

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#### A. LAND AND CLIMATE

#### A.1 Land


Zanzibar Islands lies in the Indian Ocean off the coast of Eastern Africa. It is situated about 30 kilometers from the mainland of East Africa. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometers; of which 1,666 square kilometers are for Unguja island and 988 square kilometers are for Pemba. There are also a habitat and un-habitat islets.

Map A.1. 1: Map of Zanzibar by Districts






#### A.2 Climate

The Zanzibar climate is warm and humid (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely *Masika*, the main rainy season, March to May; *Kipupwe*, the cold season, June to August; *Vuli*, short rainy season September to November; and *Kaskazi*, the hot season December to March. The average highest peak of rain in 2021 was recorded in December for Unguja (289.7 mm) while in Pemba was recorded in April (395.0 mm) as shown in table A.2.1 below. The islands experienced high humidity between 73 and 90 percent in 2021 as shown in table A.2.3.



#### B. ADMINISTRATION AND POLITICS

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar was formed on 12th January, 1964 under the first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, Zanzibar and Tanganyika, then united on 26<sup>th</sup> April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System (except for the Court of Appeal).

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its Eighth Phase and His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi governs it since November 2020. The Government is operating through the Government of National Unity after the changes in the Zanzibar Constitution in 2010. This allowed the opposition party to be included in the Government. Previous Presidents were; The Late, Hon. Abeid Amani Karume (1964 – 1972); The Late, Hon. Aboud Jumbe Mwinyi (1972 – 1984); Hon. Ali Hassan Mwinyi (1984 – 1985); The Late, Hon. Idrisa Abdulwakil (1985 – 1990); Hon. Dr. Salmin Amour Juma (1990 – 2000); Hon. Dr. Amani Abeid Amani Karume (2000 – 2010); and Hon. Dr. Ali Mohamed Shein (2010 - 2020).

#### **B.1** Administration

As at December 2021, the country had 16 members in the Revolutionary Council (which is also the Council of Ministers – Cabinet). The House of Representatives had 79 members of whom 50 were elected from Constituencies, seven (7) are nominated by the President, and 18 are special seats for women, one Attorney General, Speaker and One Secretary.

#### C POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS

Population is the totality of all units of interest in a study or investigation at a given time and a given area. Population studies analyze the relationships between economic, social, cultural and biological processes influencing populations.

#### **C.1** Population Characteristics

The population of Zanzibar according to the 2012 Tanzania Population and Housing Census was 1,303,569; growing at a rate of 2.8 percent per annum. The sex ratio of the population was 95, meaning that for every 100 females there are only 95 males.

Population projections are useful in development planning, local administration, research, learning institutions and private business enterprises. The projected population for the year 2021 is 1,671,598 out of which male is 814,159 and female is 857,439 (Table C.1.4).

The population density for Zanzibar increased from 530 person/sq.km in 2012 to 603 person/sq.km in 2019, whereby Unguja and Pemba having 669 person/sq.km and 503 person/sq.km, respectively. The average household size is 5.1 as shown in table C.1.5, indicating predominance of large households, except for Kusini Unguja with 4.4 household size.

The spatial composition suggests that 68.8 percent of the population is on Unguja Island. The proportion of population in Pemba Island has gradually declined, from 46.3 percent in 1967 to 31.2 percent in 2012; while that of Mjini Magharibi – the center of attraction from all Zanzibar administrative regions and parts of Eastern Africa – has been steadily growing. It is estimated that half of the Zanzibar population currently live in Mjini Magharibi.

#### D. SOCIAL STATISTICS

Social statistics comprise data series from various social sectors including education, health, crime, and social welfare (people with disability, orphans' care, and old people care).

#### D.1 Education

After the Zanzibar Revolution in 1964, the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar announced Free Education for All (EFA) for Zanzibar citizens where a number of new schools were initiated both in rural and urban areas for Unguja and Pemba. Major changes in the curriculum, organization and administration of educational institutions have been introduced so that education for the students serves the needs of the country, encouraging self-reliance and the development of science, technology, and innovation.

The Government ensures education is provided to all equitable sex for hesitance providing education of science subjected to all including women. The information presented comes as secondary data collected by the MoEVT. The information collected includes the number of schools, students' enrolment by grade, performance in examination results and the number of teachers, etc.

A total of 91,074 pupils were enrolled in pre-primary schools in 2021; of whom 32,026 pupils (35.2 percent) were in private schools and 59,048 pupils (64.8 percent) in government schools (Table D.1.5). The number of pupils enrolled in primary schools was increased by 18,328 pupils from 313,097 pupils in 2020 to 331,425 pupils in 2021(Table D.1.8).

The Zanzibar Higher Education Loan Board (ZHELB) provided loans to 4,515 students in the academic year 2021/2022; of whom 1,526 students were the newly selected applicants. The number of new applicants who received loans from ZHELB in this academic year declined from 1,984 applicants in 2020/2021 to 1,526 applicants in 2021/2022, table D.1.22.

#### **D.2** Health Statistics

The Ministry of Health Social Welfare, Gender, Elders and Children, Zanzibar, provides health service through primary, secondary and tertiary level of health facilities. In terms of primary level health service provided through (PHCUs and PHCU+) with primary health care centers. Regarding the secondary levels this include District and Regional hospital and at Tertiary level the health service is available at referral and special hospital.

The number of health facilities by level, type and ownership for the period 2013 to 2021. The number of public health facilities specifically (PHCU) increased from 105 facilities in 2013 to 128 facilities in 2021. The private health facilities increased from 70 dispensaries in 2013 to 125 dispensaries in 2021. Referral hospital and specially hospital remain the same, (Table D2.1)

The number of health personnel increased to some of the cadres. The number of medical doctors rose up to 310 doctors in 2021 from 270 doctors in 2020. Similarly, the number of clinical officers increased from 327 clinical officers in 2020 to 371 clinical officers in 2021. There is a slight difference in the number of dentists from 2020 to 2021 (Table D.2.3).

A total of 52,092 live births were recorded in all health facilities in 2021 whereby Mjini district accounted for 23,013 live births (Table D.2.4).

A total of 2,140,704 out-patient visits were made in the year 2021. The number of visiting out-patients reported by the government health facility was 1,598,685 and 290,403 visiting reported in a private health facility. In addition, Parastatal and faith-based facilities reported to have 225,907 and 27,709 visiting outpatients respectively. (**Table D.2.6**).

# **D.3 Drugs Statistics**

In 2021 the revolutionary Government of Zanzibar through various stakeholders and the Drug Control and Enforcement Authority continue to intensify their partnerships and efforts to achieve the government's goals in the war on drugs to eradicate drug abuse in the country.

Drugs are chemicals that when they enter the body affect the user's brain and cause him or her to have actions, feelings, thoughts and appearance that are different from the expectations of society. These drugs enter the body in three main ways which are the way you drink, eat and smoke.

There are a total of six male sober houses recorded in 2020 where four of them are located in Unguja and two in Pemba. The number of residents in sober houses are decreased from 401 residents in 2019 to 349 residents in 2020 equivalent to 13 percent, where large number of residents in sober house fall at the age group 26-35 and 36-45 accounted for 148 residents in sober houses and 95 residents in sober houses respectively (**Table D.3.2**).

#### **D.4** Crime Statistics

Crime is an action or omission which constitutes an offense and is punishable by law. Crime is usually secretive by nature, rendering their measurements difficult, moreover criminal and traffic incidents are divided into two parts, major and minor. Crime statistics attempt to provide statistical measures of crimes in society. Several approaches are used to capture crime statistics, including household, hospital and insurance records. Data are compiled by Police and similar law enforcement agencies. Typically, official crime statistics are from law enforcement agencies, although some offenses are likely to go unreported to the Police.

## **Recorded Road Accidents**

Table D.4.1 shows that the total number of accidents recorded in 2021 were 209, of which Unguja was 165 accidents and Pemba was 44 accidents. A total number of victims reported were 444; of which 168 victims were dead and 276 victims were injured. The highest number of persons who died during the accidents were Cyclists (87 cyclists), followed by Pedestrians (53 Pedestrians) (Table D.4.3). These two accounted for 83.3 percent of all persons who died in the accidents.

The traffic offenses have been decreasing with an average of 29.5 percent annual growth rate in the last five years, and marks an increase of 3.1 percent in 2021 compared with the previous year. Non-Compliance with guidelines and traffic regulations is sighted as the main driver to offenses (3,682 offenses) (Table D.4.4).

## **Crime Cases**

Table D.4.6 shows that the total number of cases reported were 6,195, of which the minor cases were 3,615 (58.4 percent) and serious cases were 2,580 (41.6 percent). The number of serious cases decreased by 19.6 percent (2,580 cases) in 2021 from 3,209 in 2020; Magharibi "B" Mjini district reported the highest number of total cases (1,244) followed by Mjini district (988), while Kaskazini 'A' and Micheweni districts reported the least (258 and 246 respectively).

# Offenses against Person

The total number of offences against persons were 2,079 which increased by 44.6 percent compared to in 2020 (1,438 reported), this was highly attributed reported cases of assault (45.1 percent) rape to girls (27.1 percent) and Sodomize (8.5 percent) (Table D.4.10).

## **Prison Statistics**

The total number of reported remands in 2021 were 1,754, of which 97.1 percent were male (1,703 male). Most males (48.6 percent) are in the age range of 18-30 years old (Table D.4.8).

# **Juvenile Court Cases**

Table D.4.11 shows that the number of Criminal Cases at the Juvenile were 154 filled case, of which 60 (39.0 percent) had already decided and 94 Cases were pending before the Court. The number of filed cases increased from 68 in 2020 (126.5 percent) to 154 in 2021.

## **D.5** Gender Statistics

Violence against women and children is a grave violation of human rights. Its impact ranges from immediate to long-term multiple physical, sexual and mental consequences for women and children, including death.

A total of 1,222 cruelty and gender based violence incidents were reported in 2021 that involved 154 women victims (12.6 percent) and 1,068 children victims (87.4 percent), among the children victims, 846 (79.2 percent) were girls and 222 (20.8 percent) were boys (**Table D.5.2**)

Compared with the previous year, the number of incidences decreased from 1,363 incidences reported in 2020 to 1,222 reported in 2021, which indicates decreased by 10.3 percent (**Table D.5.1**).

The highest number of incidences reported in 2021 was in Magharibi "A" district with 290 incidences (23.7 percent), followed by Magharibi 'B' district with 182 incidences (14.9 percent). Among all violence reported in Zanzibar, rape offences seemed to be the biggest problem 621 offences (50.8 percent) compared to other offences. Magharibi "A" district have a large number of rape offences counted for 112 (18.0 percent) followed by Magharibi 'B' district was 79 (12.7 percent) and the least number of rape offence was found in Kusini district was 23 incidences (3.7 percent) (**Table D.5.3**).

Children aged 15-17 reported to have the highest number of incidences with 558 victims (52.2 percent) compared with other age groups (**Table D.5.5**).

Many incidences of cruelty and gender based violence occurred at other places, 641 (52.5 percent) compared with home (**Table D.5.7**). More than one quarter 527 (43.1 percent) of the total incidences was under investigation, 333 incidences (27.3 percent) was in Court, 261 incidences (21.4 percent) was closed to the police by difference reasons—and remaining incidences with other action to be taken (**Table D.5.8**).

### **D.6** Social Welfare

This section presents the information about the children and those old people that are living at different cared center in Zanzibar. The information disaggregated by gender. In 2021 the number of children cared increased up to 337 compared to 258 children cared in 2020. The sex composition of orphans fluctuates between years; for the year 2019, there were more boys (205) compared to girls (132) (Table D.6.2). The number of old people cared has decreased from 134 in 2020 to 71 in 2021. This is also similar to either sex, except that there slightly of more males compared with females. For the year 2021, there were 71old people cared in elderly, homes which 29 were females and 42 are males (Table D.6.2).

# **D.7** Sports Statistics

The information of the Sport Statistics is under control of Zanzibar National Sport Council (ZNSC). The Zanzibar National Sport Council (ZNSC) has a role to stimulate the implementation of sporting policies in Zanzibar, to ensure that all sporting clubs and groups follow the laid down policies, constitutions, rules, laws, regulation and procedures on each game and other sporting activities; has also a role to corporate with other appropriate authority in administering registration of playing ground in order to prevent the trace-passing of those grounds; to develop and maintain in accordance with the registration of sport regulations and any direction as may be deemed fit.

The Council also has to ensure that all Sports Associations shall establish and formulate the reconciliatory and appellate Committee in their Sport Associations at all levels and also has a power to participate in all meetings concerning Sports Association and local at international level. The information covers; the number of sports clubs registered, number of football teams by division and number of referees by type of sports.

## E. LABOUR STATISTICS

Office of the Chief Government Statistician collects data on labour Statistics mainly from Formal Sector Employment and Earnings Survey (FSEES) and the Integrated Labour Force Survey (ILFS). FSEES is an annual establishment based survey, usually undertaken in the month of June of every year to all Government, Government Parastatals and registered Private Institutions. The main objective of the FSEES is to provide information on employment and earnings to be used for planning, policy formulation and decision making processes. Collected information on the number of employees and their salaries refers to the month of June only, while cash earnings cover the whole financial year (July – June).

ILFS is a household based survey undertaken after every five years. The survey runs for the whole year, partly to take care of the seasonality effect on employment. ILFS comprises four survey modules: Labour Force General, Informal Sector, Time Use and Child Labour.

# **E.2** Employment and Earnings

Total employment for all sectors (i.e. Government, Government Parastatals and Private) decreased by 0.7 percent from 67,095 employees in 2020/2021 to 66,656 employees in 2019/2020. The total wage bill in 2020/2021 was TZS 583,680 million, of which TZS 454,348 millions of total wage bill was used for payment of salaries and TZS 22,074 million for free ration (Table E.2.1).

For the year 2020/2021, employment of Government sector was 38,746, of which female employees (22,556) exceeded male employees (16,190). Education (17,171 employees) and Public administration and defense; compulsory social security (10,194 employees) industries had the highest number of female employees (Table E.2.2). The wage bill for the Government sector in 2020/2021 used for salary payments was TZS 246,901 million while TZS 9,471 million were payments for free ration. Education services—spent TZS 108,643 million as wage bill for salary.

In 2020/2021 Government Parastatals employed 7,002 persons, of whom 4,526 were males. Transportation and storage industry had the highest number of employees (1,974) compared with other industries (Table E.2.3).

The wage bill for all Private institutions stood at TZS 178,506 million, of which TZS 140,228 million were for salary payments, TZS 9,632 million for free rations and TZS 28,646 million as payments for other benefits paid to employees. Accommodation and food services industry shared TZS 98,127 million of the Private wage bill.

## F. MACRO ECONOMIC STATISTICS

### **F.1** National Accounts

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is defined as the monetary value of all finished goods and services produced within an economic territory in a specific period of time (usually one year). It is the most important indicator in the System of National Accounts (SNA) used to gauge the health of a country's economy. The Production, Expenditure and Income methods are the approaches to its measurements; results of which are presented in current (years) or constant (base year or real) prices. The Office of the Chief Government Statistician has adopted the Production approach to the compilation of Zanzibar's GDP estimates.

For the year 2021, GDP at current prices stood at TZS 4,632.7 billion, interpreting the per capita income of TZS 2,704,000. At constant 2015 prices, the GDP increased to TZS 3,275.3 billion compared with TZS 3,116.0 billion observed in the previous year. This indicates that Zanzibar's economy for the year 2021 grew by 5.1 percent (Table F.1.1).

The observed growth in the economy was a result of recovering of the economy caused by increased of Trade and Repairs (14.9 percent), Finance and Insurance (6.6 percent) and also increased by number of tourists from 260,644 in 2020 to 394,185 in 2021 which resulted to increase Accommodation and Food Services (from negative 12.7 percent in 2020 to 6.6 percent in 2021); and the service sector also showed a significant growth of 6.8 percent (Table F.1.5).




Figure F.1. 1: GDP at Constant Price Growth Rates, 2012–2021




Figure F.1. 2: GDP Percentage Shares by Sector, 2021

### **F.2** Government Finance Statistics

### Introduction

The section represents a time series on Government Finance Statistics (GFS) which contains the detailed data on revenue and expenses as well as aggregate data on transactions in assets and liabilities of the Central Government. GFS data are compiled according to the framework of the 2014 GFS Manual using modified cash basis of recording. GFS data are used for the computation of a country's macroeconomic indicators that provide several summary measures of Government fiscal performance.

The presentation of GFS data represents a significant step forward in Zanzibar's effort to improve the comprehensiveness and transparency of the government finance statistics (GFS). To facilitate international comparisons, the GFSM 2014 emphasizes the presentation of Government fiscal data that should be uniformly and consistent with the System of National Accounts, 2008.

### **Financial Resources**

During the financial year 2020/21 the total resources collected reached TZS 957.5 billion which is low for 4.4 percent compared to TZS 1,001.2 billion in the previous year. The decrease of total resources was due to decreased of domestic revenue for the year 2020/21 by 8.5 percent from TZS 807.7 billion in 2019/20 to TZS 739.1 billion. Despite the domestic revenue decreased, the contribution of tax collection is equivalent to two-third of the total resources. Moreover, the contribution of non–tax revenue has no significant changes from TZS 132.5 billion in 2019/20 to TZS 115.6 billion in 2020/21. Of the external resources, the amount of loan (domestic and external) received in 2020/21 was TZS 188.1 billion which increased by 25.9 percent compared to TZS 149.4 billion that was received during the financial year 2019/20 where by TZS 30.4 billion was received as grants to smooth the implementation of development projects in the year 2020/21.

### **Expenditures**

The Government expenditure for the year 2020/21 reached TZS 953.8 billion showing a decrease of 6.9 percent compared with TZS 1.0 trillion spent in 2019/20. However, the overall government expenditure decreased, allocation of funds to meet recurrent expenditure was more than three quarter (TZS 740.1 billion) in 2020/21. A total of TZS 213.7 billion was spent for development projects during the year while the contribution from foreign resources was TZS

131.2 billion which decreased by 24.1 percent compared to TZS 162.8 billion that was allocated in 2019/20. During the year, the contribution of domestic financial resources that were used for development projects decreased by 40.7 percent from TZS 139.1 billion in 2019/20 to TZS 82.4 billion 2020/21.

# F.3 Zanzibar Consumer Price Index (ZCPI)

Zanzibar Consumer Price Index is a measure of the average change in prices paid by consumers for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is not a cost-of-living index but a proxy indicator to it. Information on retail prices is collected monthly on all items in the market basket. The basket has been obtained from the 2014/15 Zanzibar Household Budget Survey (ZHBS) and it uses the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) group specification.

The ZCPI (an all-items index) for the year 2021 was recorded as 115.9 compared with the average of 114.0 for the base year. The index for food stood at 115.0 showing relatively rapid price movements compared to non-food index which recorded 116.6. An all-items index is simply the weighted average of the group indices (**Table F.3.2**).

The change in price levels paid by consumers for the year 2021 stands at 1.7 percent, then referred to as inflation. Similar indices for food and non-food are 0.6 and 2.5 percent respectively. In 2020 the average inflation rate was 3.4, with food inflation rate of 5.8 and non-food inflation of 1.7 percent. The trend of the overall inflation rate in Zanzibar for the last years remained in the single digit (from 2013 - 2021) (**Table F.3.3**).

# G. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

# **G.1** Agriculture Statistics

Agricultural production encompasses both food, cash crops and varieties of fruits and vegetables as well as spices. Majority of the farmers are smallholders dominated by subsistence farming and a few in access are for the market. The products in agriculture also include animal husbandry (cattle, goats and chicken), fishing and forestry, while cloves and seaweed are the main cash crops for foreign earning. Statistics on areas used to cultivate various food crops, fruits and vegetable production, volumes and values of animals inspected and slaughtered and forestry products are collected from respective departments responsible with agriculture. Statistics on mining such as sand, stone, gravel, rubbles and limestone are collected from the Ministry of Water and Energy. Statistics on Cloves and stem cloves are collected from Zanzibar State Trade Company (ZSTC), while statistics on Seaweed production and fish catches are collected from the Ministry of Blue Economy and Fisheries; however, seaweed production is operated under Private Companies.

# **Crop Production**

Agriculture is one of the important economic sectors of Zanzibar's economy in terms of food production, employment generation, production of raw material for industries and generation of foreign exchange. The sector in 2021 contributes about 27.1 percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Smallholder farmers and large scale farms plant wide varieties of cash and food crops including fruits, vegetables and spices. The most common livestock types raised in Zanzibar are cattle, goats and ducks and chicken.

#### **Food Crops, Fruit and Vegetable Production**

For the year 2021, total area planted with major food crops, fruits and vegetables was 98,590.8 acres producing 393,315 tons. Whereby 82,120.6 acres (83.3 percent) were planted with major food crops and the remaining 16,470.2 acres (16.7 percent) were planted with fruits and vegetables. From the total production (393,315.0 tons), the production of major food crops were 328,495.2 tons (83.5 percent) and 64,819.8 tons (16.5 percent) fruits and vegetables. Area planted with food crops decreased from 87,823.6 acres recorded in 2020 to 82,120.6 recorded in 2021, equivalent to a decrease of 6.5 percent (**Tables G.1.1**).

The highest production of major food crops was recorded in Mkoani district, producing 79,284.2 tons representing 24.1 percent of the total production, followed by Micheweni with 71,308.8 tons (21.7 percent). While the lowest production was recorded in Kusini Unguja district with 1,815.3 tons (0.6 percent). However, the highest production of fruits and vegetables production was recorded in Kaskazini 'B' district with 20,927.8 tons present 32.3 percent, followed by Mkoani district with 12,054.5 tons (18.6 percent), Kati with 7,781.4 tons (12.0 percent) and the lowest production for fruits and vegetable was recorded in Magharibi B with 1,317.8 tons present only 2.0 percent of the total fruits and vegetable production.

Regarding the types of fruits produced, there was a large production of watermelon (21,001.7 tons), present 32.4 percent of the total fruits and vegetables production, followed by pineapple production which recorded 13,725.0 tons (21.2 percent). Whilst, the lowest production was recorded for bitter aubergine with 1,657.6 tons presenting only 2.6 percent (**Tables G.1.1, G.1.2, G.1.3, G.1.3.1, G.1.4, G.1.5 and G.1.6**).

# **Cash Crops Production**

The quantity of cloves purchased in 2021 was 7,840.8 tons worth TZS 102,030.9 million, this quantity purchased shows an increase of more than 100 percent as compared with the previous year. The largest quantity was purchased in August whereby 2,998.8 tons were purchased which is equivalent to 738.2 percent of the total quantity purchased valued at TZS 38,938.9 million. The highest purchase was recorded in Kusini Pemba Region with 5,867.0 tons presents 74.8 percent worth 76,274.0 million, followed by Kaskazini Pemba with 1,857.8 tons (23.7 percent) worth 24,239.5 million. While the lowest purchase of clove was recorded in Mjini Magharibi region with 26.1 tons (0.3 percent) worth 344.1 million. The purchase of clove stem was 1,664.6 tons worth 2,496.3 million (Table G.1.8 and G.1.9).

The total production for seaweeds was 10,530.8 tons worth 6,402.8 million, the production of seaweed increased by 17.4 percent, from 8,967.14 tons in 2020 to 10,530.8 tons in 2021 (**Table G.1.10, G.1.11, G.1.12**).

# **Inspected and Slaughtered Livestock and Poultry**

The number of inspected and slaughtered cattle for the year 2021 was 25,916 heads which marks a decrease of 13.2 percent compared with 2020. Similar trend has been observed for inspected and slaughtered goats of which the number was 7,447 heads compared with 7,868 heads in 2020. Contrary, the number of inspected and slaughter chicken increased by 5.8 percent from 709,930 birds in 2020 to 751,073 birds in 2021 (Table G.1.13).

#### **Fish Catches**

The quantity of fish catch in 2021 was 47,114.6 tons valued at TZS 237,172 million of which 47,111 tons from Ministry of Blue Economy and Fisheries and 3.6 tons jointly from Zanzibar Fisheries Company and Kikosi Maalum cha KuzuiaMagendo Zanzibar (KMKM). The quantity of fish catch from the Ministry of Blue Economy and Fisheries was increased by 23.63 percent compared with the year 2020. The type of fish which were mostly caught was Anchovies (13,433tons) with the total value of TZS 43,590 million, Emperors fish (3,074 tons worth TZS 20,051 millions) and yellow fish tuna (2,597 tons worth TZS 15,504 million).

Most of the fish were caught from Kaskazini "A" district (8,573 tons worth TZS 54,253 millions), Magharibi A & B district (7,054 tons worth TZS 31,686 million) and Mkoani(6,323 tons worth TZS 28,951 million). Whilst, the lowest catch was recorded in Chakechake district with 1,604 tons worth TZS 6,387 million)..

# **Forest Resource**

The forest and woody resources play an important role in the daily livelihood of the people of Zanzibar. They are very important sources of energy for cooking, building timber, tourism, fodder, water catchments, shelters for wildlife and estuaries for fish breeding areas "the use of firewood and charcoal for cooking in Zanzibar households are still the most common accounted 52.8 and 34.1 percent respectively (2019/20 Household Budget Survey; Main Report)". However, due to over increasing demands of forest products in Zanzibar, the forest resources are facing severe exploitation pressure and this resulted in a decrease of wood resources in the Country. Well managed forest resources can effectively contribute towards sustainable social and economic development of Zanzibar, at the same time maintaining its environmental integrity.

The native forest area in Zanzibar is estimated at 86,182 ha; out of this 71,068 ha in Unguja and 15,114 ha in Pemba. Intermediate coral rag vegetation is the biggest Land Use and Land Cover (LULC) class in Unguja with 35,057 ha and 22.1 percent share of the land area and in Pemba the mixture of trees and agricultural crops LULC class is largest with an area of 22,482 ha and 22.2 percent of the land area (*Zanzibar Woody Biomass Survey Report, 2013*).

Data on forest resources are collected from licensed timber cutting from Government Forest Plantations and public land. In addition, the Islands are surrounded by mangrove and other beach trees used in house and fishing boat construction.

# **Quantity of Forest Products**

**Table G.1.18** shows that the volume of wood harvested for the year 2021 decreased; mainly motivated by the decrease in production of firewood production which decreased from 27,496.2 m<sup>3</sup> in 2020 to 25,813 m3 in 2021 presenting a decrease of 6.1 percent. Building poles production has decreased from 3,254.7 m<sup>3</sup> in 2020 to 3,098.2 m<sup>3</sup> in 2021, equivalent to a decrease of 4.8 percent. Similar trend has been observed for Beam and Charcoal production of which decreased by 1.9 and 0.2 percent from 1,449.6 m<sup>3</sup> in 2020 to 1,422.4 m<sup>3</sup> in 2021 and 1,808.8 tons in 2020 to 1,805.1 tons in 2021 respectively. Contrary, the production of Medium poles and Witches in the year 2021 increased; Medium poles increased from 2,878.0 m<sup>3</sup> recorded in 2020 to 2,956.2 m<sup>3</sup>, in 2021 this is equivalent to an increase of 2.7 percent. Whilst, Witches increased from 1,930.4 m<sup>3</sup> in 2020 to 2,046.3 m<sup>3</sup> in 2021.

# **G.2 Mining**

Data on mining products show that stone harvest for the year 2021 increased by 11.6 percent compared with its harvest recorded in 2020 (i.e. from 130,230 tons in 2020 to 145,341.0 tons). Sand harvest also increased by 56.8 percent i.e. from 466,872 tons in 2020 to 732,159 tons. Harvest of rubbles increased by 71.3 percent compared with the harvest recorded in 2020 (i.e. from 97,727 tons in 2020 to 167,393 tons). Limestone production harvest decreased by 21.8 percent, the product decreased from 34 tons recorded in 2020 to 26 tons in 2021, while production of stone bricks increased tremendously for more than 100 percent when compared with previous year i.e. from 4,566 tons in 2020 to 10,713 tons in 2021 (Table G.2.1).

# **G.3 Manufacturing Industry**

Zanzibar industrial activities are centered mainly on small and medium scale processing of domestic goods; food processing, beverages and processing of agricultural products. Industrial sector includes all establishments engaged in activities that fall under mining (for Zanzibar this is mainly quarrying), manufacturing, generation and distribution of electricity, gas and water. This is as recommended in International Recommendations on Industrial Statistics.

#### **Selected Commodities**

This includes only the commodities that were selected to present industrial production in Zanzibar, the commodities selected were those which show the high output during the census of industrial production (CIP, 2012).

In 2021, production of selected industrial products increased compared with 2020 as follows: Sugar 100 percent; Bread 0.6 percent; wheat flour 3.1 percent; Garments Dash Dash (Nguo) 66.3 percent and Jewelry (gold/Silver) 56.7 percent. The increase in production of these products was due to increased demand for industrial products in the domestic markets. However, production in some of the industrial products decreased as follows: Essential Oil Product from 234924 kg in 2020 to 289.9 in 2021; Beverages 0.1 percent; Wheat bran 74.5; Dairy Products 258.6 and there is no production of Door UPVC and window UPVC products in year 2021 (Table G.3.1).

Generally, total values increased from shillings 103,626 million in 2021 to shillings 93,807 million in 2020, equivalent to an increase of 8.9 percent. This resulted from decreased production of some selected commodities and increase to the cost of industrial raw materials (Table G.3.1).

The production of breads as the bakery products increased by 0.6 per cent in 2021, the number of breads produced increased from 237,918 thousand breads in 2020 to 239,242 thousands in 2020. Production of garments (Dash Dash) has also increased by 66.3 percent from 1,392 pcs in 2020 to 4,125pcs in 2021 (Table G.3.1).

The value of production in public industries (clove stem oil, printing services and electricity distribution) increased from TZS 124,193 Million in 2020 to TZS 126,359 Million in 2021 (1.7 percent). Value of goods produced in Private industries (beverages, wheat flour, diary product, sugar, Noodles, garments and others products) in 2021 also increased from 93,807 million to

TZS 103,626 million (7.5 percent). Generally, value of production in public industries is higher than that of private industries (Table G.3.2).

The Producer Price Index (PPI), which excludes the Value Added Tax (VAT) and transport cost of the finished products, increased by 5.8 per cent in 2021 mainly due to increase in Manufacture of chemical and chemical products; Manufacture of wearing apparel; and Manufacture of rubber and plastics products (Table G.3.4).

#### **G.4** Construction Statistics

The construction statistics, including number of new architects registered as well as number of new engineers registered. Data on new architects registered shows that in 2021, the Board registered eleven (11) expert architects, this indicates a decrease of 9.1 percent compared to 11 experts registered in 2020. Among the registered architects, seven (7) were local (Tanzanian) and four (4) was Consulting Architects Firm, there were no foreigner architects in the year 2021(Table G.4.1).

In 2021, Engineers Registration Board registered 78 engineers (25.6 percent) compared to 58 engineers registered in 2020. The increase was attributed to a large number of registered graduate's engineers as well as foreigner's engineers. Among the registered engineers, sixty-seven (67) were local (Tanzanian) and seven (7) were foreigners and four (4) were companies (Table G.4.2).

#### **G.5** Investment

The Government of Zanzibar through ZIPA continues to create a conducive investment environment to attract new investments, retaining the existing investments and promote small and medium enterprises (SME).

In 2021, 97 projects worth TZS 2,613,648 Million were registered of which majority of them (40 projects) were from the Hotels and Restaurant sector (Table G.5.1). Moreover, a total of 7,791 employees were approved, most of them were from Manufacturing Sector (2,779 employments) followed by Hotels and Restaurant sector which approved 2,043 employments. (Table G.5.2).

## H. TRADE, TOURISM, UTILITY, ENERGY AND TRANSPORT

#### H.1 External and Inter - State Trade

Trade statistics gives a brief explanation of flows/directions of trade, balances and volumes, specializations (comparative advantage) and their economic influence. External trade statistics are compiled from documents provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority. It should also be noted that goods crossing international borders without appropriate Customs documentation are not included in external trade.

Exports statistics includes domestic export and re-export. Domestic export refers to exports of goods of national origin while re-export refers to goods exported either in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

Trade balance is the difference in the value of exports and imports. Zanzibar has never experienced a positive balance of trade; this means that Zanzibar always imports more than it exports.

Inter-State trade statistics provides an idea about the demand of commodities produced or consumed in Zanzibar along with the flows thereof to the other side of the country that is Tanzania Mainland.

In 2021, Zanzibar recorded a total volume of trade worth TZS 1,124,317.1 million that marks an increase of 21.1 percent compared with TZS 913,091.8 million recorded in 2020. The trade balance in 2021 has shown a deficit of TZS 812,973.1 million compared with the balance of TZS 781,769.7 million recorded in 2020. The export-import ratio increased from 7.7 per cent in 2020 to 16.1 per cent in 2021. The recorded export value in 2021 was TZS 155,672.0 million which is twice compared with TZS 65,661.0 million recorded in 2020. The value of the imports in 2021 was TZS 968,645.1 million that indicates an increase of 14.3 percent compared with 847,430.8 recorded in 2020 (Table H.1.1).

Food and live animals contributed to TZS 140,233.2 million equivalent to 90.1 percent of the total export value in 2021 (Table H.1.4). The exported value of Cloves recorded in 2021 was TZS 115,358.7 million which is equivalent to 74.1 percent of the total export. For the year 2021, Singapore appeared to be the major buyer of the exported goods from Zanzibar (Table H.1.6).

U.A.E recorded the highest value of import in 2021 worth TZS 387,080.2 million, followed by China which recorded TZS 98,998.5 million (Table H.1.10). Mineral fuels, lubricants and related materials recorded the highest value for imports (TZS 337,001.5 millions) in 2021 (Table H.1.7). The import of fuel products has been increasing over time. In 2021 import of petrol fuel increased by 38.0 percent equivalent to 193,438.7 value compared with 140,180.3 value in 2020 (Table H.1.9).



#### H.2 Tourism

This section consists of information of tourist arrivals into Zanzibar through major entry points, visitors by nationality, sex composition of visitors and their purpose of visit for international tourists.

Table H.2.1 and figure H.2.1 show that, total number of visitors for the year 2021 were 394,185 that show an increase of 51.2 percent compared to 260,644 visitors recorded in 2020. Russia dominated the tourism market by accounting for 17.9 percent of all visitors in the year 2021, followed by French (9.5 percent) and Polish (9.4 percent) while New Japanese continued to be the least (0.1 percent).

A total of 348,868 visitors (88.5 percent) visited Zanzibar through Airport, of whom 316,195 came by international flights and 32,673 by domestic flights from various regions of Tanzania Mainland. The remaining visitors 45,317 (11.5 percent) entered through Seaport of whom 94 came by cruise ship and 45,223 came by ferry from Tanzania Mainland (Table.H.2.2).

Composition by sex suggests more females visited Zanzibar than males. There were 190,213 (48.3 percent) males and 203,972 (51.7 percent) females who entered Zanzibar in 2021. Males increased by 60.7 percent and females increased by 43.3 percent compared with 2020 (Table H.2.3).

The ages of the visitors were categorized into three broad groups: those younger than 15 years, 15 to 64 years, and 65 years and older. The overall results show that 25,212 (6.4 percent) visitors were aged less than 15 years; 357,002 (90.6 percent) were aged 15 to 64 years and 11,971 (3.0 percent) were aged 65 years and older. (Table H.2.4). Majority of visitors (98.7 percent) came to Zanzibar for leisure/holidays (table H.2.5).

The number of visitors from emerging markets for the year 2021 increased by 97.0 percent compared with preceding year. Generally, the data show that the majority of the emerging countries prevailed in the increase of visitors in 2021 except Chinese, which decreased by 35.1 percent compared with the year 2021 (Table H.2.6).

Findings from Table H.2.7 and Figure H.2.2 show that February recorded the highest number of visitors (51,574), followed by January (49,868) while May had the least number of visitors (9,280). The data trend shows that the peak season is mostly observed in August and low season observed in May for the past ten years.

There is a remarkable decrease of the visitors in 2020 due to the eruption of the pandemic disease (COVID-19) globally (Table H.2.8).

Table H.2.9 shows that 17.7 percent of all visitors in 2021 stayed in the country for six days. The overall average intended length of stay of visitors in 2021 was about nine (9.3) nights.

The number of Hotels/Guest Houses increased from 620 in 2020 to 683 in 2021. (Table H.2.10). The data from Table H.2.11 show that 214 Hotels/Guest Houses registered in 2021, with a total of 3035 rooms.

There were 267 Hotels and Guest Houses in Kusini district recorded in 2021, followed by Kaskazini A (192 Hotels/Guest Houses) while Wete district recorded the least (2 Houses/Guest Houses) as shown in Table H.2.12.

Table H.2.13 shows that the total number of visitors visiting tourist attractions for the year 2021 were 231,884 compared to 101,393 visitors recorded in 2020. There were the highest number of visitors (82,344) visiting tourist attractions in Mjini district followed by Kati (64,984) while Kusini (2,955) had the least number of visitors. (TableH.2.14).

Findings from Table H.2.15 show that visitors visiting most of the Government attractions (174,482) other than Private attractions (57,402).



### H.3 Utility, Energy and Fuel

This section presents statistics on water supply and electricity distributed. Data on water supply are collected on annual basis while electricity distributions are collected on quarterly basis

### **Water Supply**

The amount of water Supplied in 2021 was 131,812,147 cubic meters whereas the estimated demand was 240,465,120 cubic meters, this indicates a total deficit of 45.2 percent in demand. The highest water supply by region was recorded in Mjini Magharibi Region where 47,796,000 cubic meters was supplied followed by Kusini Pemba Region with 25,814,880 cubic meters. The region with the lowest water supply was Kusini Unguja whereby there were only 14,275,200 cubic meters supplied (Table H.3.1 and H.3.2).

Table H.3.2 shows the total revenue collected for water supply in 2021 was TZS 2,613 million with the highest revenue collected from Mjini Magharibi Region amounting TZS 932.0 million (32.1 percent), followed by Kusini Pemba with total revenue of TZS 600.6 million (24.9 percent). The Region with the lowest revenue collected was Kaskazini Pemba with the total amount of TZS 174.3 million (7.2 percent).

# **Electricity**

The recorded number of new customers connected to National Power Grid in 2021 is 33,046 customers, which is higher than 15,426 customers are in 2020 (Table H.3.9). The quantity of electricity sold to different customers increased from 393,512 thousand KWH in 2020 to 436,711 thousand KWH in 2021 and also the value collected also increased from 119,895 TZS thousands in 2020 to 124,999 TZS thousands in 2021 (Table H.3.10 and H.3.11).

### **H.4** Transport and Communications

This section presents statistics on transport and communication activities. Transport statistics comprise data on road network, movements/trips (enter/exit), traffic handling of passengers and cargo – both at airports and seaports as well as information on number of motor vehicles registration and licenses issued to both public and private automobiles. Communication data comprise the number of registered radio and television.

# **Transport**

The transport sector plays a big socio-economic role in the movements of people and distribution of goods and services. The transport system in Zanzibar is divided into:

- a. Interregional transport between Islands, Mainland and the coastal area of Eastern Africa.
- b. Local internal transport within islands.
- c. Transport to the rest of the world

In 2021, the total number of marine vessels' trips (enter/exit) reached 14,809 trips, of which 14,683 trips were from local marine vessel and 126 trips from Foreign going vessel while the passenger handled reached 2,680,491.

The number of TEUs increased from 68,707 to 70,461 recorded in 2021 (Table H.4.1). The total number of passengers handled at Zanzibar airport reached 1,212,122, of whom 610,311 were embarked and 601,811 were disembarked. The number of passengers increased by 62.8 compared with 744,142 recorded in 2020. About 96,570 transit passengers were also recorded in 153,007. At the end of 2021, Zanzibar had a stock of 126,389 land transport vehicles which shows an increase of 22.8 percent compared with the year 2021. The trend shows that the stock of land transport vehicles has been increasing each year for the period of the past five years.
