

A. LAND AND CLIMATE

A.1 Land

Zanzibar Islands lies in the Indian Ocean off the coast of Eastern Africa. It is situated about 30 kilometers from the mainland of East Africa. It is a low-lying island of coral formation, with an area of about 2,654 square kilometers; of which 1,666 square kilometers are for Unguja island and 988 square kilometers are for Pemba. There are also a number of habitat and un-habitat islets.


Cloves and seaweed are grown for export; fishing is also important to the local economy. Recently tourism has emerged to be the main source of revenues for the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar (RGZ). The islands' main seaport is located at Zanzibar Stone Town situated on the western coast. It has a fine landlocked harbor with docking facilities for both passengers and cargo ships. The main airport is Abeid Amani Karume International Airport situated in the western part of the main town.

A.2 Climate

The Zanzibar climate is warm and humid (equatorial). There are four seasons in a year, namely "Masika" which is the main rainy season, experienced between March and May; Kipupwe the cold season, in the months of June to August; "Vuli", short rainy season during the months of September to November and "Kaskazi", the hot season which is experienced from December to March. The average highest peak of rain in 2020; Unguja was recorded in April and November while Pemba was recorded in April and May (Table A.2.1). The islands experienced high humidity between 73 and 90 percent in 2020 as shown in Table A.2.3.

B. ADMINISTRATION AND POLITICS

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar was formed on 12th January, 1964 under his first President, the late Hon. Abeid Amani Karume. The two independent states, Zanzibar and Tanganyika, then united on 26th April 1964 to form the United Republic of Tanzania (URT). Since then Zanzibar has come to be part of the union but with its own elected President, Legislature as well as Judiciary System (except for the Court of Appeal).

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar is now on its seventh phase and His Excellency, Dr. Hussein Ali Mwinyi governs it since November 2020. This phase is operating through the Government of National Unity after the changes in the Zanzibar Constitution, which allowed the opposition party to be included in the Government. B.1 Administration

As at December 2020, the country had 17 members in the Revolutionary Council (which is also the Council of Ministers – Cabinet). The House of Representatives has 78 members of whom 49 are elected from Constituencies, seven (7) are nominated by the President, and 18 are special seats for women. One Secretary, One Attorney General, Speaker and Deputy Speaker.

Note: The number of members in the Revolutionary Council should be 20, but as at December 2020, there were only 17 members, due to three (3) ministries (Ministry of Trade and Industrial Development, Ministry of State, First Vice President's Office and Ministry of Health, Social Welfare, Gender, Elderly and Children) they had not yet been appointed ministers.

The number of constituencies is 50 but as at December 2020 there were only 49 constituencies with representatives, this is due to Pandani constituency being vacant due to the death of its representative.

C POPULATION AND DEMOGRAPHIC STATISTICS

Population is the totality of all units of interest in a study or investigation at a given time and a given area. Population studies analyze the relationships between economic, social, cultural and biological processes influencing populations.

C.1 Population Characteristics

The population of Zanzibar as recorded in 2012 Tanzania Population and Housing Census (2012 TPHC) was 1,303,569; growing at a rate of 2.8 percent per annum. The sex ratio of the population was 95, meaning that for every 100 females there are only 95 males. The population density for Zanzibar increased from 530 person/sq.km in 2012 to 603 person/sq.km in 2019, whereby Unguja and Pemba have 669 person/sq.km and 503 person/sq.km, respectively. The average household size is 5.1 (Table C.1.5), which confirms the predominance of large households, especially in the three regions (Mjini Magharibi, Kaskazini and Kusini Pemba).

The spatial composition suggests that 68.8 percent of the population is in Unguja island. The proportion of population in Pemba island has gradually declined, from 46.3 percent in 1967 to 31.2 percent in 2012; while that of Mjini Magharibi – the center of attraction from all Zanzibar administrative regions and parts of Eastern Africa – has been steadily growing. It is estimated that half of the Zanzibar population currently live in Mjini Magharibi.

The projected population for the year 2020 is 1,671,598 out of which male is 814,159 and female is 857,439 (Table C.1.4). Population projections are useful in development planning, local administration, research, learning institutions and private business enterprises.

D. SOCIAL STATISTICS

Social statistics comprise of data series from various sectors including education, health, crime statistics and social welfare (people with disability, orphans' care and old people care). The social statistics collected used by planners, policy and decision makers, researchers, international agencies and students from different institutions within and outside Zanzibar for planning and budgeting, monitoring and evaluation of the Zanzibar Strategy for Growth and Reduction of Poverty (ZSGRP), Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and for the OCGS's general purposes.

D.1 Education

After the Zanzibar Revolution in 1964, the Government announced Free Education for All (FEA) for Zanzibar citizens where a number of new schools were initiated both in rural and urban areas for Unguja and Pemba. Major changes in the curriculum, organization and administration of educational institutions have been introduced so that education for the students serves the needs of the country, encouraging self-reliance and the development of science, technology and innovation. The Zanzibar Strategy for Growth and Reduction of Poverty (ZSGRP III) emphasizes the importance of education through the Key Result Area B and C promoting human capital development and inclusive and equitable access to quality education and skills training to enhance human capacity for sustaining human development.

In order to ensure education services are effectively and efficiently delivered the Revolutionary Government has transferred authority and functions from the central Government to local authorities since 2017. Pre-primary and Primary schools are operating under the President's Office, Regional Administration, Local Government and Special Departments (PO-RALGSD) of the Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar and only the secondary schools are operating under the Ministry of Education and Vocational Training (MoEVT), Similarly the Government ensure education is provided to all equitable sex for hestance providing education of science subjected to all including women. The information presented were collected from the MoEVT. The information collected includes the number of schools, students' enrolment by grade, performance in examination results and the number of teachers etc.

A total of 92,098 pupils were enrolled in pre-primary schools in 2020; of which 51,425 pupils (55.8 percent) were in private schools and 40,673 pupils (44.2 percent) in government school.

The number of pupils enrolled in primary schools was increased by 22,587 pupils from 290,510 pupils in 2019 to 313,097 pupils in 2020(**Table D.1.8**).

The Zanzibar Higher Education Loan Board (ZHELB) has provided loans to 4,710 students in the academic year 2020/2021; of whom 1,984 students were among the new selected applicants. The number of new applicants who received loans from ZHELB in this academic year increased from 1,860 applicants in 2019/2020 to 1,984 applicants in 2020/2021 (**Table D.1.22**).

D.2 Health Statistics

The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar has been providing free health services to all people of Zanzibar since 1964 with particular emphasis on elderly, women and children. This evolves the Government's understanding that national development and the good health of the people cannot be separated. This is well stated under the Zanzibar Long Term Development Plan, "Vision 2020" and ZSGRP III as well as in the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Key Result Area C of ZSGRP III emphasizes the need of quality health in the Outcome Statement C1 which stated "improve access quality health and sanitation services for safe and clean water and mitigated burden of communicable (including HIV) and non-communicable diseases". The Revolutionary Government of Zanzibar has decentralized some of the Health facilities including PHCU, PHCU+ to operate under the Local Government authorities from the Ministry of Health Social Walfare, Gender, Elders and Children aiming to ensure that health services reach the people in easiest way Ministry of Health Social Walfare, Gender, Elders and Children, Zanzibar, provides health service through primary, secondary and tertiary level of health facility. In term of primary level health service provide through (PHCUs and PHCU+) with primary health care centre. Regarding to the secondary levels this include District and Regional hospital and at Tetiary level the health service is available at referral and special hospital.

Mode of data collection

Data on health services are produced by the Ministry of Health Social Walfare, Gender, Elders and Children, Zanzibar through its Health Management Information System (HMIS). The system obtains health data from primary sources (i.e. routine data) as well as secondary data (population censuses, national and other related health surveys). Routine data are predominantly collected from public, private and NGO's health facilities while censuses and surveys information are obtained from the Office of Chief Government Statistician. Data on in-patients, out-patients and admissions are collected quarterly while other information is collected annually.

The number of health facilities by level, type and ownership for the period 2013 to 2020 .The number of public health facilities specifically (PHCU) increased from 105 facilities in 2013 to 127 facilities in 2020. The private health facilities increased from 70 dispensaries in 2013 to 113 dispensary in 2020. Referral hospital, district hospital and specially hospital remain the same, (Table D2.1)

The number of health personnel's increased to some of the cadres. The number of medical doctors rose up to 270 doctor in 2020 from 247 doctors in 2019. Similarly the number of clinical officers increased from 311 clinical officers in 2019 to 327 clinical officers in 2020. There is slight difference to the number of nurses from 2019 to 2020 (Table D.2.3).

A total of 46,707 live births recorded in all health facilities in 2020 where by mjini accounted of 19,551 live births (Table D.2.4).

A total of 1,849,716 out-patient visits were made in the year 2020. The number of visiting out-patients reported by the government health facility was 1,421,215 and 258,965 visiting reported in a private health facility. In addition parastatal and faith based health facility reported to have 147,050 and 22,486 visiting outpatients respectively. (**Table D.2.5**).

D.3 Drugs Statistics

In 2021 the revolutionary Government of Zanzibar through various stakeholders of the of the Commission for National Coordination and Drug Control Drugs continue to intensify their partnerships and efforts in to achieve the government's goals in the war on drugs to eradicate drug abuse in the country.

Drugs are chemicals that when they enter the body affect the user's brain and cause him or her to have actions, feelings, thoughts and appearance that are different from the expectations of society. These drugs enter the body in three main ways which are the way you drink, eat and smoke

There are many possible reasons for a person to use drugs, including:

- i. Mental illness as a stress disorder
- ii. Indulge in Entertainment especially Night Clubs
- iii. Bad upbringing from parents or guardians
- iv. Inspiration of Modern

Short-term effects Side Effects of Drug Abuse;

- i. Extremely active (cocaine and marijuana)
- ii. Drowsiness, lethargy, dizziness or drowsiness (alcohol, heroin)
- iii. Confusion / addiction (marijuana) Insomnia, appetite and sexual desire

Long-term effects drug abuse are the followings

- i. Loss of memory,
- ii. Loss of fertility
- iii. Mental, heart, liver, lung, stroke, AIDS, skin diseases, malnutrition etc.
- iv. Having unacceptable behaviors in the community such as bullying, lying, slander, theft, hatred, blame, excuses, evasion and ignorance.

There are total of six male sober houses recorded in 2020 where four of them are located in Unguja and two in Pemba. The number of residents in sober houses are decreased from 401 residents in

2019 to 349 residents in 2020 equivalent to 13 percent, where large number of residents in sober house fall at the age group 26-35 and 36-45 accounted for 148 residents in sober houses and 95 residents in sober houses respectively (**Table D.3.2**).

D.4 Crime Statistics

Crime is an action or omission which constitutes an offences and is punishable by law. Crime is usually secretive by nature, rendering their measurements difficult, moreover criminal and traffic incidents are divided into two parts, major and minor. Crime statistics attempt to provide statistical measures of crimes in the society. Several approaches are used to capture crime statistics, including household, hospital and insurance records. Data are compiled by Police and similar law enforcement agencies. Typically, official crime statistics are from law enforcement agencies, although some offences are likely to go unreported to the Police.

Recorded Road Accidents

Table D.4.1 shows that the total number of accidents recorded in 2020 were 306, of which Unguja was 256 accident and Pemba was 50 accidents. A total number of victims reported were 552; of which 180 victims were dead and 372 victims were injured. The highest number of persons died during the accidents were Cyclists (91 cyclists), followed by Pedestrians (53 Pedestrians) (Table D.4.3a). These two accounted for 80.0 percent of all persons died in the accidents.

The traffic offences have been decreasing with an average of 18.5 percent annual growth rate in the last five years, and marks a decrease of 41.8 percent in 2020 compared with the previous year. Non-Compliance with guidelines and traffic regulations is sighted as the main driver to offenses (4,674 offences) (Table D.4.3b).

Crime Cases

Table D.4.6 shows that the total number of cases reported were 8,886, of which the minor cases were 5,677 (63.9 percent) and serious cases were 3,209 (36.1 percent). The number of serious cases increased by 52.2 percent (3,209 cases) in 2020 from 2,109 in 2019; Mjini district reported the highest number of total cases (2,487) followed by Magharibi "B" district (1,770), while Kaskazini 'A' and Micheweni districts reported the least (257 and 250 respectively).

Offences against Persons

The total number of offences against persons were 1,438 which decreased by 8.9 percent compared to in 2019 (1,578 reported), this was highly attributed reported cases of rape to girls (35.3 percent), assault (31.8 percent), and abduction (10.4 percent) (Table D.4.10).

Prison Statistics

The total number of reported remands in 2020 were 1,325, of which 96.6 percent were male (1,280 male). Most males remands (50.9 percent) are in the age range of 18-30 years old (Table D.4.8).

Juvenile Court Cases

Table D.4.11 shows that the number of Criminal Cases at the Juvenile were 68 filled case, of which 16 (23.5 percent) has already decided and 52 Cases were pending before the Court. The number of filed cases decreased from 86 in 2019 (20.9 percent) to 68 in 2020.

D.5 Gender Statistics

Violence against women and children is a grave violation of human rights. Its impact ranges from immediate to long-term multiple physical, sexual and mental consequences for women and children, including death.

A total of 1,363 cruelty and gender based violence incidences were reported in 2020 that involved 217 women victims (15.9 percent) and 1,146 children victims (84.1 percent), among the children victims, 899 (78.4 percent) were girls and 247 (21.6 percent) were boys (**Table D.5.2**)

Comparing with preceding year, the number of incidences decreased from 1,369 incidences reported in 2019 to 1,363 reported in 2020, which indicates slightly decreased of 0.4 percent (**Table D.5.1**).

The highest number of incidences reported in 2020 was in Mjini district with 297 incidences (21.8 percent), followed by Magharibi 'B' district was 273 incidences (20.0 percent) and Magharibi 'A' district was 199 incidences (14.6 percent). Among all violence reported in Zanzibar, rape offences seemed to be the biggest problem 571 offences (41.9 percent) compared to other offences. Mjini district have a large number of rape offences counted for 97 (17.0 percent) followed by Magharibi 'A' 92 (16.3 percent) and the least number of rape offence was found in Micheweni District (21 offences) (**Table D.5.3**).

Children aged 15-17 reported to have the highest number of incidences with 681 victims (59.4 percent) compared with other age group (**Table D.5.5**).

Many incidences of cruelty and gender based violence occurred at home place was 1,270 (93.2 percent) compared with other place (**Table D.5.7**). More than one quarter 554 (40.6 percent) of the total incidences was filed to the court and 382 incidences (28.0 percent) was under investigation to the Police and remaining incidences with other action to be taken (**Table D.5.9**).

D.6 Social Welfare

This section presents the information of the children and those old people that are living at different cared center in Zanzibar. The information disaggregated by gender.

In 2020 the number of children cared increased up to 373 compared to 230 children cared in 2019. The sex composition of orphans fluctuates between years; for the year 2019, there were more boys (275) compared to girls (98) (Table D.6.2).

The number of old people cared has increased from 126 in 2019 to 134 in 2020. This is also similarly to either sex, except that there are slightly of more males compared with females. For the year 2020, there were 134 old people cared in elderly home, of which 60 were females and 74 are males (Table D.6.2).

D.7 Sports Statistics

The information of the Sport Statistics is under control of Zanzibar National Sport Council (ZNSC). The Zanzibar National Sport Council (ZNSC) has a role to stimulate the implementation of sporting policies in Zanzibar, to ensure that all sporting clubs and groups follow the laid down policies, constitutions, rules, laws, regulation and procedures on each game and other sporting activities; has also a role to corporate with other appropriate authority in administering registration of playing ground in order to prevent the trace-passing of those grounds; to develop and maintain in accordance with the registration of sport regulations and any direction as may be deemed fit.

The Council also has to ensure that all Sports Associations shall establish and formulate the reconciliatory and appellate Committee in their Sport Associations at all level and also has a power to participate in all meetings concerning with Sports Association and local at international level.

The information covers; the number of sports club registered, number of football teams by division and number of referee by type of sports. The number of football teams by division increased from 403 teams in 2019 to 597 teams in 2020 due to the changes of Constitution of ZFA and remove second division district and second division Taifa (Table D.7.1). The number of referees with and without FIFA badge increased from 160 referees in 2019 to 206 referees in 2020. Table D.7.1 show that 203 referees out of 206 they don't have FIFA badge and only three they have FIFA badge.

E. LABOUR STATISTICS

Office of the Chief Government Statistician collects data on labour Statistics mainly from Formal Sector Employment and Earnings Survey (FSEES) and the Integrated Labour Force Survey (ILFS). FSEES is an annual establishment based survey, usually undertaken in the month of June of every year to all Government, Government Parastatals and registered Private Institutions. The main objective of the FSEES is to provide information on employment and earnings to be used for planning, policy formulation and decision making processes. Collected information on number of employees and their salaries refers to the month of June only, while cash earnings covers the whole financial year (July – June).

ILFS is household based survey undertaken after every five years. The survey runs for the whole year, partly to take care of seasonality effect on employment. ILFS comprises four survey modules: Labour Force General, Informal Sector, Time Use and Child Labour.

E.2 Employment and Earnings

Total employment for all sectors (i.e. Government, Government Parastatals and Private) increased by 6.8 percent to 67,095 in 2019/2020 compared with 62,804 in 2018/2019. The total wage bill in 2019/2020 was TZS 555,619 million, of which TZS 418,207 millions of total wage bill was used for payment of salaries and TZS 20,200 millions for free ration (Table E.2.1).

For the year 2019/2020, employment of Government sector was 35,433, of which female employees (19,888) exceeded male employees (15,545). Education (9,628 employees) and Human health and Social works activity (3,225 employees) industries had the highest number of female employees (Table E.2.2).

The wage bill for the Government sector in 2019/2020 used for salary payments was TZS 211,949 millions while TZS 2,603 million were payments for free ration. Education services spent TZS 79,587 million as wage bill for salary.

In 2019/2020 Government Parastatals employed 6,459 persons, of whom 4,306 were males. Transportation and storage industry had the highest number of employees (1,932) compared with other industries (Table E.2.3).

The Government Parastatal's wage bill for 2019/2020 stood at TZS 94,759 million, of which TZS 70,372 million were employees' salaries, TZS 3,434 million were payments in kind (free ration) and TZS 20,953 million were cash payments given to employees as other benefits. Finance and Insurance industry had the highest composition to total wage bill of TZS 21,072 million.

The Private Sector in 2019/2020 accounted for 25,203 employees, of whom 17,102 were males. Accommodation and food services industry had the highest number of employees (12,588) (Table E.2.4).

The wage bill for all Private institutions stood at TZS 176,982 million, of which TZS 135,887 millions were for salary payments, TZS 14,164 millions for free rations and TZS 26,932 million as payments for other benefits paid to employees. Accommodation and food services industry shared TZS 96,271 million of the Private wage bill.

The Gross Domestic Product (GDP) is defined as the monetary value of all finished goods and services produced within an economic territory in a specific period of time (usually one year). It is the most important indicator in the System of National Accounts (SNA) used to gauge the health of a country's economy. The Production, Expenditure and Income methods are the approaches to its measurements; results of which are presented in current (years) or constant (base year or real) prices. The Office of the Chief Government Statistician has adopted the Production approach to the compilation of Zanzibar's GDP estimates.

For the year 2020, GDP at current prices stood at TZS 4,209.0 billion, interpreting the per capita income of TZS 1,870,000. At constant 2015 prices, the GDP increased to TZS 3,116.3 billion compared with TZS 3,077.5 billion observed in the previous year. This indicates that Zanzibar economy for the year 2020 grew by 1.3 percent (Table F.1.1).

The observed lower growth in the economy was a result of enhanced tourism industry and the general slowdown in service industries: the number of tourists decreased to 260,644 in 2020 compared with 538,264 in 2019; which also decreased production shares in accommodation and food services (from 20.2 in 2019 to 15.8 percent in 2020); and the service sector also showed an insignificant growth of -1.0 percent (Table F.1.5).




Figure F.1. 2: GDP Percentage Shares by Sector, 2020

F.2 Government Finance Statistics

Introduction

The Government Finance Statistics (GFS) also known as fiscal data which are generally referred to macroeconomic data that support the public finance economics. It reflects the Government's expenditure by its functions (CoFoG) and its transactions flows for economic activities including revenue, expenditure, changes in assets and liabilities and public net worth.

Financial Resources

The total resources collected for the year 2019/20 reached TZS 980.7 billion which indicates a slight decrease of 12.1 percent compared to TZS 1,115.8 billion in the previous year. However, the domestic revenue for the year 2019/20 shown to increase to TZS 787.2 billion from TZS 748.4 billion in 2018/19 which is equivalent to 5.0 annual percentage increase. These include the contribution of 85.8 percent of tax collections which is a slight decrease by 3.9 percentage share of its contribution to domestic revenue compared to previous year. Of the external resources, the amount of loan (domestic and external) received was TZS 149.4 billion which decreased by 53.7 percent compared to TZS 322.5 billion that was received during the financial year 2018/19 where by TZS 44.1 billion was received as grants for development projects in the year 2019/20.

Expenditures

The overall Government expenditure in year 2019/20 reached TZS 1,024.6 billion showing a slightly decrease of 9.4 percent compared with TZS 1,130.8 billion spent in 2018/19. A total of TZS 722.6 billion (70.5 percent) was allocated to meet recurrent. Development expenditure from domestic revenue of TZS 139.1 billion was spent during the year while the contribution from foreign resources was TZS 162.8 billion which decrease about 50 percent compared to TZS 323.9 billion that was allocated in 2018/19.

F.3 Zanzibar Consumer Price Index (ZCPI)

Zanzibar Consumer Price Index is a measure of the average change in prices paid by consumers for a fixed market basket of goods and services. It is not a cost of living index but a proxy indicator to it. Information on retail prices is collected monthly on all items in the market basket. The basket has been obtained from the 2014/15 Zanzibar Household Budget Survey (ZHBS) and it uses the Classification of Individual Consumption by Purpose (COICOP) group specification.

The ZCPI (an all items index) for the year 2020 was recorded as 114.0 compared with the average of 110.3 for the base year. The index for food stood at 114.3 showing relatively rapid price movements compared to non-food index which recorded 113.7. An all items index is simply the weighted average of the group indices (**Table F.3.2**).

The change in price levels paid by consumers for the year 2020 stands at 3.4 percent, then referred to as inflation. Similar indices for food and non-food are 5.8 and 1.7 percent respectively. In 2019 the average inflation rate was 2.7, with food inflation rate of 2.8 and non-food inflation of 2.6 percent. The trend of the overall inflation rate in Zanzibar for the last six years remained in a single digit (**Table F.3.3**).



G. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

G.1 Agriculture Statistics

Agricultural production encompasses both, food and cash crops; varieties of crops, fruits, vegetables and spices are planted mainly for subsistence farming and a few in access are for the market. The products in agriculture also include animal husbandry (cattle, goats and chicken), fishing and forestry, while cloves and seaweed are the main cash crops. Statistics on areas used to cultivate various food crops, fruits and vegetable production, volumes and values of animals inspected and slaughtered, fish catches and forestry products are collected from respective departments responsible with agriculture. Statistics on mining such as sand, stone, gravel, rubbles and limestone are collected from department of Forestry and Non-renewable Natural Resources within the Ministry of Agriculture, Natural resources and Livestock. Statistics on Cloves and stem cloves are collected from Zanzibar State Trade Company (ZSTC), while statistics on Seaweed production are also collected from Ministry of Agriculture, Natural resources and Livestock although it's production is operated under Private Companies.

Crop Production

Agriculture is one of the important economic sectors of the Zanzibar's economy in terms of food production, employment generation, production of raw material for industries and generation of foreign exchange. The sector in 2020 contribute about **22.8** percent of Gross Domestic Product (GDP). Smallholders plants a wide variety of cash and food crops well as fruits, vegetables and spices. The most common livestock types raised in Zanzibar are cattle, goats and chicken.

Food Crops, Fruit and Vegetable Production

For the year 2020, total area planted with major food crops, fruits and vegetables was 100,907 acres produce 396,014.02 tons. Whereby 87,823.6 acres (87 percent) were planted with major food crops and the remaining 13,083.3 acres (13.0 percent) were planted with fruits and vegetables. From the total production (396,014 tons), the production of major food crops were 341,079.3 tons (87 percent) and 54,934.8tons (14 percent) fruits and vegetables. Area planted with food crops increased from 87,575.4 acres recorded in 2019 to 87,823.6 recorded in 2020, equivalent to an increase 0.3 percent (**Tables G.1.1**).

The highest production of major food crops was recorded in Micheweni district for producing 87,545.1 tons presents 25.7 percent of the total production, followed by Wete district with 86,506.6 tons (25.4 percent). While the lowest production was recorded in Magharibi 'B' with 3,873.8 tons (1.1 percent). However, the highest production of fruits and vegetables production was recorded in Kaskazini 'B' district with 20,410.3 tons, followed by Kati district with 7,641 tons (13.9 percent), Kaskazini 'A' with 7,230.3 tons (13.2 percent) and the lowest production for fruits and vegetable was recorded in Magharibi A with 1,404.7 tons present only 3 percent of the total fruits and vegetable production.

Regarding the types of fruits produced, there was a large production of watermelon (15,605.9 tons), present 28.4 percent of the total fruits and vegetables production, followed by pineapple production which recorded 14,301.0 tons (26 percent). Among the fruits and vegetables whose production was recorded in 2020, the production of sweet pepper had the least production of 1,058.9 tons presents only 2 percent. (**Tables G.1.1, G.1.2, G.1.3, G.1.3.1 and G.1.4**).

Cash Crops Production

The quantity of cloves purchased in 2020 was 3,072.1 tons worth TZS 42,954.2 million, this quantity purchased shows an increase of 81.7 percent as compared with the previous year. The largest quantity was purchased in January whereby 2,249.3 tons were purchased which is equivalent to 73.2 percent of the total quantity purchased valued at TZS 31.467.2 million. The highest purchase was recorded in Kaskazini Pemba Region with 1,448 tons presents 47.1 percent worth 20,301 million, followed by Kusini Pemba region with 1,359 tons (44.2 percent) worth 19,006 million. While the lowest purchase of clove was recorded in Mjini Magharibi region with 38.8 tons (1.3 percent) worth 532 million. The purchase of clove stem was 542.3 tons worth 83.4 million (**Table G.1.6 and G.1.7**).

The total production for seaweeds was 8,967.14 tons worth 6,223.3 million, however, the production of seaweed decreased by 7.2 percent, from 9,663.2 tons in 2019 to 8,967.0 tons in 2020 (**Table G.1.7, G.1.8, G.1.9,G.1.10**).

Inspected and Slaughtered Livestock and Poultry

The number of inspected and slaughtered cattle for the year 2020 was 29,844 which marks an increase of 24.1 percent compared with 2019. Similar trend has been observed for goats of which the number inspected and slaughtered was 7,868 compared with 1,958 goats inspected and slaughtered in 2019 and number of chicken was 709,930 which is more than six times larger than that of the year 2019. Fish Catches

The quantity of fish catch in 2020 was 38,107.0 tons valued at TZS 205,350 million. This quantity is larger by 3.8 percent compared with the year 2019. The type of fish which were mostly caught was goat fish (2,915 tons) with the total value of TZS 14,858 million, surgeon fish (2,853 tons worth TZS 13,790 millions) and yellow fish tuna (2,834 tons worth TZS 15,292 million).

Most of the fish were caught from Magharibi 'A' district (6,879.2 tons worth TZS 37,057.5 millions), Mkoani district (4,964.4 tons worth TZS 26,666.5 million) and Kaskazini 'A' (4,399.7 tons worth TZS 23,792.6 million).

Forest Resource

The forest and woody resources play an important role in the daily livelihood of the people of Zanzibar. They are very important sources of energy for cooking, building timber, tourism, fodder, water catchments, shelters for wildlife and estuaries for fish breeding areas. Due to ever increasing demands of forest products in Zanzibar, the forest resources are facing severe exploitation pressure. Well managed forest resources can effectively contribute towards sustainable social and economic development of Zanzibar, at the same time maintaining its environmental integrity.

The native forest area in Zanzibar is 86,182 ha; 71,068 ha in Unguja and 15,114 ha in Pemba. Intermediate coral rag vegetation is the biggest Land Use and Land Cover (LULC) class in Unguja with 35,057 ha and 22.1 percent share of the land area and in Pemba the mixture of trees and agricultural crops LULC class is largest with an area of 22,482 ha and 22.2 percent of the land area (Zanzibar Woody Biomass Survey, 2013).

Data on forest resources are collected from licensed timber cutting from Government Forest Plantations and public land. In addition the Islands are surrounded by mangrove and other beach trees used in house and fishing boats construction. The Department of forestry and Nonrenewable Resources is concerned with the management of forest resources in the country.

Quantity of Forest Products

Table G.1.14 shows that the volume of wood harvested for the year 2020 decreased; mainly motivated by the decrease in production of Beam production which decreased from 1,721.1 m³ in 2019 to 1,449.6 m³ presenting decrease of 15.8 percent. Building poles production has increased by 4.48 percent (3,254.7 m³); Medium poles production and Charcoal of which increased by 3.2 and 2.4 percent from 2,790 and 1,766.2 in 2019 to 2,878 and 1,808.8 m³ respectively in 2020. Similar trend has been observed for Withes production which decreased by 10 percent compared with previous year. Contrary, the production of fire wood in the year 2020 increased from 32,189 m³ recorded in 2019 to 27,496.2 m³, this is equivalent to an increase of 14.6 percent.

G.2 Mining

Data on mining products show that stone harvest for the year 2020 increased by 26 percent compared with its harvest recorded in 2019 (i.e. from 103,230 tons in 2019 to 130,230 tons). Sand harvest decreased by 27 percent i.e. from 639,602 tons in 2019 to 466,872 tons. Harvest of gravels and rubbles increased by 64.4 and 81.9 percent respectively compared with the harvest recorded in 2019. Limestone production harvest decreased by 27.0 percent, while production of stone bricks decreased by 64 percent from 2019 (Table G.2.1).

G.3 Manufacturing Industry

Zanzibar industrial activities are centered mainly on small and medium scale processing of domestic goods; food processing, beverages and processing of agricultural products. Industrial sector includes all establishments engaged in activities that fall under mining (for Zanzibar this is mainly quarrying), manufacturing, generation and distribution of electricity, gas and water. This is as recommended in International Recommendations on Industrial Statistics.

Selected Commodities

This include only the commodities that was selected to present industrial production in Zanzibar, the commodities selected were those which shows the high output during the census of industrial production (CIP, 2012).

In 2020, production of selected industrial products increased compared with 2019 as follows: Beverage 1.2 percent; Bread 2.0 percent; wheat flour 17.5 percent; Wheat bran 61.5 percent; Dairy Products 2.1 percent; Noodles (Tambi) 6.63 percent and Essential Oil Product 2.0 percent. The increase in production of these products was due to increased demand for industrial products in the domestic markets. However, production in some of the industrial products decreased as follows: Door UPVC 81.8 percent; Garments Dash Dash (Nguo) 53.1 and there is no production of sugar in year 2020 (Table G.3.1).

Generally, total values decreased from shillings 23,734,946 thousands in 2019 to shillings 21,633,554 thousands in 2020, equivalent to an increase of 8.9 percent. This resulted from decreased in production some selected commodities and increase to the cost of industrial raw materials (Table G.3.1).

The production of breads as the bakery products increased by 2.8 per cent in 2020, the number of breads produced increased from 231,540 thousands breads in 2019 to 237,918 thousands in 2020. Production of garments (Dash Dash) has decreased by 53.1 percent from 2,971 pcs in 2019 to 1,392 pcs in 2020 (Table G.3.1).

The Producer Price Index (PPI), which excludes the Value Added Tax (VAT) and transport cost of the finished products, increased by 0.7 per cent in 2020 mainly due to increase in Manufacture of food products and products of wood and furniture; and Manufacture of rubber and plastics products (Table G.3.4).

The value of production in public industries (clove stem oil, printing services and electricity distribution) decreased from TZS 126,170 Million in 2019 to TZS 124,193 Million in 2020 (1.6 percent). Value of goods produced in Private industries (beverages, wheat flour, diary product and garments) in 2020 also decreased from TZS 95,024 million to TZS 93,807 million Generally value of production in public industries is higher than that of private industries (Table G.3.2).

G.4 Construction Statistics

The construction statistics, including number of new architects registered as well as number of new engineers registered. Data on new architects registered shows that in 2020, the Board registered nine (9) experts architects, this indicates a decrease of 11.1 percent compared to 10 experts registered in 2019. Among the registered architects, one (1) was local (Tanzanian), one (1) was foreigners and seven (7) was graduated Architects (Table G.4.1).

In 2020, Engineers Registration Board registered 57 engineers, decreased by 17.4 percent compared to 69 engineers registered in 2019. The decrease was attributed to low number of registered graduates engineers as well as foreigners engineers. Among the registered engineers, nine (9) were local (Tanzanian) and two (2) were foreigners (Table G.4.2).

G.5 Investment

The Government of Zanzibar through ZIPA continues to create conducive investment environment to attract new investments, retaining the existing investments and promote small and medium enterprises (SME).

In 2020, 30 projects worth TZS 449,527 Millions were registered of which majority of them (17 projects) were from Hotels and Restaurant sector (Table G.5.1). Moreover, a total of 1,058 employments were approved, most of them were from Hotels and Restaurant sector (704 employments) followed by Manufacturing Sector which approved 179 employments. H. TRADE, TOURISM, UTILITY, ENERGY AND TRANSPORT

H.1 External and Inter - State Trade

Trade statistics gives brief explanation of flows/directions of trade, balances and volumes, specializations (comparative advantage) and their economic influence. External trade statistics are compiled from documents provided by exporters and importers to the Tanzania Revenue Authority. It should also be noted that goods crossing international borders without appropriate Customs documentation are not included in external trade.

Exports statistics includes domestic export and re-export. Domestic export refers to exports of goods of national origin while re-export refers to goods exported either in the same condition as imported or after undergoing minor operations which leave them essentially unchanged.

Trade balance is the difference in the value of exports and imports. Zanzibar has never experienced a positive balance of trade; this means that Zanzibar always imports more than it exports.

Inter-State trade statistics provides an idea about the demand of commodities produced or consumed in Zanzibar along with the flows thereof to the other side of country that is Tanzania Mainland.

In 2020, Zanzibar recorded a total volume of trade worth TZS 913,091.8 million that marks an increase of 13.5 percent compared with TZS 803,884.6 million recorded in 2019. The trade balance in 2020 has shown a deficit of TZS 781,769.7 million compared with the balance of TZS 706,738.1 million recorded in 2019. The export-import ratio improved slightly from 6.4 per cent in 2019 to 7.7 per cent in 2020. The recorded export values in 2020 was TZS 65,661.0 million which is high by 35.1 percent compared with TZS 48,573.3 million recorded in 2019. The value of the imports in 2020 was TZS 847,430.8 million that indicates an increase of 12.2 percent compared with 755,311.3 recorded in 2019 (Table H.1.1).

Vegetable products contributed to TZS 51,029.8 million equivalent to 77.7 percent of the total export value in 2020 (Table H.1.2). The exported value of Cloves recorded in 2020 was TZS 38,370.9 million which is equivalent to 58.4 percent of the total export. For the year 2020, India appeared to be the major buyer of the exported cloves from Zanzibar (Table H.1.3).

U.A.E recorded the highest value of import in 2020 worth TZS 299,916.3 million, followed by China which recorded TZS 240,500.35 million. Mineral product recorded the highest value for

imports (TZS 217,020.5 millions) in 2020 (Table H.1.9). The import of fuel products has been increasing over time. In 2020 import of petrol fuel decreased by 14.7 percent equivalent to 140,180 value compared with 164,277 value in 2019 (Table H.1.9).

Figure H.1. 1: Trend of Imports and Exports Trade, 2011-2020



H.2 Tourism

This section consists of information of tourist arrivals into Zanzibar through major entry points, visitors by nationality, sex composition of visitors and their purpose of visit for international tourists.

Table H.2.1 and figure H.2.1 show that, total number of visitors for the year 2020 were 260,644 that show a decrease of 51.6 percent compared to 538,264 visitors recorded in 2019. Russia dominated the tourism market in Zanzibar by accounting 16.7 percent of all visitors in year 2020, followed by French (8.5 percent) and Italy (8.2 percent) while New Zealand continued to be the least (0.1 percent).

A total of 236,016 visitors (90.6 percent) visited Zanzibar through Airport, of whom 171,894 came by international flights and 64,122 by domestic flights from various regions of Tanzania Mainland. The remaining visitors 24,628 (9.4 percent) entered through Seaport by using ferry from Tanzania Mainland (Table.H.2.2).

Composition by sex suggests more females visited Zanzibar than males. There were 118,347 (45.4 percent) males and 142,297 (54.6 percent) females who entered Zanzibar in 2020. Males decreased by 51.6 percent and females decreased by 51.5 percent compared with 2019 (Table H.2.3).

The ages of the visitors were categorized into three broad groups: those younger than 15 years, 15 to 64 years, and 65 years and older. The overall results show that 17,288 (6.6 percent) visitors were aged less than 15 years; 227,099 (87.1 percent) were aged 15 to 64 years and 16,257 (6.3 percent) were aged 65 years and older. (Table H.2.4). Majority of visitors (99.1 percent) came to Zanzibar for leisure/holidays (table H.2.5).

The number of visitors from emerging markets for the year 2020 increased by 14.9 percent compared with preceding year. Generally, the data show that majority of the emerging countries prevailed decrease of visitors in 2020 except Russia that increased by more than one hundred percent (248.2 percent) and Ukraine by 35.4 compared with year 2019 (Table H.2.6).

Findings from Figure H.2.2 and table H.2.7 show that February recorded the highest number of visitors (61,752), followed by January (61,461) while May had the least number of visitors (197). The data trend shows that the peak season is mostly observed in August and low season observed in May for the past ten years.

There is a remarkable decrease of the visitors in 2020 due to the eruption of the pandemic disease (COVID-19) globally (Table H.2.8).

Table H.2.9 shows that **21.9** percent of all visitors in 2020 stayed in the country for six days. The overall average intended length of stay of visitors in 2020 was about eight (**8.3**) nights.

The number of Hotels/Guest Houses increased from 608 in 2019 to 620 in 2020. There were 228 registered Hotels and Guest Houses in Kusini district recorded in 2020, followed by Kaskazini A (162 Hotels/Guest Houses) while Mkoani district recorded the least (3 Houses/Guest Houses) as shown in Table H.2.10 and Table H.2.11.

The data from Table H.2.12 show that 101 Hotels/Guest Houses registered in 2020, with total of 958 rooms and 1,601beds.




Figure H.2. 1: The Growth Rate of International Visitors, 2011 – 2020




Figure H.2. 2: Number of International Visitors Arrival by Month, 2020

H.3 Utility, Energy and Fuel

The section presents statistics on water supply, electricity distributed and imports of fuel products. Data on water supply are collected on annual basis while electricity distributions are collected on quarterly basis

Water Supply

The amount of water Supplied in 2020 was 42,263,672 cubic meters whereas the estimated demand was 60,744,856 cubic meters, this indicate a total deficit of 30.4 percent in demand. The highest water supply by region was recorded in Mjini Magharibi Region where 23,910,040 cubic meters was supplied followed by Kaskazini Unguja Region with 9,255,560 cubic meters. The region with the lowest water supply was Kaskazini Pemba whereby there were only 257,484 cubic meters supplied (Table H.3.8 and H.3.9).

Table H.3.2 shows the total revenue collected for water supply in 2020 was TZS 2,407 millions with the highest revenue collected from Mjini Magharibi Region amounting TZS 774.0 millions (32.1 percent), followed by Kusini Pemba with total revenue of TZS 600.6 millions (24.9 percent). The Region with the lowest revenue collected was Kaskazini Pemba with the total amount of TZS 174.3 million (7.2 percent).

Electricity

The recorded number of new customers connected to National Power Grid in 2020 is 15,426 customers, which is lower than 17,275 customers are in 2019 (Table H.3.10).

The quantity of electricity sold to different customers decreased from 422,100 thousand KWH in 2019 to 393,512 thousand KWH in 2020 and the value collected also decreased from 120,852 TZS thousands in 2019 to 119,895 TZS thousands in 2020 (Table H.3.11 and H.3.12).

H.4 Transport and Communications

This section presents statistics on transport and communication activities. Transport statistics comprise of data on road network, movements/trips (enter/exit), traffic handling of passengers and cargo – both at airports and seaports as well as information on number of motor vehicles registration and licenses issued to both public and private automobiles. Communication data comprise of number of registered radio and television.

Transport

The transport sector plays a big socio-economic role in the movements of people and distribution of goods and services. The transport system in Zanzibar is divided into:

- a. Interregional transport between Islands, Mainland and the coastal area of Eastern Africa.
- b. Local internal transport within islands.
- c. Transport to the rest of the world

In 2020, the total number of marine vessels' trips (enter/exit) reached 10,831 trips, of which 10,691 trips were from local marine vessel and 140 trips from Foreign going vessel while the passenger handled reached 2,210,000.

The number of TEUs decreased to 68,707 from 82,637 recorded in 2019 (Table H.4.1).

The total of 744,132 passenger were handled at Zanzibar Airports of whom 374,230 were embarked and 369,912 were disembarked. The number of passengers decreased by 47.6 compared with 1,419,310 recorded in 2019. About 96,570 transit passengers were also recorded in 2020.

At the end of year 2020, Zanzibar had a stock of 102,957 of land transport vehicles which shows an increase of 53.1 percent compared with the year 2019. The trend show that the stock of land transport vehicles has been increasing each year for the period of past five years.
