 to 2018 and decreased in 2019, then increased in 2020 and 2021 (TZS 201,890.1 million and TZS 259,918.2 million respectively).

2.10 Import of Petroleum Product

In 2021, the total import value of petroleum product amounted to TZS 330,086.2 million, of which petrol contributed 58.6 percent (TZS 193,438.7 million) of total petroleum product value (Table 15 and Figure 2.14) and kerosene contributed 2.7 percent (TZS 8,790.3 million).

Figure 2. 14: Import Value of Petroleum Product by Types, 2021

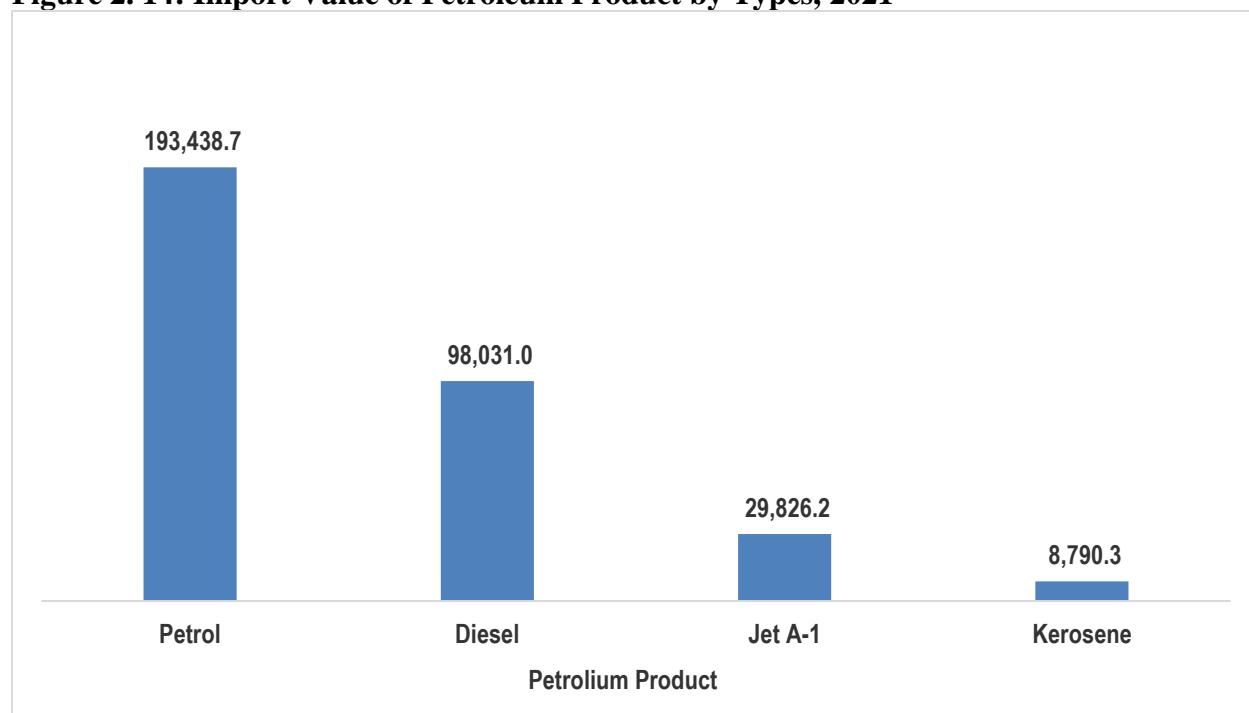
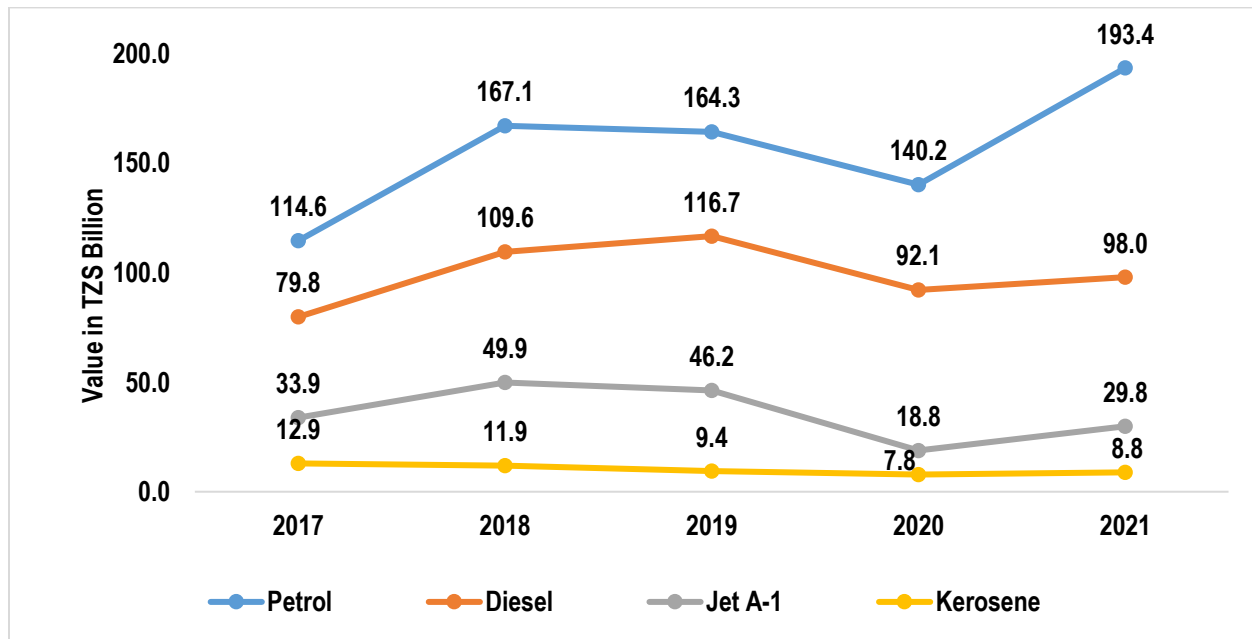


Figure 2.15 and table 15 shows that import of Petroleum Products in year 2021 increased compared to preceding years. Import of petrol reach to maximal of TZS 167.1 billion in 2018 than decreasing in the year 2019 and 2020 and increase again in 2021. The same pattern applied in diesel, Jet A-1 and kerosene.

Figure 2. 15: Trend of Imported Value of Petroleum Product 2017-2021



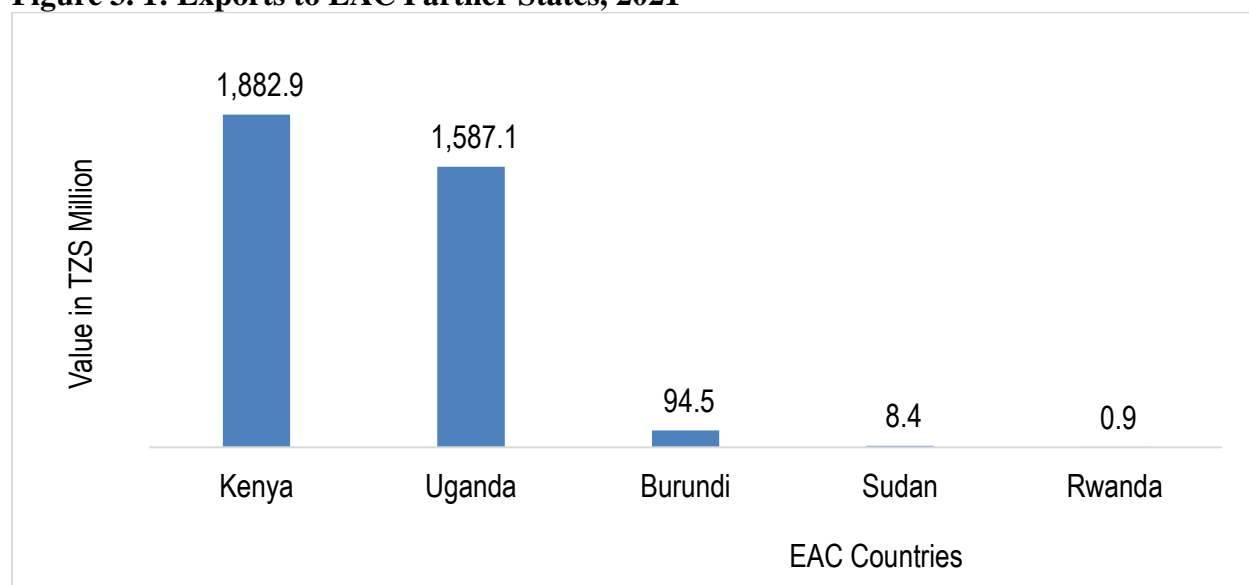
3. Trade with EAC and SADC Partners

3.1 Trade with EAC Countries

East African Community (EAC) comprises of six (6) countries namely Tanzania, Kenya, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi and South Sudan. Zanzibar as part of The United Republic of Tanzania has import and export trade partnership from these countries.

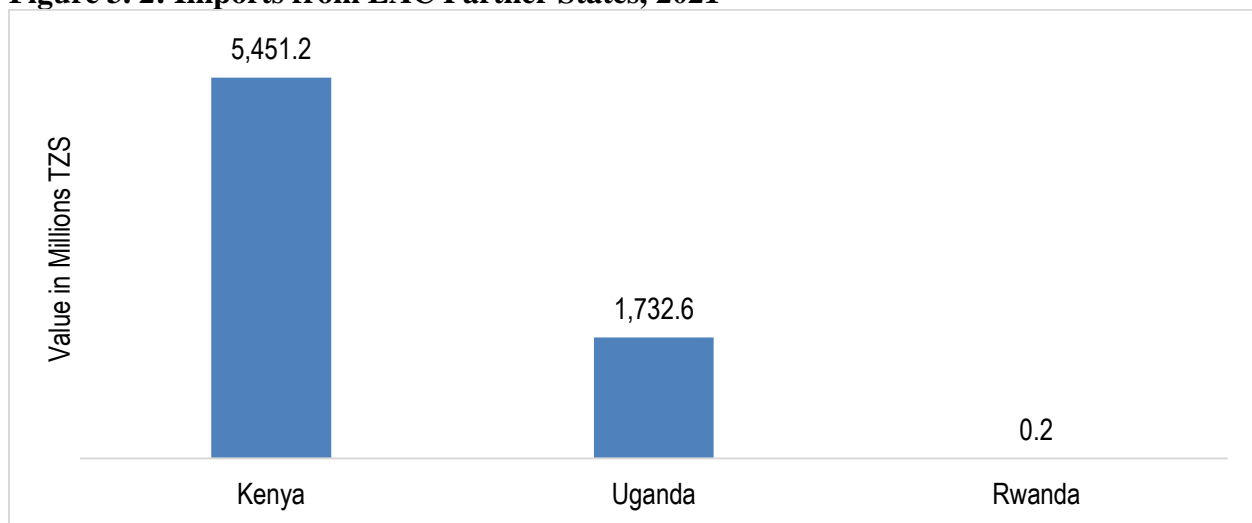
In 2021, out of TZS 155,672.0 million of total export, only TZS 3,573.8 million was the value for the exported goods (2.3 percent) to EAC countries that is higher by more than hundred percent compared to that recorded in previous year (Table 11). Kenya was the leading country that purchased goods that worth TZS 1,882.9 million (Figure 3.1). Major commodities that contribute high exported value to Kenya was Kitenge and Khanga

Figure 3. 1: Exports to EAC Partner States, 2021



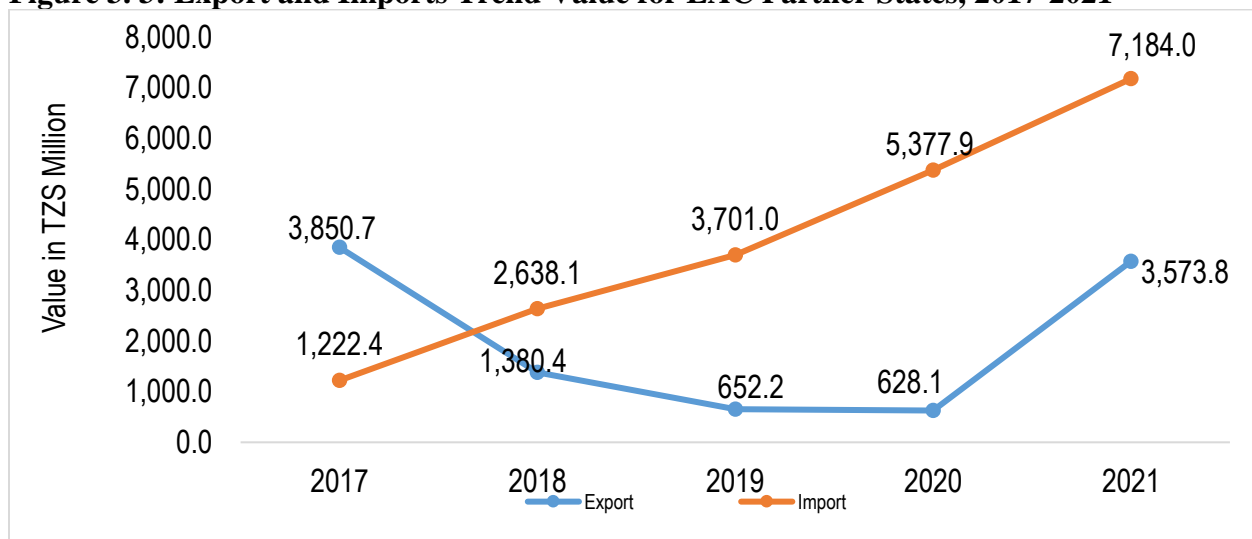
In 2021, out of TZS 968,645.1 million of total import, only TZS 7,184.0 million was the value of imported goods (0.7 percent) from EAC countries. Kenya was the leading among the EAC countries that sold goods to Zanzibar which worth TZS 5,451.2 million in year 2021. Major commodities imported from Kenya was cement (Figure 3.2 and Table 12).

The performances of export of goods to EAC decreased from TZS 3,850.7 million in the year 2017 to TZS 628.1 million in the year 2020 and rise to 3,573.8 million in the year 2021. Imports value of goods has been increasing from 2017 to 2021 (TZS 1,222.4 million to TZS 7,184.0 million) (Figure 3. 3).

Figure 3. 3: Export and Imports Trend Value for EAC Partner States, 2017-2021



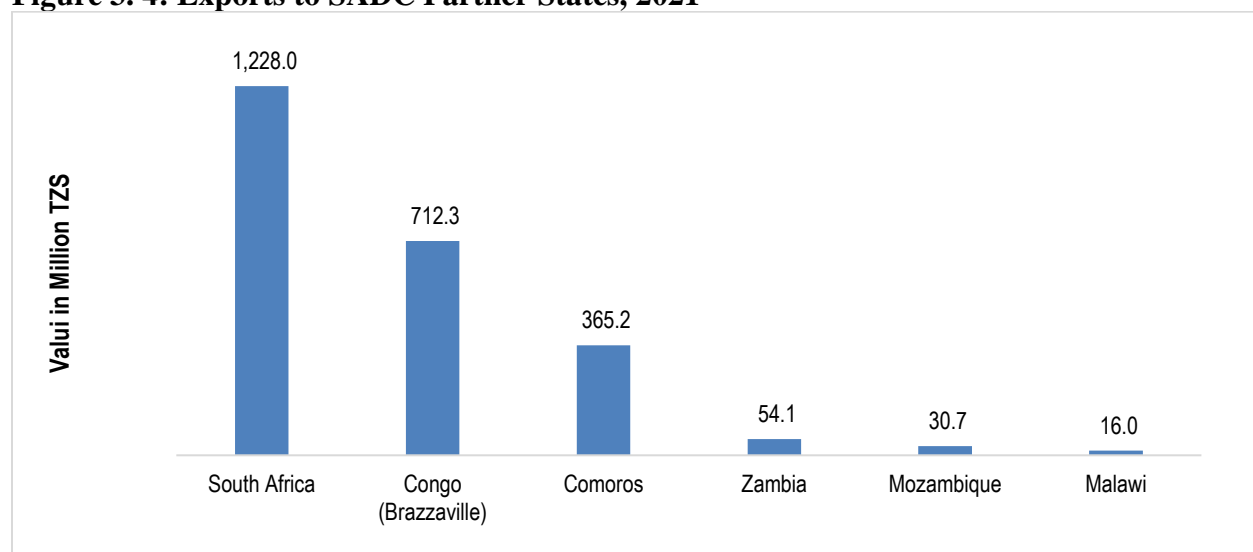
3.2 Trade with SADC Countries

Southern Africa Development Community (SADC) comprises of 16 countries namely Angola, Botswana, Comoros, Democratic Republic of Congo, Eswatini, Lesotho, Madagascar, Malawi, Mauritius, Mozambique, Namibia, Seychelles, South Africa, Tanzania, Zambia and Zimbabwe.

Zanzibar as part of The United Republic of Tanzania has import and export partner to these countries.

In 2021, out of TZS 155,672.0 million of total export, only TZS 2,406.4 million was value of the exported goods (1.5 percent) to SADC partner. South Africa purchased goods that worth TZS 1,228.0 million. Commodities exported to South Africa was assorted food stuff and clothes (Figure 3. 4 and Table 13).

In 2021, out of TZS 968,645.1 million of total import, only TZS 7,822.6 million worth of goods (0.8 percent) was imported from SADC countries. South Africa was the leading country that accounted for TZS 6,883.6 million. Major commodities imported from South Africa were wooden poles and prepayment meter (Figure 3.5 and Table 14 in the Annex).

Figure 3. 5: Import from Selected SADC Partner States, 2021

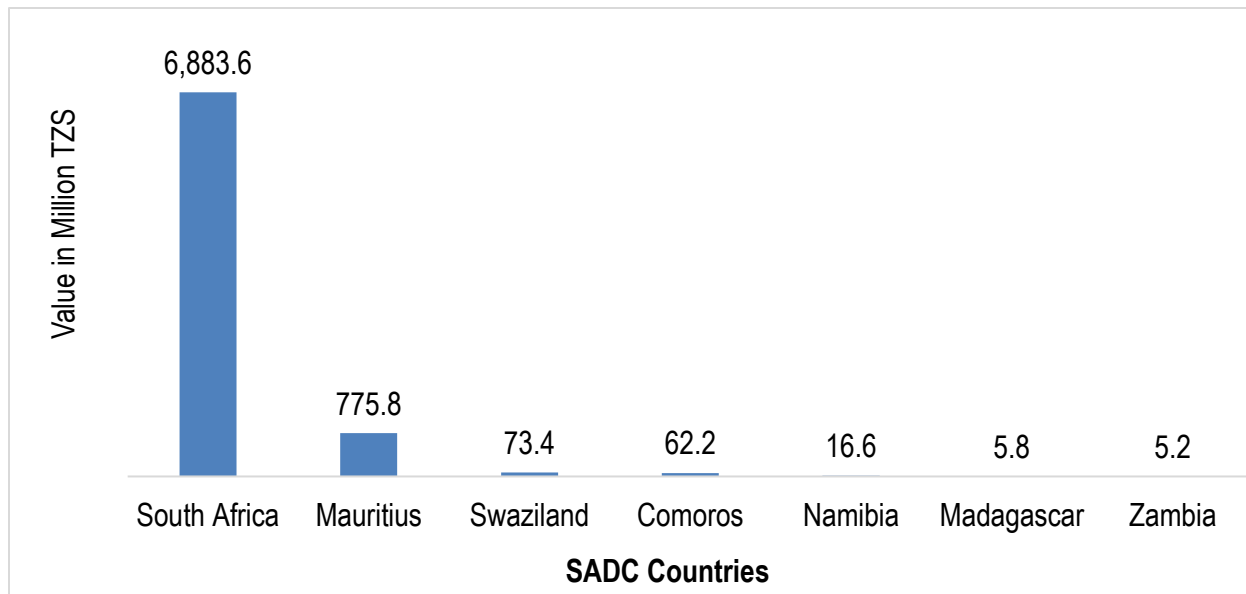
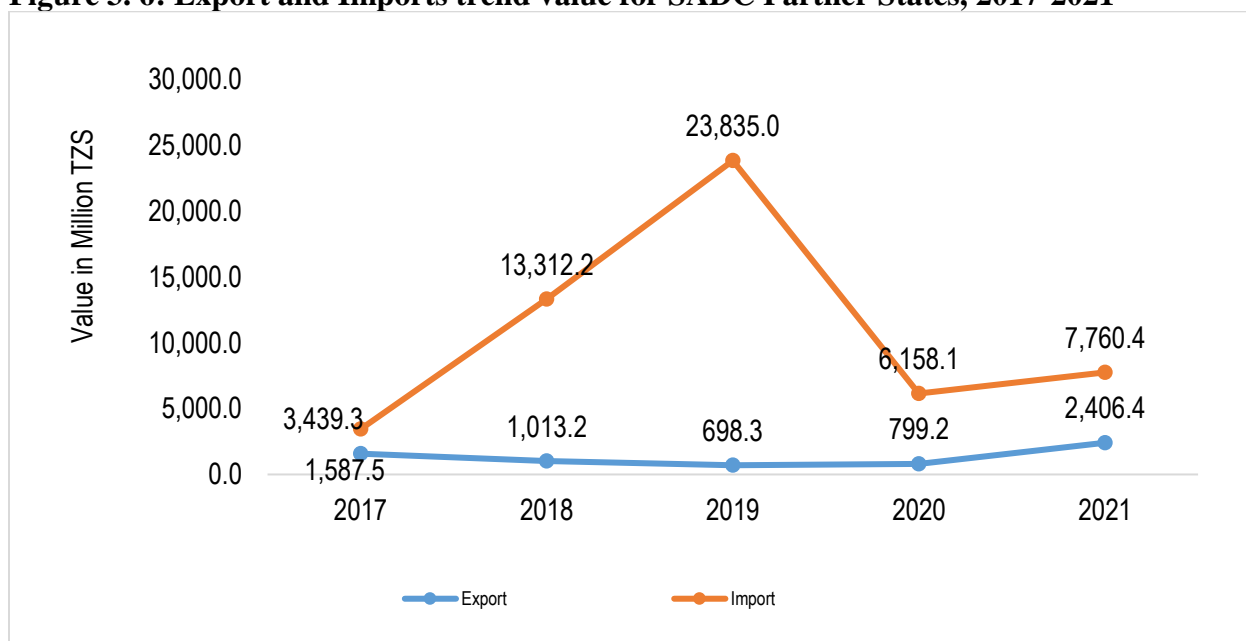


Figure 3.6 shows that the import value from SADC countries is higher than the export value to SADC countries for all years. Trend of export value to SADC countries tend to decrease from 2017 to 2019 and then rise from 2020 to 2021, while import value from SADC countries trend has been increase from 2017 to 2019, then dropped in year 2020, and increased again in 2021.
